Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. Last Time Out

Delaware recorded a remarkable reversal of fortune last Saturday in the latest edition of the Route One Rivalry with Delaware State.

Trailing by 11 points midway through the second half, the Blue Hens outscored the Hornets 27-5 the rest of the way and turned that double digit deficit into a 61-50 victory at the Bob Carpenter Center in the 11th meeting between the state's lone NCAA Division I schools.

Alphonso Dawson came off the bench to drop in a season-high 16 points, including eight points and two big three-pointers in the final four minutes, while Josh Brinkley and Jawan Carter each recorded 13 points as the Blue Hens (5-2) ran their winning streak to five games. Carter posted his fifth straight double-figure scoring effort.

Jamelle Hagins did the job on defense, pulling down nine rebounds and blocking five shots, while Devon Saddler had an effective all-around game with six points, six rebounds, and five assists.

Delaware State (4-5) did not score a point in the final five minutes of the game and recorded only two field goals in 14 attempts over the final 13 minutes as the Blue Hens pulled ahead.

Jay Threatt led Delaware State with 13 points while James Marcellus added eight points off the bench and Oliver netted six points to go with a team-high nine rebounds. Oliver and Threatt combined to hit just 7 of 27 field goal attempts for the game.

Delaware State went just 1 for 10 from beyond the three-point arc and shot just 37 percent from the field for the game, hitting on 20 of 54 shots, including a 10 for 26 mark in the second stanza.

The hotly-contested matchup featured nine ties and 15 lead changes, including 12 lead changes in the first half when Delaware State took a 27-26 lead into intermission. The Hornets led by as many as seven points at 21-14 with 7:20 left in the first stanza before the Hens rallied and tied the score three times in the final three minutes.

After a dunk by Brinkley tied the score at 29-29 two minutes into the second half, Delaware State appeared to take control. The Hornets reeled off eight straight points, including four by Marcellus,

before Saddler snapped the string with a jumper.

But Oliver took over for Delaware State, connecting on consecutive short jumpers and adding a dunk with 13:52 remaining to extend the lead to 43-32. Carter added two free throws for the Hens, but Alibaba Odd followed with a layup for Delaware State to keep the lead at 11 points. However, the Hornets would convert only a single free throw over the next agonizing six minutes.

Delaware took advantage of the drought, putting together an 11-1 run capped by a layup by Brinkley with 7:22 left that cut the lead to 46-45. Delaware State finally hit a field goal as a Threatt jumper pushed the lead to three points moments later.

The Hens then put together a final decisive run, starting with a layup by Dawson and a dunk by Hagins. A jumper by Saddler with 4:38 left put the Hens ahead for good at 51-50 and Dawson followed with a three-pointer 37 seconds later. Another free throw by Saddler and another three-pointer by Dawson at the 1:43 mark upped the UD lead to eight and put the game away.

Delaware vs. Villanova Last Meeting

Delaware fell under a barrage of three-pointers to Villanova before a sold out crowd at The Pavilion and dropped a 97-63 decision to the No. 8 ranked Wildcats on Dec. 23, 2009.

Scotty Reynolds led four Villanova scorers in double figures with 22 points, drained six of the Wildcats' 13 three-pointers, and dished out six assists. Taylor King came off the bench to add 19 points and game-high 12 rebounds while Reggie Redding added 16 points and Corey Fisher contributed 14 points.

The Wildcats buried 13 of their 25 three-point attempts and finished the game converting 54.1 percent of their shots from the field (33 of 61) and going 18 of 21 from the foul line. The 97 points are the most allowed by the Blue Hens in head coach Monté Ross' five-year tenure.

Delaware, which pulled to within five points early in the second half but could manage just three field goals over the final seven minutes of play, got a team-high 13 points and six assists from Jawan Carter, 10 points and seven rebounds from Kelvin McNeil, and nine points from D.J. Boney. The Hens were outrebounded by a 41-25 margin and made just 10 of 32 shots from the field in the second half.

After falling behind by 16 points at halftime, Delaware came out strong in the second half by outscoring Villanova 13-2 over the first five minutes of action. Carter and Boney each hit three-pointers in the first two minutes and McNeil converted a conventional three-point play with 15:18 left to play to cut the Wildcat margin to 50-45.

But Reynolds answered with a three-pointer and Redding followed with a layup to push the lead back to double digits, and after another Carter three-pointer cut the gap to seven, the Wildcats reeled off 12 straight points to take control. As was the case most of the night, Reynolds started the streak with a three-pointer and King ended it with another long-range basket to push the lead to 19 points.

Delaware's Adam Pegg hit a layup with 9:25 left, but the Hens would not manage another field goal until Boney nailed a three-pointer at the seven-minute mark and would not score from the field again until a three-pointer by Edwin Santiago with 1:27 left to play.

The Blue Hens held strong against the hot-shooting Wildcats in the first before a pair of big Villanova runs resulted in a 48-32 deficit at the break.

Villanova connected on four three-pointers in the first five minutes of play to race out to a 21-10 advantage at the 14:51 mark, but the Hens withstood the storm and battled back as consecutive three-pointers by Jawan Carter and D.J. Boney started a 12-3 run. Josh Brinkley capped the run with a layup at the 11:26 mark to cut the Villanova lead to 24-22, but the Hens would never get closer.

