Howard and Delaware have split four all-time meetings, while the Blue Hens have won the only previous meeting in Newark. UD posted a 97-52 victory over the Bison at the Bob Carpenter Center on December 21, 1999. Delaware also defeated Howard the season before with a 93-74 triumph in Washington, D.C. The Bison won the first two matchups, a 91-71 win on January 6, 1979 and an 87-73 victory on January 5, 1980.

Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. This season Monté Ross is scheduled to take calls from 11:30 a.m. to 11:40 a.m. The phone number to take part in the call is (877) 805-0692. Up Next

Following tonight's game UD takes eight days off before travelling to Lafayette to face the Leopards on Saturday, November 27 at 1 p.m. The Blue Hens return home on Saturday, December 4 when Delaware hosts Old Dominion in its CAA opener.

Last Time Out

Max Groebe and Chris Wroblewski each scored 13 points to lead a balanced Cornell attack as the Big Red defeated Delaware, 75-61, Wednesday night at Newman Arena.

Cornell, which won its home opener while improving to 2-1 on the season, captured its 12th straight game in Ithaca. Anthony Gatlin did not miss a shot while contributing 12 points off the bench, while Aaron Osgood and Drew Ferry added nine apiece.

Delaware, which fell to 0-2 this season and dropped its 11th consecutive road contest, was led in the scoring for the second straight game by Devon Saddler, who posted 15 points while adding six rebounds. Sophomore Hagins scored 14 points on 6 of 9 shooting while adding a team-high seven rebounds and a career-best six blocked shots.

Josh Brinkley scored six points while Hakim McCullar and Kelvin McNeil each chipped in five for Delaware.

However the Blue Hens were undone by a tough shooting night from outside as Delaware connected on only 1 of 13 three-point attempts, a triple by Alphonso Dawson with just 2:44 to go. UD senior Jawan Carter, a Preseason All-CAA Second Team selection, missed all seven of his field goal attempts while scoring just one point on the night.

The night began with Cornell raising its 2010 Ivy League Championship and Sweet Sixteen banners prior to the game, but it was the Blue Hens who got off to a hot start by jumping out to a 7-2 lead.

Delaware still led 18-17 following a bucket inside by Brinkley, but Cornell answered with three straight baskets to take a 23-18 advantage with 5:09 left and would not trail from there.

McCullar and Saddler countered with baskets to bring Delaware within a point, but the Big Red reeled off eight consecutive points to go up 31-22 on a three-pointer by Groebe at the 2:46 mark. The Blue Hens answered as Hagins hit a jumper and Saddler scored twice to make it a three-point game, but Ferry converted a driving layup with 0.2 seconds left as Cornell took a 33-28 advantage into the break.

Groebe hit his second three-pointer of the second half to put the Big Red up 41-33 early in the period, but Dawson connected from

15 feet and Saddler converted a three-point play as Delaware closed the gap to three with 16:51 to play.

The Blue Hens were still within three when Brinkley scored to make it 45-42, but Gatlin converted a four-point play followed by jumpers by Osgood and Wroblewski as Cornell went up double figures at 53-42 with 11:37 remaining.

The lead grew to as much as 13 before Saddler scored in between two baskets by Hagins as Delaware pulled within 58-49 at the 8:34 mark. However the Blue Hens would not get closer as Cornell responded with a 10-3 run, going up 68-52 on a free throw by Adam Wire with 3:20 to go.

Delaware in Home Openers

Tonight's game begins the 19th home season since the opening of the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware is 12-6 in home openers at the BCC, but the Blue Hens have dropped their last four home openers.

Road Woes For the Blue Hens

Delaware's loss at Cornell was the Blue Hens 11th consecutive road defeat. UD is 17-71 in road games since the start of the 2004-05 season, and has gone winless on the road in the CAA during each of the last two years.

Blue Hens Face Tough Opening Stretch

Delaware opened its 2010-11 campaign with a pair of road games against teams that posted victories in last spring's NCAA Tournament. Ohio University used a pair of overtime victories during its run to the MAC Championship in March, and the 13th-seeded Bobcats toppled fourth-seeded Georgetown, 97-83, in the first round of the Big Dance. Ohio was picked to win the MAC East Division and the conference tournament in this year's preseason poll.

The Blue Hens then faced Cornell, the three-time Ivy League champions. The Big Red advanced to the Sweet 16 as a No. 12 seed with double figure wins over Temple and Wisconsin. Cornell ended the season ranked No. 17 in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and won an Ivy League record 29 games. The Big Red was picked third in this year's Ivy League Preseason Poll.

