UD ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

The newest members of the University of Delaware Athletics Hall of Fame were set to be inducted in private ceremony Friday night (Sept. 23) and will be honored at halftime of the Delaware-Old Dominion game Saturday.

This is the 15th induction class of the UD Athletics Hall of Fame with the hall now numbering 127.

The Class of 2011 includes former wrestling head coach and football assistant **Paul Billy**, champion golfer **Mike Bourne**, All-American field hockey and lacrosse star **Melissa Hefner**, high-scoring women's basketball pioneer **Annie Igo**, all-time standout basketball guard and track & field sprinter **Mark Murray**, and dominating softball pitcher **Kristi O'Connell**.

Inducted posthumously will be former Blue Hen star football running back **Nate Beasley** and 1950's baseball/basketball standout **Jim Smith**.

BLUE HEN TOUCHDOWN CLUB AWARD WINNERS

This week's Blue Hen Touchdown Club Most Valuable Players for the Delaware State game are junior QB **Tim Donnelly** (Offense), sophomore strong safety **Jake Giusti** (Defense), and junior LB/RB **Leon Jackson** (Special Teams).

The three are scheduled to be honored this Friday, Sept. 23, at the weekly club luncheon at the Bob Carpenter Center Lounge at 12 noon.

Donnelly won the award for the first time in his career after leading the Blue Hens to 512 yards of total offense in the 45-0 win over Delaware State. Named the game's Nate Beasley MVP as part of the First State Cup game, he completed his first seven pass attempts and finished the day completing 13 of 14 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns.

Giusti, another first-time winner, returned a fumble 32 yards for a touchdown second quarter to extend the Delaware lead to 28-0. He played a key part on defense, posting one

tackle and leading a unit that held DSU to just four first downs and 112 total yards.

Jackson won the Special Teams award for the third straight week. He collected three tackles and also ran the ball five times for 20 yards.

MORE HONORS FOR GIUSTI....

Not only was University of Delaware sophomore safety **Jake Giusti** honored by the Blue Hen Touchdown Club for his play, the Colonial Athletic Association recognized him as well by naming him the CAA Defensive Player of the Week.

Giusti was the first UD player to earn a CAA award this season and was honored for the first time in his two-year career with the Blue Hens.

Joining Giusti among the honored players this week were James Madison RB Dae'Quan Scott (Offense), James Madison kicker Cameron Starke (Special Teams), and Massachusetts defensive back Kirk Nelms (Rookie).

LAST TIME OUT FOR DELAWARE

Delaware 45, Delaware State 0

NEWARK, Del. (Sept. 17) -- This rivalry game was over early as No. 7 Delaware clicked on every cylinder, jumping out to a 35-0 halftime lead and posting a 45-0 victory over in-state foe Delaware State in the second edition of the First State Cup Route 1 Rivalry at Delaware Stadium.

Tim Donnelly was nearly flawless, completing 13 of 14 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns, backs **Andrew Pierce** and **Walter Davis** each went over the 100-yard mark, and **Nihja White** caught seven passes for 122 yards to lead an offense that piled up 512 yards of total offense. Davis (108 yards) surpassed the mark for the first time.

Donnelly, who completed his first seven passes, was selected as the Nate Beasley MVP for the game. Donnelly's .928 passing percentage was the second best in school history, trailing only an 11 for 11 performance by **Bill Vergantino** vs. Towson in 1992. His 272.6 passing rating was the sixth best mark in UD history.

The two schools, the state's only NCAA Division I institutions and located 45 miles apart, never met on the football field until a 44-7 NCAA playoff win by the Blue Hens in 2007. The teams met again in 2009 with Delaware claiming a hard-fought 27-17 victory.

The Delaware defense was just as dominating as the Blue Hens held the Hornets (2-1) to just four first downs and 112 total yards while forcing three turnovers, including a 32-yard fumble return for a touchdown by **Jake Giusti** that extended the lead to 28-0 in the second quarter. The Hornets produced -3 yard rushing for the night and were 0 for 10 on third downs.

Pierce carried 15 times for 106 yards and scored three touchdowns, including a seven-yard scamper with 11:25 left in the third quarter that pushed him over 100 yards for the game and over 2,000 for his career. He is the first Blue Hen runner to pass the 2,000-yard mark as a sophomore.

