Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 2 and running through February 27. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. This season Monté Ross is scheduled to take calls from 11:30 a.m. to 11:40 a.m. The phone number to take part in the call is (877) 805-0692. Delaware vs. Delaware State

Delaware leads the all-time series with Delaware State, 9-2, and the Blue Hens have won four of the five meetings in Dover. However the Hornets took the last matchup in Memorial Hall Gym, posting a 75-67 victory on December 1, 2009.

Last Time Out

Penn senior guard Zack Rosen scored 29 points and the Quakers used a 17-2 run early in the second half to defeat Delaware, 69-60, Wednesday night at The Palestra.

Rosen also dished out a game-high eight assists and hit all 12 of his free throw attempts for Penn (5-5). Tyler Bernardini contributed 16 points, six rebounds and four steals for the Quakers, while Rob Belcore added a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Delaware (3-4), which has lost all four of its road games, was led by freshman Kyle Anderson who poured in 13 points. Junior forward Jamelle Hagins recorded his fourth consecutive double-double with 11 points and 10 boards, while freshman guard Khalid Lewis reached season-highs with 10 points and seven assists.

Junior Josh Brinkley was the fourth Blue Hen in double figures as he chipped in with 10 points. However sophomore guard Devon Saddler was held to just six points and sat out the final 13:19 of the contest.

Despite their slow start the Blue Hens ended the game shooting 44.2 percent from the field (23 of 52), but went just 4 of 14 from behind the arc and only 10 of 17 from the free throw line. Delaware limited the Quakers to 36.8 percent shooting for the game (21 of 57), but Penn knocked down 5 of 9 three-pointers in the second half and finished the contest 20 of 23 from the charity stripe.

Penn jumped out to 9-2 lead as the Blue Hens opened 1 of 5 from the field with six turnovers, before a breakaway dunk by Saddler and a basket inside by Hagins pulled UD within 9-6 with 12:26 left in first half.

The Quakers responded with four straight points and led the rest of the half, going up 26-20 at the 2:10 mark on a three-pointer from the top of the key by Rosen. But Jarvis Threatt drained a three-pointer from the left corner and Lewis converted a dunk in transition as the Blue Hens pulled to within 26-25 at the break.

Delaware took its first lead of the game when Saddler opened the second half with a bucket but Penn quickly answered with a 9-0 run, taking a 35-27 lead on a Bernardini three-pointer with 17:06 remaining. Anderson hit a jumper to make it a six-point game but the Quakers countered with eight consecutive points, including five by Belcore, to extend the spurt to 17-2 and take a 43-29 advantage at the 12:53 mark.

The Quakers were still up 14 at 48-34 but four points by Hagins, two free throws by Brinkley, and a fast break layup by Lewis got Delaware within 48-42 with 7:27 remaining. However Steve Rennard drilled a three-pointer for Penn, his first points of the season, and after a basket by Brinkley, Rosen scored twice as the Quakers went back up double digits at 55-44 with 5:12 to play.

Delaware would not go away, as inside baskets by Hagins and Brinkley cut the Quaker lead to 55-48 with 4:26 on the clock. But on Penn's next possession Bernardini hit a big three-pointer from the right wing before Rosen added two free throws to make it a 60-48 game with 1:52 left.

The Blue Hens answered with a three-pointer by Anderson, and following a steal, a layup by Lewis to pull within 60-53 with 1:29 on the clock. Another triple by Anderson made it a six-point game with 51 seconds left, but Delaware would get no closer.

Delaware vs. Delaware State Last Meeting

Trailing by 11 points midway through the second half, the Blue Hens outscored the Hornets 27-5 the rest of the way and turned that double digit deficit into a 61-50 victory on December 11, 2010 at the Bob Carpenter Center in the Route 1 Rivalry.

Alphonso Dawson came off the bench to drop in 16 points, including eight points and two big three-pointers in the final four minutes,

while Josh Brinkley and Jawan Carter each recorded 13 points as the Blue Hens ran their winning streak to five games.

Jamelle Hagins did the job on defense, pulling down nine rebounds and blocking five shots, while Devon Saddler had an effective all-around game with six points, six rebounds, and five assists.

Delaware State did not score a point in the final five minutes of the game and recorded only two field goals in 14 attempts over the final 13 minutes as the Blue Hens pulled ahead.

