Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 2 and running through February 27. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. Delaware vs. Drexel

Delaware leads the all-time series with Drexel, 73-71, and the Blue Hens are 47-24 against the Dragons in Newark. However Drexel has won the last three meetings, including a sweep last year. The Dragons posted a 68-55 victory in Philadelphia on January 8 and a 58-48 win in Newark on February 5.

Last Time Out

Boston University senior guard Darryl Partin scored a game-high 27 points to lead the Terriers to a 73-67 victory over Delaware Wednesday night at Case Gymnasium.

Partin went 12 of 26 from the field and also tied for the team lead with seven rebounds. Sophomore forward Travis Robinson, who entered the game averaging just 3.0 points per contest, erupted for a career-high 16 as he went 5 of 5 from the field while knocking down all four of his three-point attempts. D.J. Irving handed out a career-best 11 assists against just two turnovers while also grabbing seven boards for BU, which improved to 3-4 on the season.

Delaware was led for the fifth straight game by sophomore guard Devon Saddler, who poured in 20 points in a losing effort. Janelle Hagins posted his second consecutive double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds, while also blocking a season-high five shots and making a career-high four steals. Fellow junior Josh Brinkley had his most productive game of the season as he scored 12 points and grabbed six rebounds.

Khalid Lewis scored eight points while playing all 40 minutes, while Kyle Anderson also recorded eight points as he failed to reach double figures for the first time in his Blue Hen career.

The Blue Hens took a slim 38-37 halftime lead and still led 43-42 two and a half minutes into the second period, but a 6-0 Terriers spurt put the hosts in front 48-43 with 14:57 remaining. However Delaware quickly answered with a 10-0 run as a jumper by Saddler, three-pointers by Anderson and Lewis, and a dunk by Hagins put UD ahead 53-48 with 11:54 to play.

Delaware still led by five at 57-52 at the 9:54 mark following another Hagins slam, but the Blue Hens would miss their next 14 field goal attempts before a tip-in by Hagins with 1:01 remaining. Meanwhile the Terriers erupted for a 15-3 spurt, taking their largest lead to that point at 67-60 on a jumper by Partin with 2:08 on the clock.

Delaware would not go away, however, as two free throws by Saddler and the tip-in by Hagins made it a 67-64 game with one minute left. However Partin drilled a contested 16-foot jumper with 30 seconds remaining, and the Blue Hens would not threaten the rest of the way.

The Blue Hens shot a blistering 57.7 percent during the opening half, hitting on 15 of their 26 field goal attempts. However Boston University stayed right with Delaware by shooting 48.4 percent (15 of 31) from the floor, including 5 of 11 from behind the arc.

The Terriers continued to shoot well in the second half by connecting on 13 of 28 field goals for a 46.4 percentage, while holding the Blue Hens to just 10 of 35 shooting (28.6 percent) over the final 20 minutes.

Delaware vs. Drexel Last Meeting

Despite suffering through its worst shooting performance of the season, Delaware managed to build a seven-point second half lead but the margin didn't hold up as the Hens fell to rival Drexel 58-48 on February 5 at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Devon Saddler scored a then career-high 20 points to lead the Blue Hens.

Drexel got a big effort from guard Chris Fouch, who came off the bench to score 19 of his game-high 23 points in the second half to lead the Dragon comeback. Fouch also pulled down seven rebounds while connecting on 8 of 11 shots from the field and 7 of 8 from the line. Dartaye Ruffin also had a big day off the bench for Drexel as he dropped in 14 points and pulled eight rebounds, while Samme Givens added eight points and eight rebounds for Drexel.

Delaware hit just 15 of 51 shots from the field (29.4 percent), its lowest shooting percentage of the season, and managed to connect on only 2 of 12 three-point attempts in scoring a season-low 48 points.

Saddler hit on 8 of 16 shots from the field, but the rest of the Blue Hens lineup connected on 7 of 35 shots as Jawan Carter struggled through a 1 for 10 shooting performance and finished with eight points. Kelvin McNeil scored five points, blocked three shots, and pulled a team-high seven rebounds for Delaware.

The Hens were also hurt by 8 of 15 shooting from the foul line, including missing 5 of 8 over the final five minutes of play as they tried to get back into the game. The Dragons helped their cause by converting 19 of 23 shots from the foul line for the game, including hitting 13 of 15 shots in the second half and 7 of 8 in the final 35 seconds to ice the victory.

Neither team led by more than five points in a hard-fought first half that featured six ties. Carter knocked down three free throws with just two seconds left in the stanza to knot the score at 23-23 at the break.

Drexel's Daryl McCoy broke the tie with a layup just 37 seconds into the stanza, but a three-pointer by Carter, his only trey of the game, started an 11-2 run that lifted the Blue Hens to a seven-point cushion at 34-27 with 14:34 left to play. The Hens still led by seven points with 12:21 left after a layup by Saddler before the Dragons came to life.