In addition to his 11-yard touchdown reception, White set up Pierce's one-yard scoring dive midway through the second quarter with a nifty career-long 59-yard grab off a perfect pass from Donnelly to the Delaware State one-yard line.

Delaware got things going early as Donnelly hit TE **Colin Naugle** all alone over the middle for a 43-yard scoring toss on the Hens' first possession and Pierce capped a season-long 96-yard march on the second drive of the game with a three-yard dive for a 14-0 lead first-quarter lead. The Hens controlled the ball for nearly 12 minutes in the opening stanza.

White hauled in an 11-yard touchdown pass from Donnelly just over a minute into the second stanza and Giusti followed with his fumble return for a score just three minutes later. A one-yard burst by Pierce with 7:58 left in the second quarter gave the Hens a 35-0 cushion at the break.

Unlike last week when the Hens let a 21-0 first quarter lead against West Chester vanish before holding off the Rams for a 28-17 victory, Delaware did not let up this time. Pierce's seven-yard scoring run with 11:25 left in the third quarter pushed the lead to 42-0 and Sean Baner's career-long 47-yard field goal with 4:44 left capped the scoring.

LAST TIME OUT FOR OLD DOMINION

Old Dominion 45, Hampton 42

NORFOLK, Va. (Sept. 17) -- Larry Pinkard returned a blocked punt five yards and Thomas DeMarco ran for two touchdowns in the last seven minutes as Old Dominion hung on to defeat Hampton 45-42 Saturday night as the Monarchs remained unbeaten at 3-0 on the season.

ODU held a 17-14 halftime lead and quickly stretched the lead to 10 on a five-yard Angus Harper touchdown, but Hampton came right back, catapulted by a Justin Blake interception, with 13-straight points, two field goals by Taurean Durham and a 42-yard fumble return by Jeremy Jermin to take a 27-24 lead.

The Monarchs retook the lead as James Faircloth blocked a Jordan Stovall punt and Larry Pinkard returned it five yards for the 31-27 lead. It was the Monarchs' 15th blocked punt and

the third time in the two meetings with the Pirates that ODU has blocked a punt.

The Pirates' Jorrian Washington gave Hampton the lead back briefly with a nine yard run, but DeMarco led ODU on two scoring drives, one a 14 play, 67-yard drive and the other a 10-yard drive after Edmon McClam sacked Hampton quarterback David LeGree and forced a fumble.

Hampton scored with just over a minute left, but the ensuing sides kick went out of bounds.

DeMarco finished the night 20-of-29 passing, with 172 yards, while rushing for 29 yards with two scores. Angus Harper and Colby Goodwyn comined to run for 199 yards, with Harper leading the way with 111 and two scores.

LeGree finished 25-of-35 passing for the Pirates for 260 yards with a touchdown. He also rushed for 66 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Monarchs were led by redshirt junior line-backer Craig Wilkins with 17 stops, while Chad King recorded eight tackles, and Eriq Lewis had seven. McClam also finished the night with a pair of sacks.

FAMILIAR FACE ON ODU STAFF

Delaware fans might recognize a familiar name on the Old Dominion coaching staff.

Keita Malloy, a standout two-way player as a wide receiver and defensive back for the Blue Hens back in 1990-93, is a fourth-year member of the Old Dominion coaching staff and serves as tight ends and wide receivers coach.

Malloy, a native of Washington, D.C., served coaching stints at Lafayette, Washburn, West Georgia, Fordham, and Trinity before joining the upstart ODU program.

While at Delaware, Malloy led the Hens to a four-year mark of 36-14 that included Yankee Conference titles in 1991 and 1992 and NCAA playoff appearances in 1991, 1992, and 1993. The 1993 squad advanced to the national semifinals.

He was the team's second leading receiver as a senior in 1993 when he caught 21 passes for 474 yards and a team-high eight touchdowns. He also collected 24 tackles and broke up two passes as a defensive back.

He caught 33 passes in 1991 and finished his career with 75 receptions and 14 touchdowns.

BLUE HENS TOUGH IN LEAGUE PLAY

Delaware has enjoyed great success in conference play since joining the Yankee Conference (now CAA) back in 1986. The Hens, who have won outright or shared nine league titles during that time, own the best record in league play among all current CAA teams, posting a record of 131-70, good for a 65.2 winning percentage. Since **K.C. Keeler** took over as head coach of the Blue Hens in 2002, Delaware has won 57 percent of its league games and captured three league crowns. Delaware is 5-4 in CAA openers under Keeler.