Jay Threatt led Delaware State with 13 points while James Marcellus added eight points off the bench and Marques Oliver netted six points and pulled a team-high nine rebounds. Oliver and Threatt combined to hit just 7 of 27 field goal attempts for the game.

Delaware State went just 1 for 10 from beyond three-point arc for the game and shot just 37 percent from the field for the game, hitting on 20 of 54 shots, including a 10 for 26 mark in the second stanza.

The hotly-contested matchup featured nine ties and 15 lead changes, including 12 lead changes in the first half when Delaware State took a 27-26 lead into intermission. Delaware State led by as many as seven points at 21-14 with 7:20 left in the first stanza before the Hens rallied and tied the score three times in the final three minutes.

After a dunk by Brinkley tied the score at 29-29 two minutes into the second half, Delaware State appeared to take control. The Hornets reeled off eight straight points, including four by Marcellus, before Saddler snapped the string with a jumper.

But Oliver took over for Delaware State, connecting on consecutive short jumpers and adding a dunk with 13:52 remaining to extend the lead to 43-32. Carter added two free throws for the Hens, but Alibaba Odd followed with a layup for Delaware State to keep the lead at 11 points. However, the Hornets would convert only a single free throw over the next six agonizing minutes.

Delaware took advantage of the drought, putting together an 11-1 run capped by a layup by Brinkley with 7:22 left that cut the lead to 46-45. Delaware State finally hit a field goal as a Threatt jumper pushed the lead to three points moments later.

The Hens then put together a final decisive run, starting with a layup by Dawson and a dunk by Hagins. A jumper by Saddler with 4:38 put the Hens ahead for good at 51-50 and Dawson followed with a three-pointer 37 seconds later. Another free throw by Saddler and another three-pointer by Dawson at the 1:43 mark upped the UD lead to eight and put the game away.

Threatt Brothers Facing Off

This edition of the Route 1 Rivalry will be special for two players, as brothers Jay Threatt, a senior guard at Delaware State, and Jarvis Threatt, a freshman guard at Delaware, will face off against each other.

Jay was on the George Mason basketball team during the 2007-08 season, before transferring to Delaware State and sitting out the 2008-09 season. He is currently in his third year on the Hornets, leading the squad with 40 assists and 22 steals while ranking fourth with 9.0 points per game.

Jarvis has appeared in six games while starting two in his first year with the Blue Hens, averaging 4.0 points and 3.7 rebounds. He scored a season-high 11 points at Villanova, and added nine boards during last Saturday's win over Drexel.

Hagins With Four Straight Double-Doubles

Jamelle Hagins has recorded double-doubles in each of his last four games, averaging 14.3 points and 12.3 rebounds in that stretch. He had not reached double digits in scoring in more than two straight games prior to the Cornell game, but he has scored in double figures in each of the last five contests.

Hagins is the first Blue Hen to record double-doubles in four consecutive games since Herb Courtney from February 10-21, 2007. The last UD player to post five straight is Harding Nana from December 10, 2005 through January 5, 2006.

UD Defeats CAA Favorite in Opener Again

Last season Delaware's only CAA game in December came at home against preseason favorite Old Dominion, and the Blue Hens took advantage of the opportunity with a 75-67 win over the Monarchs.

Delaware equaled that feat this season, defeating CAA preseason favorite Drexel last Saturday, 71-60, at the Carpenter Center.

Hens Light Up Scoreboard vs. Drexel

Drexel entered last Saturday's game leading the CAA by allowing just 55.8 points per game, and the Dragons had not allowed more than 62 points through their first five games. However the Blue Hens scored 71 against Drexel, shooting 46.0 percent (23-50) from the field.

Saddler Leads UD in First Six Games

Devon Saddler led Delaware in scoring during each of the first six games of the season. Jawan Carter was the last Blue Hen to accomplish that feat, as he led UD in eight consecutive games from January 23 through February 16, 2010.

The last Blue Hen to lead UD in scoring in each of the first six games of a season was current assistant coach Mike Pegues, who paced Delaware in the first six games of the 1999-2000 campaign.

Saddler had reached the 20-point mark in five consecutive games, the first Blue Hen to reach 20 points in five straight since Carter from January 23 through February 8, 2010.

