## Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

## Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

## CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. ## Last Time Out

Josh Brinkley tied his career-high with 18 points and put Delaware in front for good with a basket with 52 seconds remaining to lead the Blue Hens to an impressive 55-53 comeback victory over Hampton Wednesday night at the HU Convocation Center.

Jawan Carter added 15 points and tied his career-high with nine rebounds for Delaware, which improved to 4-2 on the season.

Hampton, which had won seven consecutive games and was ranked No. 23 in this week's Collegensider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll, dropped to 7-2 on the season. Darrion Pellum led the Pirates with 17 points, while Charles Funches added 16 and Mike Tuitt chipped in with 12.

Delaware trailed by four at the half and faced an eight-point deficit with 8:33 left to a Pirates team that entered the night ranked second in Division I with a 32.9 field goal percentage defense and fourth by allowing 53.9 points per game, but the Blue Hens would dig deep to post the comeback win.

Delaware would not allow a Hampton field goal the rest of the way, outscoring the Pirates 16-6 from there to defeat Hampton for the third time in the last four years.

Brinkley began the comeback by draining two free throws and then converting a three-point play after getting fouled on a dunk as Delaware closed to within 47-44 at the 7:35 mark.

Following a free throw by Tuitt, Brian Johnson scored on a drive to make it a two-point game. Hampton answered with three free throws, but Brinkley converted a follow-up dunk to cut the Pirates lead to 51-48 at the 4:28 mark.

Hampton then turned the ball over, and Brinkley posted another three-point play to bring the Blue Hens even at 51-51. The Pirates then missed inside giving UD the chance to take the lead, but Johnson was short on a three-pointer and Jamelle Hagins missed inside as the game remained tied.

Funches was then called for a travel, while Brinkley scored in the paint as Delaware went ahead for the first time in the half at 53-51 with 52 seconds on the clock.

On Hampton's next possession Funches was fouled, but he only hit one free throw to cut the Blue Hens' margin to one with 25.8

seconds left.

Johnson hit one free throw to make it a two-point game, but after Tuitt was fouled with 11.2 seconds to go, he went 1 of 2 to again bring Hampton within a point. Carter then hit a free throw with 8.4 seconds left to once again make it a two-point game, and following a Hampton timeout, Pellum's contested off-balance jumper from 18 feet was well short.

Both teams struggled from the field, as Delaware shot 35.8 percent while Hampton connected on just 35.4 percent of its field goal attempts. The Blue Hens and Pirates also both hurt themselves from the foul line, as UD went 12 of 25 from the charity stripe while Hampton was just 17 of 31.

The first half was tightly contested, as neither team led by more than four points the entire stanza. Alphonso Dawson's second three-pointer of the period cut Hampton's lead to a point at 25-24 with three minutes on the clock, and it was still a one-point game until Tuitt's running three-pointer just before the buzzer banked in to give the Pirates a 29-25 halftime lead.

Funches opened the second half with a pair of baskets to put Hampton up eight, but Carter answered with a three-pointer and then hit a free throw to pull the Blue Hens within 33-29. Delaware cut the margin to 35-33 when Devon Saddler found Brinkley for a slam dunk, but Pellum and Brandon Tunnell answered as Hampton held on to the lead.

Pellum hit a long two-point jumper to extend the Pirates' advantage to 42-35 with 12:13 remaining, but Dawson connected from the baseline to make it a five-point game. Hampton answered to twice go up eight, the second time at 47-39 with 8:33 remaining, before the Blue Hens began their comeback.

## Delaware vs. Delaware State Last Meeting

Delaware could not overcome the inspired play of Francisco Sandidge and a decisive disadvantage at the foul line and dropped a 75-67 to host Delaware State at Memorial Gym on Dec. 1, 2009.

Sandidge dropped in a career-high 26 points and drained 12 of Delaware State's 30 free throws in the Hornets and Blue Hens' first meeting since the 1999-2000 campaign.