SUCCESS AT FIRST SITE KEELER

Blue Hen head coach **K.C. Keeler** has enjoyed outstanding success at Delaware during his 10-year tenure, leading the Blue Hens to the 2003 national title and two other national championship game appearances.

Keeler has been successful vs. first-time opponents, which bodes well as the Hens face the Monarchs for the first time ever in football this week.

When meeting an opponent for the first time in his career at Delaware, Keeler owns a record of 15-11.

HENS HAVE ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST SCHEDULES YET AGAIN

Year in and year out, the University of Delaware football squad always has one of the toughest rated scheduled in the nation at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision level.

And this year is no different.

After three weeks of the season, Delaware's schedule ranks as the No. 2 toughest in the nation with opponents owning a cumulative winning pct. of .652 (15-8).

Rhode Island's schedule is the toughest at .695 followed by Delaware, Richmond (.640), James Madison (.640), Villanova (.636), Holy Cross (.619), Princeton (.600), Chattanooga (.600), Western Carolina (.600), and New Hampshire (.592) in the top 10.

Old Dominion ranks No. 11 at .591.

BLUE HENS RANK IN TOP NATIONALLY IN ATTENDANCE

Delaware's average attendance at Delaware Stadium has taken a slight dip after two games this season, but the Blue Hens are still the envy of most every NCAA Division I FCS program in the nation.

Delaware's home game average attendance now stands at 18,802 after two games, ranking the Blue Hens No. 10 nationally in average attendance.

Montana leads the nation with an average home attendance of 25,961 while James Madison leads the CAA with an average of 25,102 fans per game.

Delaware is the only school in the nation at the FCS level that has averaged over 20,000 fans per regular season home

game each of the last 12 seasons.

The Hens have drawn at least 18,000 fans for 65 straight regular season home games since the 2000 season.

NO GO ON THIRD DOWN

Delaware's young defense looked impressive in last Saturday's 45-0 shutout victory over in-state rival Delaware State.

The shutout was the

The Blue Hens held the Hornets to just four first downs and 112 total yards during the win and forced three turnovers, even scoring some points of their own on a 32-yard fumble return by **Jake Giusti**.

Maybe most impressive was that the Blue Hens held Delaware State 0 for 10 on third down conversions for the game.

The Hens have held opponents to a 27.8 success rate on third down this season and have stopped opponents on 11 straight attempts dating back to the West Chester game on Sept. 17.

BLUE HEN BACK PIERCE CONTINUES TO PUT UP BIG NUMBERS FOR BLUE HENS

There has been no sophomore slump for star University of Delaware running back **Andrew Pierce** in the early going of the 2011 season.

Pierce, the 2010 Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year and this year's CAA pre-season Co-Player of the Year, has already rushed for 348 yards and six touchdowns in just three games, surpassing the 100-yard mark in all three contests and running his streak to five straight games over the century mark since last season.

He currently ranks second in the CAA and 12th nationally in rushing (116.0 yards per game) and leads the league in scoring while ranking fourth nationally at 12.0 points per game.

He ran for 106 yards and three touchdowns in the win over Delaware State Saturday and became the first sophomore in school history to surpass the 2,000-yard mark, upping his total to 2,003 yards on a third quarter touchdown run.

In just two seasons, the All-American already ranks second among active NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision players in yards rushing per game (111.3), ranks No. 8 in yards per carry (5.15), No. 9 in total rushing yards (2,003), and 10th in both carries and touchdowns.

Should he surpass the 100-yard rushing mark this week vs. Old Dominion, he would tie the school record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games of six set by **Gardy Kahoe** in 1971 and by **Omar Cuff** in 2000-05.

DONNELLY ON THE MARK AT QUARTERBACK; HEN JUNIOR LEADS NCAA IN PASS PCT.

Delaware junior **Tim Donnelly** did not start the season opener vs. Navy after falling to No. 2 in a tough pre-season battle with sophomore **Trevor Sasek**.

But Sasek went down with a knee injury in that Navy game and Donnelly took over.

The former walk-on has been outstanding since that time, starting and leading the Blue Hens to victories over West Chester and Delaware State.

He was nearly perfect vs. Delaware State, completing his first seven passes of the game (his only miss was an overthrow on a post-pattern into the end zone) and finishing the night of 13 of 14 for 211 yards and two touchdowns - a 43-yard toss to TE **Colin Naugle** and an 11-yard scoring pass to **Nihja White**. He later hit White on a 59-yard pass to set up another touchdown.

