The Series...

Delaware leads the all-time series with Drexel, 73-69, as the Blue Hens have faced the Dragons more than any other school. Drexel is 41-22 against Delaware in Philadelphia, and the Dragons have won nine of the last 10 meetings at the Daskalakis Center including each of the previous two years. Delaware and Drexel have split the two regular season meetings in each of the last three seasons.

Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. Last Time Out

Delaware fell behind by a point with 12 minutes remaining but responded with a 14-2 spurt to pull away from William & Mary and post a 61-48 victory over the Tribe Wednesday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Jamelle Hagins had a big game inside for the Blue Hens by grabbing a career-best 17 rebounds and tying his career-high with seven blocked shots. Jawan Carter added 16 points for Delaware, while Devon Saddler chipped in 13 and Alphonso Dawson contributed 10.

Marcus Kitts was the lone double figure scorer for the Tribe with 11 points while JohnMark Ludwick added nine for William & Mary, which dropped its fifth straight game.

William & Mary made 5 of 10 three-pointers in the first half but Delaware, which entered the week ranked third in Division I in three-point field goal percentage defense, limited the Tribe to just 8 of 26 overall shooting in the second period including 2 of 12 from behind the arc. Tribe guard Quinn McDowell, who entered the game ranked seventh in the league with 15.3 points per game, was held to just seven points on 3 of 10 shooting from the field.

Led by Carter's 12 points in the opening period, Delaware scored its most first half points of the season while taking a 34-26 advantage into the break. However the Blue Hens would struggle over the first eight minutes of the second half, hitting just 2 of their first 12 shot attempts as the Tribe clawed back.

A layup by Saddler put Delaware in front 38-30 with 14:25 to play but William & Mary responded with a 9-0 run, taking its first lead of the period on two free throws by Julian Boatner at the 11:51 mark.

But the Blue Hens would take over from there, as a foul line jumper by Dawson ignited the 14-2 spurt that put Delaware in control. Carter followed with two free throws, and after a baseline jumper by Brian Johnson, Kelvin McNeil added a pair at the charity stripe to make it a 46-39 game with 9:29 to play. Brandon Britt countered with two free throws for the Tribe, but Johnson and Dawson each connected from three-point range on the Blue Hens' next two possessions to extend the margin to double figures.

Britt and Kitts each scored as William & Mary pulled within 52-45 with five and a half minutes remaining, but Saddler hit one free throw and Hagins scored inside as Delaware went back up double

digits. A three-pointer by McDowell made it a 55-48 game with 2:33 on the clock but the Tribe would not score again, as a layup by Hagins and a pair of free throws by Carter and Dawson closed the scoring.

Delaware shot just 19 of 47 from the field for a 40.4 percentage, but held the Tribe to a 33.3 percentage (18 of 54) and held a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage.

The Blue Hens used an early 8-0 run, culminated with consecutive three-pointers by Carter, to take a 14-9 advantage with 13:24 left in the opening half. William & Mary battled back to go ahead 24-22 on a free throw by Kitts but Delaware answered with a 10-0 spurt, including five straight points by Saddler, to take an eight point lead into the break.

Delaware vs. Drexel Last Meeting

Delaware pulled within two points with 10:44 remaining but the Blue Hens missed their next 13 field goal attempts, allowing Drexel to pull away late for a 68-60 victory over the Blue Hens at the Daskalakis Center on February 13, 2010.

Drexel led by just a pair at 52-50 following a bucket inside by Delaware's Adam Pegg.

However Delaware went scoreless over the next four minutes, and baskets by Kevin Phillip and Samme Givens put Drexel back up six at 56-50 with seven minutes to play. Pegg hit two free throws for the Blue Hens, but Givens scored twice inside to extend the Dragons' margin to 60-52 with 4:51 to go.

Delaware would answer, as D.J. Boney nailed two foul shots and Jawan Carter followed with a pair from the charity stripe to bring Delaware within 60-56 at the 3:32 mark. Gerald Colds made one free throw for Drexel but Carter scored on a layup, the first Blue Hens' first field goal in over nine minutes, to make it a 61-58 game with 1:24 left.

However Phillip tipped in a miss by Colds with a minute left, and Boney missed a three-pointer at the other end. Colds then hit two free throws with 35 seconds to play, while Harris added a pair 13 seconds later and Thomas hit one with 11 seconds left to put the game away.

Harris finished with a game-high 21 points for Drexel, which played without injured starter Chris Fouch. Gerald Colds added 13 points for the Dragons.

Delaware got 14 points, six rebounds and six assists from Carter. Alphonso Dawson chipped in 13 points for the Blue Hens, while Jamelle Hagins added 10 points and a team-high seven rebounds.