Jamelle Hagins had a big effort for the Hens as he scored 18 points, including four dunks, and pulled down 13 rebounds to record the first double-double by a UD freshman since Herb Courtney had 20 points and 10 rebounds in a 93-82 Delaware overtime win over William & Mary on Jan. 21, 2004.

Jawan Carter was the only other Blue Hen in double figures with 12 points to go with eight assists but Delaware could not overcome 20 turnovers and Delaware's State's 30-6 advantage from the foul line. Malcolm Hawkins added nine points as UD freshmen scored 32 of the Hens' 67 points.

The Blue Hens shot a sizzling 57.4 percent from the field for the game (27 of 47), including 72 percent in the second half (18 of 25), and also drained seven three-pointers, but could not overcome the 24-point disadvantage at the foul line where the Hens converted just 6 of 13 shots.

Delaware built a slim two-point lead at halftime and went ahead 31-28 on a Hagins layup just under six minutes into the second half. After five straight points by Delaware State, including a three-pointer by Marcus Neal (16 points), Hagins added a free throw and Alphonso Dawson converted a layup and was fouled with 11:55 left to knot the score at 34-34. Dawson missed the free throw and the Hens never had a share of the lead again.

Alibaba Odd, who finished the night with 16 points, put the Hornets up for good moments later with a three-pointer from the right corner with 11:25 left. Sandidge then went to work for the Hornets, scoring each of the Delaware's State's next 11 points, including seven from the foul line. When he was done, DSU had built the lead to 48-42 with 6:40 remaining.

Delaware pulled to within three points twice the rest of the way, on a Carter drive with five minutes left and on a Dawson follow at the 4:05 mark, but could never get closer. Neal followed with a three-pointer and the Hornets stayed in front by converting 20 of 24 shots from the foul line over the final three minutes of play.



Delaware State finished the night hitting 30 of 40 free throws, including 28 of 37 (.757) in the second half. The Blue Hens held a 29-20 advantage on the boards, but Delaware State committed just nine turnovers for the game.

In a sluggish first half by both teams, Delaware State used a 10-3 run to gain its biggest lead of the stanza at 19-12 with 6:49 left. Delaware had taken its first lead of the game at 11-9 on jumper by Hagins, but the Hornets rallied behind Sandidge. The senior forward hit two quick baskets to give DSU a 13-11 lead and later stole the ball and raced fullcourt for a layup to up the margin to 19-12.

After a three-pointer by Delaware's Carter snapped a 6-0 Delaware State run and ended a six-minute field goal drought by the Hens, Sandidge hit a turnaround in the lane at the 5:00 mark to give the Hornets a 21-15 advantage.

But the Hens, who were able to overcome 11 first-half turnovers, would take control from there with a 10-2 run to end the half and go up 25-23. Dawson and Hawkins hit consecutive three-pointers in a span of 49 seconds and Hagins finished off a dunk at the 1:50 mark for a 23-21 Delaware lead. Delaware State's Greg Smith hit a jumper to tie things at 23-23 with 1:15 left, but the Hens grabbed the upperhand on a Hagins tip-in with 47 seconds left.

The Delaware lead could have been more but DSU's Neal blocked an open layup by Hakim McCullar just before the horn.

### Blue Hens Looking For Fifth Consecutive Win

Tonight Delaware will be looking for its fifth consecutive victory. The Blue Hens have not won five consecutive games since a seven-game streak from February 8 through March 4, 2001. This current run is Delaware's fourth 4-game winning streak since then.

### UD To Host Holiday Toy Drive Today

The University of Delaware men's basketball team will hold a holiday toy drive prior to today's home game against Delaware State.

Fans are encouraged to donate a new, unwrapped, non-violent toy for boys and girls ages 4-12 in the Bob Carpenter Center lobby from 1 p.m. through halftime of the game. Every person that donates will receive a complimentary ticket to a future Delaware men's basketball game.

All toys that are received will be given to children at the Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children in Wilmington during the holiday season.

### Brinkley Ties Career-High at Hampton

Josh Brinkley tied his career-high by scoring 18 points in the victory at Hampton. Brinkley, who went 6 of 10 from both the field and the foul line, added a season-high seven rebounds against the Pirates.