Donnelly's passing pct. of .928 was the second highest in a single game in UD history (**Bill Vergantino** was 11 for 11 vs. Towson in 1992) and his passing rating of 272.6 was the sixth best in UD single game history.

For the season, Donnelly has hit on 41 of 51 passes for 454 yards and three touchdowns with just one interception. His passing rating of 170.66 leads all CAA signal-callers and ranks No. 5 in the NCAA.

His pass completion pct. of .804 leads all NCAA Division I FCS passers and trails only Robert Griffin of Baylor (.837) and Seth Doege of Texas Tech (.818), and Bryn Renner of North Carolina (.814) among Division I quarterbacks.

The communications major is the first former walk-on to start a game for the Blue Hens since **Dale Fry** got the nod in the 1993 season opener vs. Lehigh.

Sasek is expected to be available this week but will most likely not see action as Donnelly gets his third straight start.

The No. 3 quarterback, redshirt freshman **Justin Burns**, was also impressive in his collegiate debut Saturday, completing all of five of his pass attempts for 22 yards.

MILESTONES & STREAKS

• Senior C **Rob McDowell** and senior LB **Andrew Harrison** own the team's longest current starting streaks entering the Old Dominion game. McDowell, who has started every game of his career for the Blue Hens, will start his 42nd straight game while Harrison will earn his 30th straight starting nod vs. Old Dominion. Harrison ranks No. 14 among active NCAA FCS tacklers with 244 for his career.

• Sophomore RB **Andrew Pierce** upped his career rushing yardage total to 2,003 with a 106-yard effort vs. Delaware State on Saturday night. He became the 16th UD player - and the first sophomore - to reach the 2,000 yard mark for his career. He needs just 102 yards to move into 10th place on the all-time UD list with **Craig Cummings**, who ran for 2,105 yards in 1997-2000.

• Junior RB **David Hayes** rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries vs. West Chester and reached the 1,000-yard mark for his career on his first carry of the night. After a 40-yard performance vs. Delaware State, he now has 1,089 career yards and is the 55th player in UD history to reach the 1,000-yard mark.

• Junior WR **Nihja White** missed the West Chester game with a hand injury but returned in a big way against Delaware State this past Saturday as he caught seven passes for 122 yards and a touchdown and also caught a 59-yard pass from **Tim Donnelly** down to the one-yard line to set up another score. Delaware's leading receiver a year ago when he hauled in 60 passes for 752 yards and six touchdowns, White has now caught at least one pass in 25 straight games in which he has played. The streak is the seventh longest in school history, two shy of fourth place. White has also gone over the 1,000-yard receiving mark for his career with 1,128 and his 90 career receptions leaves him just 10 shy of becoming the 14th player in UD history to reach that mark.

NICE BOOTS BY BANER

Delaware sophomore kicker **Sean Baner** has been solid in his first season as placekicker for the Blue Hens this fall.

Baner, who handled kickoff chores as a true freshman last season, beat out 2010 second team All-CAA selection **Mike Perry** for the placement duties during pre-season practice in August.

After three games in 2011, Baner has been a perfect 12 for 12 on extra points and has connected on two of his four field goal attempts, including a 47-yarder last week vs. Delaware State. The 47-yarder was the longest by a Blue Hen player since All-American **Jon Striefsky** connected on a 47-yarder vs. Southern Illinois in 2007.

Baner also serves as the Hens' No. 2 punter behind junior and first-year regular **Rauley Zaragoza**.

TRIO OF TRUE FRESHMEN SEE TIME

Three true freshmen have seen action for the Blue Hens so far this season, including middle linebacker **Patrick Callaway** who earned his first career start last week vs. Delaware State.

Callaway got the start when outside linebacker **Jessel Curry** suffered a concussion vs. West Chester Sept. 10. That moved regular MLB **Paul Worriow** to the outside against Delaware State.

Callaway, who also plays special teams, responded with two tackles vs. Delaware State and now has three stops on the season.

Also for the Hens, linebacker **Derek Battle** has seen action on special teams in all three games and wide receiver **Michael Johnson** has seen backup action in two games.

SCORE FIRST AND THINGS WILL BE FINE.....