Delaware opened the game with six consecutive points, as Dawson twice found Hagins for dunks, but Drexel responded to take a 10-9 lead on a Harris three-pointer at the 13:16 mark.

The Blue Hens answered with two free throws by Hagins and a three-pointer by Dawson, and the teams took turns regaining the advantage over the next seven minutes. Boney hit two free throws and Edwin Santiago drained a three-pointer as Delaware went up 28-24 at the 3:18 mark, but Harris scored six consecutive points to put Drexel back on top.

Malcolm Hawkins hit four free throws in between a basket by the Dragons' Evan Neisler to knot the game again, but Harris drained a three-pointer from the top of the key with three seconds left to give Drexel a 35-32 halftime lead.

Drexel opened the second half with two free throws by Leon Spencer and a basket by Colds to go up seven, and a three-pointer by Harris increased the Dragons' lead to 44-36 with 16:38 remaining.

Drexel was still up eight at 51-43, but Dawson hit a three-pointer and Hagins connected from 16 feet to pull Delaware within 51-48 at the 11:44 mark. Colds answered with a free throw for the Dragons and Pegg scored inside to make it a two-point game with 10:41 remaining, but the Blue Hens would go cold from the field from there.



Blue Hen Injury Report

Junior forward Hakim McCullar has missed the last three games with a broken bone in his right leg and is out indefinitely. He saw a specialist on Wednesday and will be reevaluated in two weeks.

Sophomore guard Malcolm Hawkins suffered a spinal cord contusion during the George Mason game. He was admitted to the Christiana Hospital on Tuesday with weakness and altered sensation in his upper extremities.

On Wednesday Hawkins had less tingling in his arms and hands, as well as improved strength. Hawkins, who suffered no bony damage to his spine, continued to improve on Thursday and is expected to be discharged in a neck brace either Friday or Saturday.

Delaware Matches 2009-10 Win Total

By winning Wednesday's game against William & Mary, Delaware improved to 7-6 and equaled its win total from the 2009-10 season when UD finished 7-24. The Blue Hens are one of 10 Division I teams to equal or surpass their win total from a year ago, along with Air Force, Albany, Fordham, Marist, Rice, Tulane, Arkansas Little Rock, Tennessee-Martin, and Wagner.

Hagins Records Monster Game vs. Tribe

Jamelle Hagins was a force inside against William & Mary, grabbing a career-high 17 rebounds and tying his career-best with seven blocked shots. He also scored nine points for the Blue Hens, narrowly missing his second consecutive double-double.

Hagins' 17 boards were the most by a Blue Hen since Marc Egerson also grabbed 17 against Towson exactly two years prior on January 5, 2009.

Hagins Posts Second Double-Double at Mason

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his second double-double of the season by notching 15 points and 10 rebounds at George Mason. Hagins recorded 13 points and 10 boards during the season opener at Ohio University.

Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

Saddler Hands Out 10 Assists at Mason

Freshman Devon Saddler dished out a season-high 10 assists during Monday's game at George Mason. The last time a Blue Hen reached double figures in assists was on January 5, 2008 when Brian Johnson handed out 11 assists at Drexel.

Blue Hens CAA Road Struggles Continue

Delaware's loss at George Mason on Monday was the Blue Hens' 21st straight Colonial Athletic Association road loss.

UD posted a 51-48 win at Georgia State on February 13, 2008, but dropped its final two CAA road games that season. The Blue Hens then went 0-9 on the road in the league during each of the last two seasons, before Monday's CAA road opener this year.

Dawson Heating Up For Blue Hens

After scoring 11 points in the season opener at Ohio University, Alphonso Dawson did not reach double figures in any of the next five games.

But the senior guard has scored in double digits in five of the last seven contests, averaging 12.0 points in that span. Dawson has gone 10 of 18 from behind the arc in the last three games, and scored a season-high 20 points Monday at George Mason.

Carter Reaches 20-Point Mark Again

Jawan Carter scored 20 points at George Mason, the sixth time this season he has reached the 20-point mark. After scoring just seven total points in the first two games of the season, Carter has reached double figures in 10 of the last 11 contests. Alphonso Dawson, who scored 20 points Monday at George Mason, is the only other Blue Hen to reach the 20-point mark in a game this year.

Blue Hens Playing Well Defensively

Delaware currently ranks second in the CAA with a 40.1 field goal percentage defense, 4.7 blocked shots per game, and a 27.2 three-point percentage defense.

Through Thursday's games, UD ranked seventh in Division I in three-point field goal defense, 55th in blocked shots per game, and 64th in field goal percentage defense.

Delaware had allowed two straight opponents to shoot over 50 percent, but rebounded to hold William & Mary to 33.3 percent shooting on Wednesday.