Brinkley scored four the Blue Hens' final five field goals, including a jumper in the paint with 52 seconds left that gave Delaware the lead for good.

### Blue Hens Lock Down Pirates Late

Hampton's Mike Tuitt hit a jumper with 10:43 remaining to put the Pirates ahead 44-37, but the Blue Hens would not allow a field goal the rest of the way.

Delaware limited Hampton to 0 of 4 shooting from the field and forced five turnovers in that stretch, while the Pirates hurt themselves by hitting just 9 of 17 free throw attempts.

### Carter Named CAA Co-Player of the Week

Jawan Carter was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on Monday following his outstanding performance during the Blue Hens' win over Old Dominion last Saturday.

Carter scored a game-high 29 points to lead Delaware to the 75-67

triumph over the Monarchs, the CAA defending champion and this year's preseason favorite. He went 6 of 12 from the field, all from behind the arc, and dished out a game-best four assists as the Blue Hens won their conference opener. Carter also went 11 of 15 from the free throw line, including 7 of 8 in the final 52 seconds to hold off Old Dominion, which was receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 polls.

The Blue Hens, who led the entire second half, built an 11-point cushion with 8:35 to play, but the Monarchs rallied for nine consecutive points to pull within 56-54 with 5:24 remaining. But after Hakim McCullar hit one free throw, Carter found Devon Saddler for a jumper and on the Blue Hens' next possession drilled a deep three-pointer to extend UD's advantage to 62-54 with 3:31 to play. The Monarchs cut the deficit to five three times in the final minute, but Delaware went 9 of 10 from the line, all but two from Carter, to ice the victory.

### Carter Heating Up For Blue Hens

Jawan Carter scored just seven points during the Blue Hens' first two games of the season, but the senior guard has averaged 23.0 in each of the last four contests, all Delaware victories.

Additionally, in the last four games 44 of Carter's 48 field goal attempts have come from behind the arc.

### Carter Clutch From Foul Line Late in Games

Jawan Carter went a perfect 12 of 12 from the free throw line at Lafayette, including hitting all six of his attempts in the final 32 seconds to seal the victory.

The last time a Blue Hen took that many free throw attempts without missing was when Kestutis Marciulionis went 13 of 13 during a 99-91 overtime victory over Drexel at the BCC on January 27, 1999.

Carter then went 11 of 15 from the charity stripe versus Old Dominion, including seven of eight in the final 52 seconds to hold off the Monarchs.

Carter went to the foul line with nine seconds left and the Blue Hens clinging to a one-point lead at Hampton, and he went 1 of 2 to put Delaware up a pair.

### Brian Johnson Returns To UD Lineup

Brian Johnson, who missed all of last season with an ACL injury and the first three games of this year after suffering a torn meniscus in the preseason, finally returned to the court during Delaware's game at Lafayette.

Johnson came off the bench to snap his school-record streak of 94 consecutive starts - every game he had appeared in during his first three years. He contributed five points and a rebound in 16 minutes of action against the Leopards. Johnson has scored three points in each of the last two games against Old Dominion and Hampton.

Delaware will have six televised regular season games during 2010-11. The Blue Hens will play at George Mason on January 3 at 7 p.m. on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet New England, The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast, while UD's contest at Drexel on January 8 at 4 p.m. will be televised by The Comcast Network and Comcast SportsNet New England.

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

## Blue Hens Playing Well Defensively

Delaware leads the Colonial Athletic Association by holding its opponents to a 37.4 field goal percentage, and the Blue Hens have not allowed a team to shoot over 48 percent so far this year. Delaware also is tied for the league lead with 5.0 blocks and is second with 26.8 defensive rebounds per game.

Through Sunday's games, UD ranked 35th in Division I with a 37.7 field goal percentage defense and 5.4 blocked shots per game, and 57th with a 29.3 three-point field goal percentage defense.