That has usually been the case for the Blue Hens of late. Delaware was a dominant team early on last season, outscoring opponent 94-34 in the first quarter and 242-80 in the first half. The Hens scored first in 12 of the team's 15 games. Delaware had won 12 straight games when scoring first before the NCAA championship game loss to Eastern Washington last January. Still the Hens have won 18 of their last 20 games since 2009 when getting on the board first. Delaware teams are 560-14 (.810) when they score first in head coach **K.C. Keeler's** 10 seasons at the helm.

This season, Delaware is 2-0 when scoring first and have outscored opponents 35-13 in the first quarter and 63-29 in the first half.

At home this season, the Hens have outscored opponents 35-0 in the opening stanza and 56-10 in the first half.

HOME SWEET HOME

Delaware boasts one of the top home-field advantages in all of college football. Not only do Blue Hen fans pack Delaware Stadium each week - helping UD become the only NCAA FCS team in the nation to average 20,000 or more fans per regular season home game each of the last 12 seasons - they see consistently winning football.

Delaware has posted an impressive record of 52-16 (.765) in 10 seasons under **K.C. Keeler** at Delaware Stadium - among the top marks at any division of college football.

Delaware had won seven straight at home - its longest home win skein since winning nine straight between 2004-05 - before falling to Villanova 28-21 in overtime in the regular season finale on Nov. 20.

Of the 16 losses, seven have come by six points or less or in overtime. The Hens have scored more than 20 points in all but nine of those 68 games.

Delaware has won 23 of its last 30 home games and is 280-87-4 (.765) in 60 seasons all-time at Delaware Stadium, including a mark of 20-5 with eighth straight wins in the post-season.

SCORING STREAK REACHES 189...AND COUNTING

Delaware extended its streak of scoring a point to 189 straight games in the 45-0 win over Delaware State last Saturday night.

Delaware has not been shutout in any game since falling at Villanova 27-0 back on Sept. 14, 1996 and have not been held off the scoreboard at home a Delaware Stadium since suffering a 24-0 setback to Holy Cross way back on Nov. 12, 1983 (a streak of 186 straight games).

The current scoring streak breaks the previous UD record of consecutive game scoring a point of 154 set in 1983-98. Delaware's streak of consecutive road games scoring a point now stands at 85 games.

During the streak, the Hens have scored 30 or more points 83 times (42 percent of the time).

The current streak ranks No. 2 among Colonial Athletic

Association teams, trailing only Massachusetts (190).

POSITIVE PUNT PROTECTION

Delaware is breaking in a new punter this season after the graduation of two-year regular and 2010 All-CAA selection **Ed Wagner**. Also gone is four-year deep snapper **Zack Reed**.

Junior **Rauley Zaragoza** has handled all the punting chores in the first two games but Baner is still in the mix. Junior tight end **Corey Olsen** has handled the deep snapping chores.

Delaware has now gone 292 straight punt attempts without having a kick blocked since the 2005 season vs. William & Mary. The streak covers 68 games.

YET ANOTHER WINNING RECORD; HENS REACH 12-WIN MARK...AGAIN

The Blue Hens have posted a winning record seven times in nine seasons under head coach **K.C. Keeler**, failing to reach the .500 mark just twice when the team went 5-6 in 2006 and 4-8 in 2008.

But the Hens have more than made up for those two down years, advancing to the NCAA Tournament four times under Keeler, winning the national title in 2003 and finishing as national runner-up in both 2007 and 2010. Along the way, the Hens have also captured three conference titles, earning the Lambert Cup Trophy three times, and the ECAC Team of the Year three times.

Delaware has not suffered back-to-back losing seasons since 1938-39, a milestone that few college teams in the nation at any level - and none in the CAA - can match. The Hens have reached 12 wins seven times in school history, most recently in 2010.

Delaware posted a 7-0 start for the ninth time in school history last season and for the second time under Keeler. The Hens started out 9-0 on the way to the 2003 national championship campaign.

QUICK SEASON PREVIEW

The Blue Hens look primed for another NCAA playoff run in 2011 as head coach **K.C. Keeler** welcomes back 11 starters and 44 letterwinners from a squad that went 12-3 and advanced to the national championship game in 2010.

Offensively, the Hens must replace All-American quarterback **Pat Devlin**, who earned CAA Offensive Player of the Year laurels and is currently with the Miami Dolphins.

But the loses on the offensive side of the ball don't go much further than that as the Hens return four starting offensive linemen - including three pre-season All-Americans in guard **Gino Gradkowski**, **Shea Allard**, and **Rob McDowell**.