Brinkley Shines in First Start

Sophomore Josh Brinkley made his first career start against American, scoring 10 points and grabbing four rebounds in 29 minutes of action. Brinkley went a perfect 4 of 4 from the field and also dished out two assists versus the Eagles.

Hagins, Hawkins Earn Cable Car Classic Honors

Jamelle Hagins was named to the Cable Car Classic All-Tournament Team, while Malcolm Hawkins earned the tournament's Sixth Man Award.

Hagins posted seven points and eight rebounds during the win over Santa Clara, and tied his season-high with 17 points to go with a team-leading eight boards against American.

Hawkins scored four points while grabbing a career-high 10 rebounds versus Santa Clara, while his blocked shot of the Broncos' Raymond Cowels III just before the final buzzer sealed the win for the Blue Hens.

Tale of Two Games in California

Delaware shot just 38.3 percent against Santa Clara, but the Blue Hens pulled out the victory by holding the Broncos to only 28.8 percent for the game.

However the following night's game against American was a different story. The Blue Hens shot 52.2 percent from the field but allowed the Eagles to shoot 57.1 percent, the highest by a UD opponent this season.

Delaware's field goal percentage against American was its highest since shooting 57.4 percent on December 1, 2009 at Delaware State - ironically, the Blue Hens lost both of those games.

Defense is the Key

When Delaware allows 67 points or fewer, the Blue Hens are 7-0 this season. Conversely when UD gives up 75 points or more, the Hens are 0-6. Delaware is allowing an average of 52.7 points in its seven wins and 79.5 points during its six losses.

For the seventh straight season all University of Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on FM radio. Almost all games will be carried on 94.7 WDSB. Mike Corey (play-by-play) and Glenn Frazer (color) will call the action.

Additionally, most Blue Hen men's basketball games are broadcast by the UD student radio station, WVUD 91.3 FM. Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through the UD athletics website.

Delaware Basketball on Television

Delaware will have six televised regular season games during 2010-11. The Blue Hens will play at George Mason on January 3 at 7 p.m. on Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic, Comcast SportsNet New England, The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast, while UD's contest at Drexel on January 8 at 4 p.m. will be televised by The Comcast Network and Comcast SportsNet New England.

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

Additionally, Delaware's game at Villanova on December 18 at 7:30 p.m. will be available online at ESPN3.com.

Hagins Holds His Own vs. Nova Frontline

Jamelle Hagins posted an impressive effort at Villanova by scoring 12 points, grabbing eight rebounds and blocking a career-high seven shots.

The last player to record at least 10 points, eight rebounds and seven blocks against Villanova was Georgetown's Jeff Green, a current starter for the Oklahoma City Thunder, on February 17, 2007.

Brinkley Sets Career-High at Hampton

Josh Brinkley set his career-high by scoring 18 points in the victory at Hampton. Brinkley, who went 6 of 10 from both the field and the foul line, added a season-high seven rebounds against the Pirates.

Brinkley scored four the Blue Hens' final five field goals, including a jumper in the paint with 52 seconds left that gave Delaware the lead for good.

Brinkley then added 13 points during the victory over Delaware State, marking the first time in his career that he reached double figures in consecutive games.

Brinkley reached double figures three times last season but has already scored in double digits four times this year.

Blue Hens Lock Down Opponents Late

Hampton's Mike Tuit hit a jumper with 10:43 remaining to put the Pirates ahead 44-37, but the Blue Hens would not allow a field goal the rest of the way.

Delaware limited Hampton to 0 of 4 shooting from the field and forced five turnovers in that stretch, while the Pirates hurt themselves by hitting just 9 of 17 free throw attempts.

The following game the Blue Hens trailed Delaware State by 11 points midway through the second half, but closed the game on a 27-5 run to pull away. The Hornets did not score a point during the final five minutes of the game and recorded only two field goals in 14 attempts over the final 13 minutes.

Carter Named CAA Co-Player of the Week

Jawan Carter was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on December 6 following his outstanding performance during the Blue Hens' win over Old Dominion on December 4.

Carter scored a game-high 29 points to lead Delaware to the 75-67 triumph over the Monarchs, the CAA defending champion and this year's preseason favorite. He went 6 of 12 from the field, all from behind the arc, and dished out a game-best four assists as the Blue Hens won their conference opener. Carter also went 11 of 15 from the free throw line, including 7 of 8 in the final 52 seconds to hold off Old Dominion, which was receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 polls.

The Blue Hens, who led the entire second half, built an 11-point cushion with 8:35 to play, but the Monarchs rallied for nine consecutive points to pull within 56-54 with 5:24 remaining. But after Hakim McCullar hit one free throw, Carter found Devon Saddler for a jumper and on the Blue Hens' next possession drilled a deep three-pointer to extend UD's advantage to 62-54 with 3:31 to play. The Monarchs cut the deficit to five three times in the final minute, but Delaware went 9 of 10 from the line, all but two from Carter, to ice the victory.

