Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. The Blue Hens return home next Saturday to host Old Dominion at 7 p.m. in their CAA opener. Delaware then travels to Hampton on Wednesday, December 8 at 7 p.m.

Last Time Out

Delaware broke out to a 17-point halftime lead and then used a 25-0 run in the second half to overwhelm Howard and run off with 66-34 victory in the Blue Hens' home opener at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Jawan Carter bombed away for a game-high 24 points on a school-record eight three pointers as the Blue Hens posted their most one-sided victory since a 75-40 win over James Madison on Jan. 15, 2005.

Everyone got in on the act for Delaware as Jamelle Hagins had six points, pulled 10 rebounds, and recorded six of the Blue Hens' 12 blocked shots on the night. Hakim McCullar added nine points and six rebounds while Devon Saddler contributed six points, four rebounds, and a team-high eight assists.

Howard, which shot just 20 percent from the field for the game, including 2 of 13 from beyond the three-point line, got team-highs of 16 points and 10 rebounds from forward Mike Phillips but the forward was just 6 of 23 from the field. No other Bison player managed to score more than four points as Howard connected on just 6 of 34 second half shots from the field (17.6 percent).

The 34 points allowed was the lowest for a Delaware team since the Blue Hens defeated Ursinus 69-32 on Dec. 21, 1961.

Carter knocked down 8 of 14 three-pointers and posted his 20th career 20-point effort. The eight three-pointers tied the UD single game record of eight set by Billy Wells vs. Hartford on Feb. 24, 2000 while his 14 attempts set a new Delaware standard.

Delaware used a 9-1 run late in the first half to take control and went into the break up 33-16. The 17-point cushion marked the Hens' largest lead at the half since Dec. 19, 2007 when Delaware took a 33-15 lead into intermission vs. Vermont.

But the fun was just starting for the Blue Hens. Phillips helped Howard cut the lead to 33-18 on a layup just 38 seconds into the second half, but the Bison would miss their next 17 shots from the field before finally scoring again on a free throw by Phillips. By that time the Hens had built the lead to 58-19 thanks to the 25-0 run. Howard did not convert a field goal again until Bryce Fluellen knocked down a three-pointer with 9:09 left to play.

Carter opened the run with a three-pointer and added four more treys, including one with 9:55 left that gave the Hens their

biggest lead of the night at 40 points at 58-18. Hagins led the defense during the run as he swatted away five shots and pulled six rebounds in a stretch of 7:34.

Delaware vs. Lafayette Last Season

Alphonso Dawson sent the game into overtime with a basket in the closing seconds of the second half and scored eight consecutive points for Delaware to break a tie in the extra session to lead the Blue Hens to a thrilling 82-72 victory over Lafayette at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Dawson finished the game with team-highs of 23 points and 14 rebounds but saved his biggest contributions for the late-going to lead Delaware to the victory.

He sent the game into overtime on a jumper with just nine seconds left in regulation, broke a 65-65 tie with 3:44 remaining in overtime with a three-pointer, and later added another long range basket and a jumper, all in a span of 88 seconds, to help the Hens pull away.

D.J. Boney added a career-high 16 points for Delaware, including four three-pointers, and Jawan Carter shook off a 3 for 18 shooting night, including a 1 of 12 showing from beyond the three-point arc, to contribute 15 points, seven assists, and four straight free throws in the final 33 seconds to keep Lafayette at bay.

The Hens hit just 8 of 35 three-pointers as a team but more than made up for it at the foul line where they connected on 30 of 36 shots (83.3 percent) for the night, including 21 of 24 accuracy after halftime.

Lafayette led by as many as seven points with six minutes left in regulation but could never find the range from long distance, hitting just 2 of 13 three-point attempts after halftime. Jared Mintz was the lone offensive force for the Leopards, hitting 9 of 13 shots from the field and finishing with a career-high 26 points. Four other Lafayette players scored six points apiece.

The Hens led 35-32 at halftime and tied the game at 61-61 during a contest that featured 11 ties with neither team leading by more than seven points until late in overtime.

Despite missing its first 10 field goal attempts of the stanza and not scoring until the 13:30 mark of the second half, Delaware stayed close and eventually fought back to tie the score at 47-47 on two free throws by Josh Brinkley with 7:36 left in regulation. But Lafayette controlled the next six minutes, going up by as much as seven points several times, the last at 59-52 with 2:17 left on two Mintz free throws.

But Delaware rallied back as Carter hit a layup and Dawson connected on two free throws as part of a 4-0 run. Carter later added three straight free throws to pull Delaware to within 61-59 with 12 seconds remaining, and pulled down a clutch rebound on his own free throw miss. Dawson then nailed a jumper three seconds later to send the game into overtime.

The extra session featured two ties in the first minute of play, but Delaware pulled away as Dawson single-handedly outscored Lafayette 8-2 over the next the 1:20 to give the Hens the lead and UD converted 9 of 10 free throws the rest of the way to stay in front.

UD vs. Old Dominion Game Time Changed

Due to the UD football team's home playoff game at 12 noon, the Blue Hens' home game next Saturday against Old Dominion has been moved to a 7 p.m. start. Delaware's home game versus Delaware State on Saturday, December 11 could also be changed pending further UD football playoff games.

Road Woes For the Blue Hens

Delaware's loss at Cornell was the Blue Hens' 11th consecutive road defeat. UD is 17-71 in road games since the start of the 2004-05 season, and has gone winless on the road in the CAA during each of the last two years.