Sophomore **Andrew Pierce**, the 2010 CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year who compiled 1,655 yards on the ground, is back to lead a run game that returns the top three rushers while All-CAA tight end **Colin Naugle** and top returning receiver, **Nihja White** (60 receptions) are also back.

Things are not quite as bright on the defensive side of the ball where Keeler returns just three full-time starters from a squad that was the top unit in the country, leading the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game and ranking No. 4 in total defense (280.7 yards per game).

The Hens must replace four All-CAA defensive backs, including All-Americans **Anthony Walters** and **Anthony Bratton**, but do welcome back a pair of All-CAA performers in DE **Michael Atunrase** and LB **Paul WorriLOW**. Also returning to the starting lineup is OLB **Andrew Harrison**.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Thanks to last season's national runner-up finish and the return of 11 starters, including seven on offense, the Blue Hens have earned some impressive pre-season accolades. The Hens appear in the Top 10 in virtually every pre-season Top 25 poll and have been picked No. 3 in the pre-season Colonial Athletic Association poll.

BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK A FEW TIMES

Few college teams in the country can boast the vast coaching experience of Delaware's offensive and defensive coordinators.

Blue Hen defensive leader **Nick Rapone** and third-year offensive head man **Jim Hoffer** have combined for an incredible 60 years of college coaching experience - each with 30 campaigns under their belts - including 24 years as coordinators.

Hoffer served as head coach at his alma mater, Cornell, in 1990-97 and at Buffalo in 2001-05. Together they have coached over 620 games on the college level.

Rapone, whose 2010 defensive led the nation in scoring defense at 12.1 points per game, earned an impressive honor in 2010 when he was selected NCAA Division I FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com.

HOW ABOUT THAT '10 DEFENSE

The 2010 season was quite a campaign, especially for the Blue Hen defense that ranked among the top units in the country.

Delaware led the nation in scoring defense (12.1 points per game) and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in turnover margin (4th/+1.13), total defense (5th, 280.7), passing efficiency (9th/148.49), and passing efficiency defense (9th/102.7).

Delaware's scoring defense of 12.1 points per game was the best mark by a UD defense since 1982 when opponents averaged just 11.6 points per game.

The Hens had to replace eight starters from that unit, including four All-Colonial Athletic Association defensive backs and three All-Americans in defensive backs **Anthony Walters** and **Anthony Bratton** and linebacker **Matt Marcorelle**.

The Hens will try to improve from a tough opener last week as Delaware dropped a 40-17 decision with the Mids piling up 437 total yards and 22 first downs.

A BLUE HEN IN THE WHITE HOUSE...AND AT DELAWARE STADIUM

When U.S. President **Barack Obama** and running mate, former Delaware Senator **Joe Biden**, won the 2008 presidential election, it was big news. And even bigger news for the citizens of Delaware and those affiliated with the University of Delaware.

A 1965 graduate of the University of Delaware with degrees in history and political science, Biden played on the Blue Hen freshman football team in 1961 under head coach **Scotty Duncan**. Biden, a member of the UD Wall of Fame and an ardent Delaware football fan, considered himself "a half-baked halfback" during his brief UD football career.

Biden made his first visit to Delaware Stadium as Vice-President on Saturday, Oct. 9, 2009 as he attended the Maine game and sat with UD President **Patrick Harker** and current New Jersey Governor **Chris Christie** (also a UD graduate) throughout the entire contest.

He made another visit to Delaware Stadium in 2010 when he attended Delaware's 16-3 NCAA quarterfinal win over New Hampshire on Dec. 10.

He also attended the Hens' 2010 national championship game in Frisco, Tex. with Christie and Delaware Gov. Jack Markell.

Biden met with head coach **K.C. Keeler** and members of the team on Sept. 19, 2008 when Biden's plane was parked on the same tarmac as the Delaware charter at New Castle County (Del.) prior to its trip to Furman.

Biden later made an appearance at the Blue Hens' game vs. Maine at Delaware Stadium on Oct. 11, 2008 and received a rousing applause while being mobbed by well-wishers.

VERY PRESIDENTIAL...

No less than six members of the University of Delaware football team have the same surnames as former U.S. Presidents, including the Hens' top two running backs - **Andrew Pierce** and **Dave Hayes**.

Other Blue Hens with presidential surnames are **Andrew Harrison**, **Leon Jackson**, **Bobby Kennedy**, and **Michael Johnson**.