However both streaks were snapped Wednesday at Penn, as Saddler was limited to just six points.

Hens Improve to 3-0 at Home Again

Following wins over Cornell, Lafayette, and Drexel, the Blue Hens have started the season 3-0 at home for the second straight year. Conversely, UD is 0-4 away from the Carpenter Center the season.

Hagins Dominant on Glass

Jamelle Hagins has grabbed at least seven rebounds during all seven games this season, and has reached double figures in the last four against Lafayette (14), Boston University (12), Drexel (12), and Penn (11). He currently leads the CAA with 10.4 rebounds per game and 7.7 defensive rebounds per game, and is eighth with 2.7 offensive boards per game.

Through Wednesday's games, Hagins was tied for 18th in the nation with 10.4 rebounds per game.

Brinkley Picking Up Scoring

After scoring 15 total points through the first four games of the season, junior forward Josh Brinkley recorded 31 points during the Blue Hens' last three games, averaging 10.3 points in that span.

Brinkley reached double figures for the first time this season by scoring a season-high 12 points on 4 of 8 shooting from the field at BU, while also grabbing six rebounds and blocking two shots. He added nine points and four boards during the win over Drexel, and again reached double digits with 10 points at Penn.

Saddler Ranks 10th in Division I in Scoring

Following his six-point performance at Penn, sophomore guard Devon Saddler dropped from second to 10th on the NCAA Division I scoring list.

Hagins Holds Block Party

Jamelle Hagins blocked a season-high five shots at Boston University, and currently ranks second in the CAA with 2.1 blocks per game.

Hagins had blocked a shot in 19 consecutive games, the third longest streak in school history, through the Radford game but did not block a shot against either Villanova or Cornell. John Bennett blocked a shot in 32 straight games in 1998-99, while Spencer Dunkley had a block in 27 straight from 1991-93.

Lewis Coming On Strong

After scoring just two points in each of the first two games this season, Khalid Lewis is averaging 8.0 points over the last five contests. He reached double figures for the first time in his career by scoring 10 points at Penn, and also handed out a season-best seven assists versus the Quakers. Lewis currently ranks sixth in the CAA with a 1.4 assist/turnover ratio, seventh with 3.4 assists per game, and tied for ninth with 33.6 minutes played per game.

The Blue Hens' home game versus Old Dominion on January 11 will be shown by WSKY in Hampton Roads, Va., while the road games at Villanova on November 18 and at George Mason on January 18 will be available online at ESPN3.com.

Additionally, The Comcast Network will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games and both semifinal games, while ESPN will broadcast the conference championship game.

McNeil Producing Off Bench For Blue Hens

Kelvin McNeil has grabbed at least five rebounds during all seven games this season. He currently ranks 14th in the CAA with 4.1 defensive rebounds per game and is 16th with 6.0 rebounds per game.

McNeil is also averaging 3.7 points per game, and scored a season-high nine during the win over Lafayette.

Saddler Sets Career-High vs. Lafayette

Devon Saddler scored a career-high 32 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette on November 26. The sophomore guard went 11 of 22 from the field, hit three 3-pointers, and finished 7 of 8 from the free throw line.

Saddler's 32 points are the most by a Blue Hen since Jawan Carter scored 35 during a 97-94 double overtime win at Penn on November 21, 2009.

Anderson Immediately Produces For Hens

After sitting out the season opener at Radford, Kyle Anderson scored 12 points at Villanova and added 11 versus Cornell. He then scored a season-high 16 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette, and went 4 of 5 from three-point range. Anderson is believed to be the first true freshman in school history to reach double figures in each of his first three collegiate games.

Anderson Clutch From Long Distance

Delaware led Cornell by one point late in the contest, but Kyle Anderson buried a three-pointer to make it a 62-58 game with 1:23 remaining. In their next game the Blue Hens were tied with Lafayette, 75-75, but Anderson drilled a go-ahead three-pointer with 30 seconds on the clock. Both treys were assisted by Devon Saddler.

Anderson currently ranks second in the CAA with 2.7 three-pointers made per game and is 11th with a 37.2 three-point percentage.

Saddler, Anderson Earn CAA Weekly Honors

Devon Saddler was named the CAA Co-Player of the Week while Kyle Anderson earned CAA Rookie of the Week honors on November 28 after the backcourt duo led the Blue Hens to a pair of wins over Cornell and Lafayette.