Fouch finished off a conventional three-point play to start a 13-4 run in which he scored 11 points which gave Drexel the lead at 42-40 with 5:28 remaining. Saddler ended the string with two free throws 20 seconds later to knot the score for eighth time at 42-42, but Drexel answered by scoring the next nine points, including four by Fouch, to take control at 51-42 with 2:27 left. Saddler scored the next four points for the Hens to narrow the gap to 51-46 with 1:34 left, but the Hens could never get closer.

Blue Hens Open With CAA Favorite Again

Last season Delaware's only CAA game in December came at home against preseason favorite Old Dominion, and the Blue Hens took advantage of the opportunity with a 75-67 win over the Monarchs.

Delaware has that same opportunity this season, as the Blue Hens host CAA favorite Drexel this afternoon at the BCC.

Threatt Expected Back in Lineup Today

Jarvis Threatt, who has been hampered by a leg injury suffered in the Villanova game on November 18, sat out Wednesday's contest at Boston University. He is expected to be back in the Blue Hen lineup this afternoon.

Freshman Contributing For Delaware

Of the nine players who have seen action for the Blue Hens this season, four are freshmen.

Saddler Leads UD in Scoring Again

Devon Saddler has led Delaware in scoring during all five games this season. Jawan Carter was the last Blue Hen to accomplish that feat, as he was also UD's leading scorer during the first five games of the 2009-10 season.

Saddler has reached the 20-point mark in four consecutive games, and if he reaches that plateau again today, would become the first Blue Hen to reach 20 points in five straight since Carter from January 23 through February 8, 2010.

Hagins Posts Consecutive Double-Doubles

Jamelle Hagins posted his first double-double of the season with 13 points and 14 rebounds during last Saturday's win over Lafayette, and added another with 17 points and 12 boards at Boston University. He is the first Blue Hen to record double-doubles in consecutive games since Marc Egerson against Towson and Hofstra on January 5-7, 2009.

Hagins Dominant on Glass

Jamelle Hagins has grabbed at least seven rebounds during all five games this season, and has reached double figures in the last two with 14 against Lafayette and 12 at Boston University. He currently leads the CAA with 10.0 rebounds per game and 6.8 defensive rebounds per game, and is tied for third with 3.2 offensive boards per game.

Through Sunday's games, Hagins was tied for 39th in the nation with 9.5 rebounds per game.

Brinkley Has Big Game at BU

Junior forward Josh Brinkley had his most productive game of the season at Boston University, reaching double figures for the first time this season by scoring a season-high 12 points on 4 of 8 shooting from the field. Brinkley also grabbed six rebounds and blocked two shots in 24 minutes of action against the Terriers.

Saddler Sets Career-High vs. Lafayette

Devon Saddler scored a career-high 32 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette on November 26. The sophomore guard went 11 of 22 from the field, hit three 3-pointers, and finished 7 of 8 from the free throw line.

Saddler's 32 points are the most by a Blue Hen since Jawan Carter scored 35 during a 97-94 double overtime win at Penn on November 21, 2009.

Anderson Immediately Produces For Hens

Kyle Anderson scored a season-high 16 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette last Saturday, and went 4 of 5 from three-point range. After sitting out the season opener at Radford, Anderson scored 12 points at Villanova and added 11 versus Cornell. He is believed to be the first true freshman in school history to reach double figures in each of his first three collegiate games.

Anderson Clutch From Long Distance

Delaware led Cornell by one point late in the contest, but Kyle Anderson buried a three-pointer to make it a 62-58 game with 1:23 remaining. The Blue Hens were tied with Lafayette, 75-75, last Saturday but Anderson drilled a go-ahead three-pointer with 30 seconds on the clock. Both treys were assisted by Devon Saddler.

Anderson currently leads the CAA with 3.3 three-pointers made per game and ranks fifth with a 46.4 three-point field goal percentage.

Lewis Coming On Strong

After scoring just two points in each of the first two games this season, Khalid Lewis is averaging 8.3 points over the last three. Lewis, who ranks 11th in the CAA with 3.2 assists and 12th with a 1.1 assist/turnover ratio, is eighth in the league with 34.2 minutes played per game. He played all 40 minutes at Boston University on Wednesday.

Saddler, Anderson Earn CAA Weekly Honors

Devon Saddler was named the CAA Co-Player of the Week while Kyle Anderson earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors on Monday after the backcourt duo led the Blue Hens to a pair of wins last week.

Saddler averaged 26.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists on the week, and scored a career-high 32 points against Lafayette. Anderson added 13.5 points and went 7 of 12 from three-point range, and hit a crucial three-pointer late in each of the Blue Hen victories.

Hagins Holds Block Party

Jamelle Hagins blocked a season-high five shots at Boston University, and currently ranks second in the CAA with 2.2 blocks per game.

Hagins had blocked a shot in 19 consecutive games, the third longest streak in school history, through the Radford game did not block a shot against either Villanova or Cornell. John Bennett blocked a shot in 32 straight games in 1998-99, while Spencer Dunkley had a block in 27 straight from 1991-93.