ALL-TIME HIGH 11 BLUE HENS IN NFL CAMPS THIS SUMMER:

An all-time high of 11 former Blue Hen football players took part in National Football League camps this summer.

In addition to established veterans **Joe Flacco** (Baltimore) and **Mike Adams** (Cleveland), also in camps were free agents **Brandon Gilbeaux** (Tampa Bay), **Ronald Talley** (Arizona), **Matt Marcorelle** (Houston), **Anthony Walters** (Chicago), **Anthony Bratton** (Green Bay), **Pat Devlin** (Miami), **Tyrone Grant** (Washington), and **Josh Baker** (N.Y. Jets).

In addition, **Ben Patrick**, who played the last three seasons with Arizona, signed with the New York Giants this summer but has since retired.

All but Flacco and Adams were released by their teams but Devlin, Walters, Talley, and Baker have each signed on with their respective team's taxi squads.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

The name of the Blue Hens' conference affiliation changed to the Colonial Athletic Association from the Atlantic 10 prior to the 2007 season, but the 10 teams stayed the same.

Delaware is maintaining its outstanding success in league play just the same. Delaware is currently playing its 26th season in the CAA (originally the Yankee Conference before becoming the Atlantic 10 in 1997) this fall.

Delaware has been the pride of the CAA since joining the league in 1986, capturing its 100th conference victory in 2003 with a 51-45 overtime win over UMass. The Blue Hens, who are now 130-69 (.653) overall in league play since joining the conference in 1986, have won eight CAA/A-10 titles (1986-88-91-92-95-2000-2003-2004).

The .653 winning percentage is tops among the 10 league schools with Massachusetts (.634) the only other team that has won more than 60 percent of its league games all-time.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. -- Navy quarterbacks have a history of big games against the University of Delaware. Senior Kriss Proctor added to that legacy as he ran for 176 yards and three touchdowns and passed for another score as the Mids spoiled the season opener for the Blue Hens.

The No. 5 ranked Blue Hens, last year's NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision national runner-up, were able to pile up 363 yards of offense but too many missed opportunities proved to be Delaware's undoing.

Sophomore All-American running back Andrew Pierce, the 2011 Colonial Athletic Association Co-Player of the Year, led the way for the Hens, rushing for 119 yards and capping the scoring with a one-yard burst with 2:54 left that capped a 78-yard drive. The 100-yard effort was the eighth of Pierce's young career as a Blue Hen.

Quarterbacks Trevor Sasek and Tim Donnelly also showed signs of good things to come. Sasek, who started the game after winning a battle with Donnelly, completed 9 of 19 passes for 82 yards and scored the Hens' first touchdown on a 21-yard run before leaving the game in the second half with a knee contusion. Donnelly hit on 7 of 9 passes for 60 yards.

Proctor, a first-year starter for the Mids, broke away on a 75-yard scoring jaunt on just the fourth play of the game and later scored on runs of 27 yards in the third quarter and one-yard early in the final stanza. He also hit Aaron Santiago on a 12-yard scoring toss midway through the final stanza to push the Navy lead to 40-10.

Delaware's defense, which lost eight starters and three All-Americans from a unit that led the nation in scoring defense a year ago when it gave up just 12.1 points per game, allowed its highest point total since a 41-7 setback to CAA foe James Madison in 2008.

Navy, which went 9-4 a year ago and advanced to the Poinsettia Bowl, always features one of the most explosive running attacks in NCAA Division I football and this year will be no different. The Mids' triple-option attack piled up 391 yards rushing and 437 yards total.

NEWARK, Del. -- All-American RB Andrew Pierce needed just two plays to cover 56 yards and his 44-yard touchdown vault early in the final stanza was just what the No. 8 Hens needed to pull away for a hard-fought victory in the home opener.

The Blue Hens (1-1) jumped out to a 21-0 first quarter lead after scoring two touchdowns in a span of just 17 seconds and held off the Golden Ram comeback. The Hens upended their nearby NCAA Division II rivals for the 17th straight time since 1993 but the margin of victory was the smallest since a 24-17 triumph in 1996.

Pierce, the 2010 CAA Rookie of the Year, ran 25 times for 153 yards and two touchdowns to lead the attack. He also caught a career-high seven passes for 32 yards during the game.