Dominic Cheek highlighted a 8-0 run with a jumper and a three-pointer to give Villanova some breathing room, but the Hens came back with a jumper by Hakim McCullar and another Carter three-pointer to trim the lead to 32-27. But it was all Villanova after that as the Wildcats scored the next 14 points, including six by Taylor



King, to open the lead up to 46-27.

Delaware, which was playing at Villanova for the first time since a NIT quarterfinal setback in March, 2000, fell to 0-8 all-time vs. the Wildcats.

Blue Hens Looking For Sixth Consecutive Win

Tonight Delaware will be looking for its sixth consecutive victory. The Blue Hens have not won six consecutive games since a seven-game streak from February 8 through March 4, 2001.

Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents

Delaware is 0-25 all-time against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, including 0-14 versus teams ranked among the top 10. The Blue Hens have played three games against ranked teams this decade, the first two at home against Saint Joseph's, when current UD head coach Monté Ross was an assistant with the Hawks.

Delaware vs. The Big East

Delaware is 0-7 against Big East opponents since the conference was formed in 1979, with two losses to Seton Hall, four to Villanova and one to Rutgers. Delaware lost to Cincinnati in the 1992 NCAA Tournament and to Louisville in the 1993 NCAA Tournament, but those schools were not in the Big East at that time.

Brinkley Sets Career-High at Hampton

Josh Brinkley set his career-high by scoring 18 points in the victory at Hampton. Brinkley, who went 6 of 10 from both the field and the foul line, added a season-high seven rebounds against the Pirates.

Brinkley scored four the Blue Hens' final five field goals, including a jumper in the paint with 52 seconds left that gave Delaware the lead for good.

Brinkley then added 13 points during the victory over Delaware State, marking the first time in his career that he reached double figures in consecutive games.

Blue Hens Lock Down Opponents Late

Hampton's Mike Tuitt hit a jumper with 10:43 remaining to put the Pirates ahead 44-37, but the Blue Hens would not allow a field goal the rest of the way.

Delaware limited Hampton to 0 of 4 shooting from the field and forced five turnovers in that stretch, while the Pirates hurt themselves by hitting just 9 of 17 free throw attempts.

The Blue Hens trailed Delaware State by 11 points midway through the second half last Saturday, but closed the game on a 27-5 run to pull away. The Hornets did not score a point during the final five minutes of the game and recorded only two field goals in 14 attempts over the final 13 minutes.

Johnson Stabilizes Point Guard Spot

Brian Johnson has played 73 minutes during the last four games since returning from a knee injury, and the senior point guard has yet to turn the ball over so far this season.

During the Blue Hens first four games of the season Delaware averaged 14.8 turnovers, but UD has turned the ball over just 9.3 times in the last three contests.

Carter Named CAA Co-Player of the Week

Jawan Carter was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on December 6 following his outstanding performance during the Blue Hens' win over Old Dominion on December 4.

Carter scored a game-high 29 points to lead Delaware to the 75-67 triumph over the Monarchs, the CAA defending champion and this year's preseason favorite. He went 6 of 12 from the field, all from behind the arc, and dished out a game-best four assists as the Blue Hens won their conference opener. Carter also went 11 of 15 from the free throw line, including 7 of 8 in the final 52 seconds to hold off Old Dominion, which was receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 polls.

The Blue Hens, who led the entire second half, built an 11-point cushion with 8:35 to play, but the Monarchs rallied for nine consecutive points to pull within 56-54 with 5:24 remaining. But after Hakim McCullar hit one free throw, Carter found Devon Saddler for a jumper and on the Blue Hens' next possession drilled a deep three-pointer to extend UD's advantage to 62-54 with 3:31 to play. The Monarchs cut the deficit to five three times in the final minute, but Delaware went 9 of 10 from the line, all but two from Carter, to ice the victory.

Carter Heating Up For Blue Hens

Jawan Carter scored just seven points during the Blue Hens' first two games of the season, but the senior guard has averaged 21.0 in each of the last five contests, all Delaware victories.

Additionally, in the last five games 48 of Carter's 53 field goal attempts have come from behind the arc.

Carter Clutch From Foul Line Late in Games

Jawan Carter went a perfect 12 of 12 from the free throw line at Lafayette, including hitting all six of his attempts in the final 32 seconds to seal the victory.

The last time a Blue Hen took that many free throw attempts without missing was when Kestutis Marciulionis went 13 of 13 during a 99-91 overtime victory over Drexel at the BCC on January 27, 1999.

Carter then went 11 of 15 from the charity stripe versus Old Dominion, including seven of eight in the final 52 seconds to hold off the Monarchs.

Carter went to the foul line with nine seconds left and the Blue Hens clinging to a one-point lead at Hampton, and he went 1 of 2 to put Delaware up a pair.

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

Saddler Makes Immediate Contributions

Devon Saddler is one of four freshmen in Division I currently averaging more than nine points, four assists and four rebounds per game. The others are T.J. McConnell of Duquesne, Lorenzo Brown of North Carolina State, and Brian Voelkel of Vermont.