Notes From the Howard Victory

- UD head coach Monté Ross won for the first time in his five home openers.
- Delaware's 34 points allowed was its fewest since a 69-32 victory over Ursinus on December 21, 1961.
- The 32-point victory was the Blue Hens' largest since a 75-40 win over James Madison on January 15, 2005.
- Delaware led 33-16 at the break, its largest halftime lead since taking a 33-15 cushion at Vermont on December 19, 2007.
- Jawan Carter made eight three-pointers, tying the school record set by Billy Wells against Hartford on February 24, 2000. Carter's 14 three-pointers attempted set a UD single game record.
- Howard's 12 field goals made and 20.0 percent shooting are both the lowest by a Blue Hen opponent since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.
- Delaware blocked 12 shots, its most since also swatting 12 against Siena on December 23, 2003.

Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut against Ohio University for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive game at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field, and he added a season-high eight assists versus Howard.

Hagins Off To Strong Start

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins has gotten off to an impressive start for the Blue Hens, leading the team with 9.0 rebounds per game and 15 blocks while ranking second with 11.0 points per game.

After posting a double-double in the season opener at Ohio University, Hagins scored 14 points on 6 of 9 shooting against Cornell. Hagins also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds and blocked a career-best six shots against the Big Red.

Hagins collected 10 rebounds against Howard while again blocking six shots and scoring six points. He currently leads the CAA with 5.0 blocks and 7.7 defensive rebounds per game, and ranks fifth with 9.0 rebounds per contest.

Dawson Joins 1,100-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,178 career points, grabbed five rebounds against Howard and now has collected 500 career boards. He became just the 11th player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,100 career points and 500 career rebounds.

Johnson Questionable For Today's Game

Senior point guard Brian Johnson suffered a torn left meniscus during the Blue Hens' second practice of the season and has missed the first three games of the season. The injury occurred in the same knee as his ACL injury that forced Johnson to miss all of last season, but the injuries are not related.

Johnson is listed as questionable for this afternoon's game.

Johnson Brings Experience To PG Spot

UD senior Brian Johnson brings a wealth of experience to the point guard position for the Blue Hens. Johnson has started all 94 games of his first three seasons, currently the seventh most by a point guard in Division I.

Ohio University Dominates Boards

Ohio University held at 13-rebound edge over Delaware, as the Bobcats' 47 boards were the most allowed by the Blue Hens since Siena also grabbed 47 on November 24, 2009.

Ohio also collected 17 offensive rebounds, which led to the Bobcats taking 74 field goal attempts to Delaware's 55. Ohio's 74 attempts were the most allowed by Delaware since New Hampshire attempted 76 on January 25, 2001.

Hagins Posts Double-Double at Ohio

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his third career double-double by scoring 13 points and grabbing a team-best 10 rebounds at Ohio University. Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Alphonso Dawson (1,178 points) and Jawan Carter (1,077 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 911 career points, just 89 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

UD Returns Majority of Scoring

Delaware returns its top seven scorers from a year ago and every player except Adam Pegg, who transferred to Stetson in the offseason after averaging 5.0 points and 2.6 rebounds per game.

The Blue Hens return 92.1 percent of their scoring from a year ago and 92.5 percent of their rebounding. Those numbers do not factor in the return of Brian Johnson, who averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds during the 2008-09 season.

Additionally, most Blue Hen men's basketball games are broadcast by the UD student radio station, WVUD 91.3 FM. Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through the UD athletics website.

Delaware Basketball on Television

Delaware will have six televised regular season games during 2010-11. The Blue Hens will play at George Mason on January 3 at 7 p.m. on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet New England, The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast, while UD's contest at Drexel on January 8 at 4 p.m. will be televised by The Comcast Network and Comcast SportsNet New England.

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

Additionally, Delaware's game at Villanova on December 18 at 7:30 p.m. will be available online at ESPN3.com.

Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Guard Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England an Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.

NEWARK, DEL. -- Delaware broke out to a 17-point halftime lead and then used a 25-0 run in the second half to overwhelm Howard with a 66-34 victory in the Blue Hens' home opener...Jawan Carter scored a game-high 24 points on a school-record eight three pointers as UD (1-2) posted its largest victory since a 75-40 win over James Madison on Jan. 15, 2005...Jamelie Hagins scored six points, pulled 10 rebounds, and recorded six of the Blue Hens' 12 blocked shots...Hakim McCullar added nine points and six rebounds while Devon Saddler contributed six points, four rebounds, and a team-high eight assists...Howard (1-2), which shot just 20 percent from the field including 2 of 13 from beyond the three-point line, got team-highs of 16 points and 10 rebounds from Mike Phillips...But no other Bison player scored more than four points as Howard connected on just 6 of 34 second half shots...The 34 points allowed was the lowest for UD since a 69-32 win over Ursinus on Dec. 21, 1961...Carter's eight three-pointers tied the UD single game record set by Billy Wells vs. Hartford on Feb. 24, 2000 while his 14 attempts set a new UD standard...Delaware used a 9-1 run late in the first half to take control and went into the break up 33-16...Phillips helped Howard cut the lead to 33-18 on a layup just 38 seconds into the second half, but the Bison would miss their next 17 shots from the field before finally scoring again on a free throw by Phillips...By that time the Hens had built the lead to 58-19 thanks to the 25-0 run...Carter opened the run with a three-pointer and added four more treys, including one with 9:55 left that gave the Hens their biggest lead of the night at 40 points at 58-18.