The game looked like it would be a blowout early on as the Hens scored three touchdowns in the first stanza to take a 21-0 lead. Sophomore LB Jessel Curry, a first-year transfer from Auburn, made his Delaware Stadium debut memorable as he rambled 34 yards with an interception return to open the scoring just over six minutes into the contest.

Pierce scored his first touchdown of the night when he ran seven yards and leaped into the end zone with 34 seconds left in the stanza for a 14-0 lead. Just 17 seconds later, the lead was up to 21-0 as Irv Titre recovered a bad snap at the West Chester 28-yard line to set up Donnelly's first career touchdown pass, a 28-yarder to a wide-open Mark Schenauer.

However, the Rams held tough and never let the Hens pull away. Rondell White got the Rams on the board with a two-yard scoring run just under two minutes into the second stanza, ending a streak of nine quarters and 143 minutes that Delaware had held West Chester without a point in the series. The Rams (0-2) pulled to within 21-10 on 27-yard field goal by Shawn Leo.

Following a scoreless third quarter, West Chester pulled to within 21-17 with 10:56 left in the final quarter as backup QB Matt Carroll scrambled out of the pocket and hit LaRonn Lee with a 14-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone.

But the Hens quickly put a damper on the Rams' upset plans. After Travis Hawkins returned the kickoff 38 yards to the Delaware 44-yard line, Pierce took over. He ran for 12 yards on first down and then broke loose on his pivotal 44-yard scoring run down the right side on the next play to give Delaware some breathing room with 10:10 remaining.

Delaware locked up the win as they burned 5:15 off the clock with an 11-play drive and then got the ball back when Leon Jackson intercepted a with 3:13 left.

NEWARK, Del. -- This rivalry game was over early as No. 7 Delaware clicked on every cylinder, jumping out to a 35-0 halftime lead and posting a big victory over in-state foe Delaware State.

Tim Donnelly was nearly flawless, completing 13 of 14 passes for 221 yards and two touchdowns, backs Andrew Pierce and Walter Davis each went over the 100-yard mark, and Nihja White caught seven passes for 122 yards to lead an offense that piled up 512 yards of total offense. Davis (108 yards) surpassed the mark for the first time.

Donnelly, who completed his first seven passes, was selected as the Nate Beasley MVP for the game. Donnelly's .928 passing percentage was the second best in school history, trailing only an 11 for 11 performance by Bill Vergantino vs. Towson in 1992. His 272.6 passing rating was the sixth best mark in UD history.

The two schools, the state's only NCAA Division I institutions and located 45 miles apart, never met on the football field until a 44-7 NCAA playoff win by the Blue Hens in 2007. The teams met again in 2009 with Delaware claiming a hard-fought 27-17 victory.

The Delaware defense was just as dominating as the Blue Hens held the Hornets (2-1) to just four first downs and 112 total yards while forcing three turnovers, including a 32-yard fumble return for a touchdown by Jake Giusti that extended the lead to 28-0 in the second quarter. The Hornets produced -3 yard rushing for the night and were 0 for 10 on third downs.

Pierce carried 15 times for 106 yards and scored three touchdowns, including a seven-yard scamper with 11:25 left in the third quarter that pushed him over 100 yards for the game and over 2,000 for his career. He is the first Blue Hen runner to pass the 2,000-yard mark as a sophomore.

In addition to his 11-yard touchdown reception, White set up Pierce's one-yard scoring dive midway through the second quarter with a nifty career-long 59-yard grab off a perfect pass from Donnelly to the Delaware State one-yard line.

Delaware got things going early as Donnelly hit TE Colin Naugle all alone over the middle for a 43-yard scoring toss on the Hens' first possession and Pierce capped a season-long 96-yard march on the second drive of the game with a three-yard dive for a 14-0 lead first-quarter lead. The Hens controlled the ball for nearly 12 minutes in the opening stanza.

White hauled in an 11-yard touchdown pass from Donnelly just over a minute into the second stanza and Giusti followed with his fumble return for a score just three minutes later. A one-yard burst by Pierce with 7:58 left in the second quarter gave the Hens a 35-0 cushion at the break.

Unlike last week when the Hens let a 21-0 first quarter lead against West Chester vanish before holding off the Rams for a 28-17 victory, Delaware did not let up this time. Pierce's seven-yard scoring run with 11:25 left in the third quarter pushed the lead to 42-0 and Sean Baner's career-long 47-yard field goal with 4:44 left capped the scoring.