## Notes From the Howard Victory

- UD head coach Monté Ross won for the first time in his five home openers.
- Delaware's 34 points allowed was its fewest since a 69-32 victory over Ursinus on December 21, 1961.
- The 32-point victory was the Blue Hens' largest since a 75-40 win over James Madison on January 15, 2005.
- Delaware led 33-16 at the break, its largest halftime lead since taking a 33-15 cushion at Vermont on December 19, 2007.
- Jawan Carter made eight three-pointers, tying the school record set by Billy Wells against Hartford on February 24, 2000. Carter's 14 three-pointers attempted set a UD single game record.
- Howard's 12 field goals made and 20.0 percent shooting are both the lowest by a Blue Hen opponent since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.
- Delaware blocked 12 shots, its most since also swatting 12 against Siena on December 23, 2003.

## Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut against Ohio University for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive game at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field, and he added a season-high eight assists versus Howard.

Saddler scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds while playing a game-high 37 minutes during his first CAA game against Old Dominion.

## Hagins Off To Strong Start

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins has gotten off to an impressive start for the Blue Hens, leading the team with 7.7 rebounds per game and 20 blocks while ranking third with 9.0 points per game.

After posting a double-double in the season opener at Ohio University, Hagins scored 14 points on 6 of 9 shooting against Cornell. Hagins also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and blocked a career-best six shots against the Big Red.

Hagins collected 10 rebounds against Howard while again blocking six shots and scoring six points. He added 12 points, nine rebounds and four blocked shots in the win over Old Dominion.

Hagins currently leads the CAA and ranks third in Division I with 3.3 blocks per game while ranking tied for second in the conference with 6.3 defensive rebounds per game and ninth with 7.7 boards per contest.

## Dawson Joins 1,100-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,195 career points, grabbed five rebounds against Howard to reach the 500-rebound career mark. He became just the 11th player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,100 career points and 500 career rebounds.

## Johnson Brings Experience To PG Spot

UD senior Brian Johnson brings a wealth of experience to the point guard position for the Blue Hens. Johnson has started all 94 games of his first three seasons, currently the seventh most by a point guard in Division I.

## Hagins Posts Double-Double at Ohio

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his third career double-double by scoring 13 points and grabbing a team-best 10 rebounds at Ohio University. Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

## A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Alphonso Dawson (1,195 points) and Jawan Carter (1,145 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 922 career points, just 78 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

## UD Returns Majority of Scoring

Delaware returns its top seven scorers from a year ago and every player except Adam Pegg, who transferred to Stetson in the offseason after averaging 5.0 points and 2.6 rebounds per game.

The Blue Hens return 92.1 percent of their scoring from a year ago and 92.5 percent of their rebounding. Those numbers do not factor in the return of Brian Johnson, who averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds during the 2008-09 season.



## Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

## UD Signs Five To NLI's in Early Signing Period

Kyle Anderson, Marvin King-Davis, Khalid Lewis-El, Larry Savage and Jarvis Threatt each signed during the early signing period in November and comprise the Blue Hens' class of 2015.

Anderson, a 6-2 shooting guard, averaged 20.8 points per game last season at Newark Community (Ill.) High School and entered his senior season ranked third on the school's career list with 1,615 points.

King-Davis, a 6-7 forward, was an All-District and All-Region selection as a junior in 2009-10. He averaged 13.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game a year ago at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Lewis-El, a 6-3 guard, led Trenton Catholic to a 28-3 record and the New Jersey Tournament of Champions title last season. He posted 15 points and five rebounds during a 57-56 triple overtime win over nationally-ranked St. Anthony's in the New Jersey Non-Public B championship.

Savage, a 6-5 small forward, was an All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference honoree a year ago for Bishop O'Connell (Va.) High School. He averaged 12 points and six rebounds per game for the Knights in 2009-10.

Threatt, a 6-1 guard, was also an All-District and All-Region honoree last season at Highland Springs High School in Richmond. He averaged 19.6 points, 2.6 assists and 3.0 steals during his junior year.

## Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England and Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

# UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.