Brian Johnson Returns To UD Lineup

Brian Johnson, who missed all of last season with an ACL injury and the first three games of this year after suffering a torn meniscus in the preseason, finally returned to the court during Delaware's game at Lafayette.

Johnson came off the bench to snap his school-record streak of 94 consecutive starts - every game he had appeared in during his first three years. He contributed five points and a rebound in 16 minutes of action against the Leopards. Johnson recorded his best game of the year against Delaware State, contributing four points and four assists while not turning the ball over in 22 minutes.

Carter, Hagins Among Nation's Leaders

Through Sunday's games, Jamelle Hagins ranked fourth in Division I with 3.6 blocked shots per game while Jawan Carter was tied for 10th with 3.4 three-pointers made per game.

Blue Hens Playing Well Defensively

Delaware leads the Colonial Athletic Association by holding its opponents to a 37.3 field goal percentage, and the Blue Hens have not allowed a team to shoot over 48 percent so far this year. Delaware also leads the CAA with 5.1 blocks and is second with a 26.0 three-point field goal defense.

Through Sunday's games, UD ranked 12th in Division I in three-point field goal defense, 24th in field goal percentage defense, and 35th in blocked shots per game.

Notes From the Howard Victory

- UD head coach Monté Ross won for the first time in his five home openers.
- Delaware's 34 points allowed was its fewest since a 69-32 victory over Ursinus on December 21, 1961.

- The 32-point victory was the Blue Hens' largest since a 75-40 win over James Madison on January 15, 2005.

- Delaware led 33-16 at the break, its largest halftime lead since taking a 33-15 cushion at Vermont on December 19, 2007.

- Jawan Carter made eight three-pointers, tying the school record set by Billy Wells against Hartford on February 24, 2000. Carter's 14 three-pointers attempted set a UD single game record.

- Howard's 12 field goals made and 20.0 percent shooting are both the lowest by a Blue Hen opponent since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.

- Delaware blocked 12 shots, its most since also swatting 12 against Siena on December 23, 2003.

Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut against Ohio University for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive game at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field, and he added a season-high eight assists versus Howard.

Saddler scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds while playing a game-high 37 minutes during his first CAA game against Old Dominion.

Hagins Off To Strong Start

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins has gotten off to an impressive start for the Blue Hens, leading the team with 7.9 rebounds per game and 25 blocks while ranking fourth with 8.6 points per game.

Hagins currently leads the CAA and ranks fourth in Division I with 3.6 blocks per game while ranking third in the conference with 6.4 defensive rebounds per game and ninth with 7.9 boards per contest.

Dawson Joins 1,200-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,211 career points, grabbed five rebounds against Howard to reach the 500-rebound career mark. He is just the ninth player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,200 career points and 500 career rebounds.

The others are Mike Pegues, Greg Smith, Mark Murray, Alex Coles, Harding Nana, Herb Courtney, Dave Sysko, and Anthony Wright.

Johnson Brings Experience To PG Spot

UD senior Brian Johnson brings a wealth of experience to the point guard position for the Blue Hens. Johnson has started all 94 games of his first three seasons, the fourth most by a point guard in Division I entering the season.

Hagins Posts Double-Double at Ohio

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his third career double-double by scoring 13 points and grabbing a team-best 10 rebounds at Ohio University. Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Alphonso Dawson (1,211 points) and Jawan Carter (1,158 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 926 career points, just 74 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

UD Returns Majority of Scoring

Delaware returns its top seven scorers from a year ago and every player except Adam Pegg, who transferred to Stetson in the offseason after averaging 5.0 points and 2.6 rebounds per game.

The Blue Hens return 92.1 percent of their scoring from a year ago and 92.5 percent of their rebounding. Those numbers do not factor in the return of Brian Johnson, who averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds during the 2008-09 season.

Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

UD Signs Five To NLI's in Early Signing Period

Kyle Anderson, Marvin King-Davis, Khalid Lewis-El, Larry Savage and Jarvis Threatt each signed during the early signing period in November and comprise the Blue Hens' class of 2015.

Anderson, a 6-2 shooting guard, averaged 20.8 points per game last season at Newark Community (Ill.) High School and entered his senior season ranked third on the school's career list with 1,615 points.

King-Davis, a 6-7 forward, was an All-District and All-Region selection as a junior in 2009-10. He averaged 13.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game a year ago at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Lewis-El, a 6-3 guard, led Trenton Catholic to a 28-3 record and the New Jersey Tournament of Champions title last season. He posted 15 points and five rebounds during a 57-56 triple overtime win over nationally-ranked St. Anthony's in the New Jersey Non-Public B championship.

Savage, a 6-5 small forward, was an All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference honoree a year ago for Bishop O'Connell (Va.) High School. He averaged 12 points and six rebounds per game for the Knights in 2009-10.

Threatt, a 6-1 guard, was also an All-District and All-Region honoree last season at Highland Springs High School in Richmond. He averaged 19.6 points, 2.6 assists and 3.0 steals during his junior year.

Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England and Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.