Blue Hen Duo Leads Nation in Scoring

The first NCAA statistics were released Monday, and a pair of Blue Hens were leading Division I in scoring through Sunday's games. Devon Saddler led the men with 24.5 points per game, while Elena Delle Donne led the women by averaging 30.3 points per game.

Additionally, Kyle Anderson ranked 10th in the nation with 3.7 three-pointers made per game and 19th with a 52.4 three-point percentage, while Jamelle Hagins was 39th with 9.5 rebounds per game.

McNeil Producing Off Bench For Blue Hens

Kelvin McNeil has grabbed at least five rebounds during all five games this season. He ranks 14th in the CAA with 6.2 rebounds per game and tied for 15th with 4.2 defensive boards per game.

McNeil is also averaging 4.0 points per game, and scored a season-high nine during last Saturday's win over Lafayette.

Hens Find Shooting Touch vs. Lafayette

Delaware shot a season-high 53.6 percent against Lafayette, going 30 of 56 from the field. That is the Blue Hens' highest percentage since shooting 57.4 percent at Delaware State on December 1, 2009.

UD continued to shoot well during the first half against Boston University, going 15 of 26 from the field for a 57.5 percentage. However the Hens went just 10 of 35 (28.6%) during the second half and missed 14 straight shots late in the second half as the Terriers took control.

Delaware Wins Home Opener

Following the victory over Cornell, Delaware is now 14-6 in home openers at the BCC. The Blue Hens had dropped four consecutive home openers, but defeated Howard, 66-34, last season before the win over the Big Red.

Hens Fire Away From Deep At Villanova

Delaware attempted 32 three-pointers at Villanova (making 10), tied for the sixth most attempts in a game in Delaware history. Kyle Anderson was 4 of 9 from behind the arc, while Devon Saddler finished 3 of 10 and Jarvis Threatt was 3 of 9.

Delaware Basketball on Television

The Blue Hens will have seven games televised this season (five locally). The Comcast Network will televise the Delaware's home game against Drexel on December 3, while Comcast SportsNet-Mid Atlantic will broadcast the January 7 game at William & Mary.

The Comcast Network will show the Blue Hens' home contest versus VCU on January 14, as well as the road game at Drexel on January 28. TCN will also show the February 4 tilt at James Madison and the regular season finale against James Madison on February 25.

The Blue Hens' home game versus Old Dominion on January 11 will be shown by WSKY in Hampton Roads, Va., while the road games at Villanova on November 18 and at George Mason on January 18 will be available online at ESPN3.com.

Additionally, The Comcast Network will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games and both semifinal games, while ESPN will broadcast the conference championship game.

Clyburn Suspended Indefinitely

Prior to the season opener sophomore Kaleb Clyburn was suspended indefinitely due to a violation of team rules. Clyburn appeared in 17 games a year ago, contributing 13 points and seven assists.

King-Davis Likely To Redshirt Season

With four experienced players in the Delaware frontcourt, Blue Hen freshman forward Marvin King-Davis is expected to sit out this season as a redshirt. King-Davis was a first team All-District, first team All-Region, second team All-Metro, and second team All-State selection as a senior at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Threatt, Lewis Start in Debuts

Freshmen Jarvis Threatt and Khalid Lewis each started their Blue Hen debuts, becoming the seventh and eighth true freshmen to start their first collegiate game under head coach Monté Ross.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started the 2009 opener, while Devon Saddler started last year's opener.

This year featured the fifth time in Monté Ross' six seasons that his season-opening starting lineup included a true freshman.

Blue Hen Captains

Head Coach Monté Ross

Sixth Season at Delaware • Winston-Salem State '92 • 55-106 Record

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of

Delaware men's basketball history and begins his sixth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2011-12. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district. The following season, the Blue Hens posted a record of 7-24, including wins over America East champion Vermont and Patriot League runner-up Lafayette.

Delaware posted a seven-win improvement during last year, going 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA with an 8-10 league mark. The Blue Hens won five straight games early in the campaign, including an impressive home victory over eventual league champion Old Dominion. Delaware advanced to the CAA Tournament Quarterfinals following a victory over Northeastern in the first round, while freshman Devon Saddler was named the league's Rookie of the Year.

Ross, 41, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University for 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He

knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 12, and daughter, Lauren, 10.

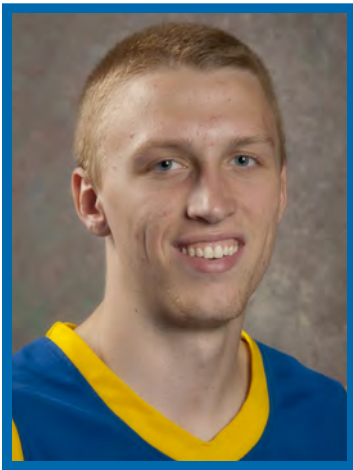