Saddler averaged 26.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists on the week, and scored a career-high 32 points against Lafayette. Anderson added 13.5 points and went 7 of 12 from three-point range, and hit a crucial three-pointer late in each of the Blue Hen victories.

Hens Find Shooting Touch vs. Lafayette

Delaware shot a season-high 53.6 percent against Lafayette, going 30 of 56 from the field. That is the Blue Hens' highest percentage since shooting 57.4 percent at Delaware State on December 1, 2009.

Delaware Wins Home Opener

Following the victory over Cornell, Delaware is now 14-6 in home openers at the BCC. The Blue Hens had dropped four consecutive home openers, but defeated Howard, 66-34, last season before the win over the Big Red.

Hens Fire Away From Deep At Villanova

Delaware attempted 32 three-pointers at Villanova (making 10), tied for the sixth most attempts in a game in Delaware history. Kyle Anderson was 4 of 9 from behind the arc, while Devon Saddler finished 3 of 10 and Jarvis Threatt was 3 of 9.

Clyburn Suspended Indefinitely

Prior to the season opener sophomore Kaleb Clyburn was suspended indefinitely due to a violation of team rules. Clyburn appeared in 17 games a year ago, contributing 13 points and seven assists.

King-Davis Likely To Redshirt Season

With four experienced players in the Delaware frontcourt, Blue Hen freshman forward Marvin King-Davis is expected to sit out this season as a redshirt. King-Davis was a first team All-District, first team All-Region, second team All-Metro, and second team All-State selection as a senior at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Threatt, Lewis Start in Debuts

Freshmen Jarvis Threatt and Khalid Lewis each started their Blue Hen debuts, becoming the seventh and eighth true freshmen to start their first collegiate game under head coach Monté Ross.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started the 2009 opener, while Devon Saddler started last year's opener.

This year featured the fifth time in Monté Ross' six seasons that his season-opening starting lineup included a true freshman.

Blue Hen Captains

Junior forwards Jamelle Hagins and Kelvin McNeil, along with sophomore guard Devon Saddler, have been named Blue Hen captains for the 2011-12 season. Saddler is the first sophomore to be named team captain since Mike Slattery in the 2002-03 season.

Jawan Carter Signs With Turkish Club

Former Delaware standout guard Jawan Carter signed with Darussafaka Cooper Tires of the Turkish basketball league's second division in early November. Carter was a third team All-CAA selection for the Blue Hens last season when he led the squad by averaging 16.0 points per game.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 634 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made at least one three-pointer in all but five games since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in the 1986-87 season.

Hens Picked Seventh in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware was picked seventh in the CAA Preseason Poll announced October 18 at the league's Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row Restaurant in Arlington, Va.

Head Coach Monté Ross

Sixth Season at Delaware • Winston-Salem State '92 • 56-107 Record

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of

Delaware men's basketball history and begins his sixth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2011-12. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district. The following season, the Blue Hens posted a record of 7-24, including wins over America East champion Vermont and Patriot League runner-up Lafayette.

Delaware posted a seven-win improvement during last year, going 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA with an 8-10 league mark. The Blue Hens won five straight games early in the campaign, including an impressive home victory over eventual league champion Old Dominion. Delaware advanced to the CAA Tournament Quarterfinals following a victory over Northeastern in the first round, while freshman Devon Saddler was named the league's Rookie of the Year.

Ross, 41, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University for 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He

knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 12, and daughter, Lauren, 10.

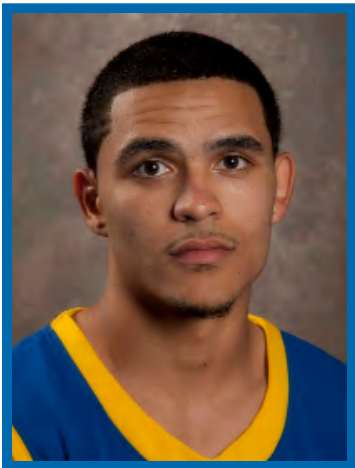

Travis Robinson, who entered the game averaging just 3.0 points per contest, erupted for a career-high 16 as he went 5 of 5 from the field while knocking down all four of his three-point attempts...D.J.