Delaware vs. the MEAC

Delaware is 12-5 all-time against MEAC opponents, including 2-2 against Howard. The Blue Hens are also 8-2 versus rival Delaware State and 2-1 against Hampton.

Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive game Wednesday at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field.

Hagins Off To Strong Start

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins has been a bright spot for the Blue Hens this season, leading the team with 8.5 rebounds per game and nine blocks while ranking second with 13.5 points per game.

After posting a double-double in the season opener at Ohio University, Hagins scored 14 points on 6 of 9 shooting Wednesday against Cornell. Hagins also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and blocked a career-best six shots against the Big Red.



Hens Struggling From Behind the Arc

Delaware has yet to find its range from behind the arc so far this season, going just 5 of 27 (18.5%) from three-point range. Alphonso Dawson is 3 of 11 from long distance, while Jawan Carter is just 1 of 11. The Blue Hens missed their first 11 attempts from three-point range at Cornell before Dawson connected with 2:44 remaining.

Dawson To Join 1,100-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,171 career points, is just five rebounds shy of 500 for his career. He is poised to become just the 11th player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,100 career points and 500 career rebounds.

Johnson To Miss 2-3 Weeks With Torn Meniscus

Senior point guard Brian Johnson suffered a torn left meniscus during the Blue Hens' second practice of the season and will miss the first few games of the season. The injury occurred in the same knee as his ACL injury that forced Johnson to miss all of last season, but the injuries are not related.

Delaware hopes to have Johnson back in the lineup for the Lafayette (Nov. 27) or Old Dominion (Dec. 4) contests.

Johnson Brings Experience To PG Spot

UD senior Brian Johnson brings a wealth of experience to the point guard position for the Blue Hens. Johnson has started all 94 games of his first three seasons, the fourth most by a point guard in Division I.

Ohio University Dominates Boards

Ohio University held at 13-rebound edge over Delaware on Saturday, as the Bobcats' 47 boards were the most allowed by the Blue Hens since Siena also grabbed 47 on November 24, 2009.

Ohio also collected 17 offensive rebounds, which led to the Bobcats taking 74 field goal attempts to Delaware's 55. Ohio's 74 attempts were the most allowed by Delaware since New Hampshire attempted 76 on January 25, 2001.

Hagins Posts Double-Double at Ohio

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his third career double-double by scoring 13 points and grabbing a team-best 10 rebounds at Ohio University. Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

Brinkley Provides Spark Off Bench

Sophomore Josh Brinkley came off the bench at Ohio University to score 12 points on 5 of 7 shooting and also grabbed three rebounds in 18 minutes of action. His 12 points ties for the third highest total in his career.

A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Alphonso Dawson (1,171 points) and Jawan Carter (1,053 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 911 career points, just 89 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

UD Returns Majority of Scoring

Delaware returns its top seven scorers from a year ago and every player except Adam Pegg, who transferred to Stetson in the offseason after averaging 5.0 points and 2.6 rebounds per game.

The Blue Hens return 92.1 percent of their scoring from a year ago and 92.5 percent of their rebounding. Those numbers do not factor in the return of Brian Johnson, who averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds during the 2008-09 season.

Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Guard Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England and Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

Delaware Picked Ninth in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware was picked ninth in the Colonial Athletic Association Preseason Poll announced October 19 at the league's Media Day at Champs-Pentagon Row Restaurant in Arlington, Va.

Delaware Basketball on Television

Delaware will have six televised regular season games during 2010-11. The Blue Hens will play at George Mason on January 3 at 7 p.m. on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet New England, The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast, while UD's contest at Drexel on January 8 at 4 p.m. will be televised by The Comcast Network and Comcast SportsNet New England.

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 598 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made one three-pointer in all but five games since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in 1986-87.

Blue Hens Feature Home-Grown Talent

The Blue Hens have five players on their roster that played high school basketball in the state of Delaware: Jawan Carter (Tatnall), D.J. Boney (Tatnall), Edwin Santiago (Sanford), Samer Madarani (Sanford) and Will Townsville (Glasgow). In fact, Carter is the leading scorer in Delaware history with 2,464 career points.

The Blue Hens have now had five players from Delaware in three consecutive seasons; the previous time a UD team featured at least five players from the state of Delaware was during the 1954-55 season.

UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.