Carter Clutch From Foul Line Late in Games

Jawan Carter went a perfect 12 of 12 from the free throw line at Lafayette, including hitting all six of his attempts in the final 32 seconds to seal the victory.

The last time a Blue Hen took that many free throw attempts without missing was when Kestutis Marculionis went 13 of 13 during a 99-91 overtime victory over Drexel at the BCC on January 27, 1999.

Carter then went 11 of 15 from the charity stripe versus Old Dominion, including seven of eight in the final 52 seconds to hold off the Monarchs.

Carter went to the foul line with nine seconds left and the Blue Hens clinging to a one-point lead at Hampton, and he went 1 of 2 to put Delaware up a pair.

Brian Johnson Returns To UD Lineup

Brian Johnson, who missed all of last season with an ACL injury and the first three games of this year after suffering a torn meniscus in the preseason, finally returned to the court during Delaware's game at Lafayette.

Johnson came off the bench to snap his school-record streak of 94 consecutive starts - every game he had appeared in during his first three years. He contributed five points and a rebound in 16 minutes of action against the Leopards. Johnson recorded his best game of the year against Delaware State, contributing four points and four assists while not turning the ball over in 22 minutes. He added a season-high seven assists against Penn on December 22.

Carter, Hagins Among Nation's Leaders

Through Thursday's games, Jamelle Hagins ranked fourth in Division I with 3.6 blocked shots per game while Jawan Carter was 17th with 3.0 three-pointers made per game.

Notes From the Howard Victory

- UD head coach Monté Ross won for the first time in his five home openers.
- Delaware's 34 points allowed was its fewest since a 69-32 victory over Ursinus on December 21, 1961.
- The 32-point victory was the Blue Hens' largest since a 75-40 win over James Madison on January 15, 2005.
- Delaware led 33-16 at the break, its largest halftime lead since taking a 33-15 cushion at Vermont on December 19, 2007.
- Jawan Carter made eight three-pointers, tying the school record set by Billy Wells against Hartford on February 24, 2000. Carter's 14 three-pointers attempted set a UD single game record.
- Howard's 12 field goals made and 20.0 percent shooting are both the lowest by a Blue Hen opponent since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.
- Delaware blocked 12 shots, its most since also swatting 12 against Siena on December 23, 2003.

Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut against Ohio University for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive



game at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field, and he added a season-high eight assists versus Howard.

Saddler scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds while playing a game-high 37 minutes during his first CAA game against Old Dominion, while he added a season-high 10 assists during his second conference game Monday at George Mason.

Hagins A Force Inside For Delaware

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins is having an impressive season for the Blue Hens, leading the team with 8.7 rebounds per game and 47 blocks while ranking second with 10.5 points per game.

Hagins currently leads the CAA and ranks fourth in Division I with 3.6 blocks per game. He also ranks tied for first in the conference with 6.8 defensive rebounds per game, fourth with 8.7 boards per contest, and eighth with a 53.3 field goal percentage.

Dawson Joins 1,200-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,279 career points, grabbed five rebounds against Howard to reach the 500-rebound career mark. He is just the ninth player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,200 career points and 500 career rebounds.

The others are Mike Pegues, Greg Smith, Mark Murray, Alex Coles, Harding Nana, Herb Courtney, Dave Sysko, and Anthony Wright.

Johnson Brings Experience To PG Spot

UD senior Brian Johnson brings a wealth of experience to the point guard position for the Blue Hens. Johnson has started all 94 games of his first three seasons, the fourth most by a point guard in Division I entering the season.

A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Alphonso Dawson (1,279 points) and Jawan Carter (1,257 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 943 career points, just 57 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

UD Returns Majority of Scoring

Delaware returns its top seven scorers from a year ago and every player except Adam Pegg, who transferred to Stetson in the offseason after averaging 5.0 points and 2.6 rebounds per game.

The Blue Hens return 92.1 percent of their scoring from a year ago and 92.5 percent of their rebounding. Those numbers do not factor in the return of Brian Johnson, who averaged 10.0 points and 2.5 rebounds during the 2008-09 season.

UD Signs Five To NLI's in Early Signing Period

Kyle Anderson, Marvin King-Davis, Khalid Lewis-El, Larry Savage and Jarvis Threatt each signed during the early signing period in November and comprise the Blue Hens' class of 2015.

Anderson, a 6-2 shooting guard, averaged 20.8 points per game last season at Newark Community (Ill.) High School and entered his senior season ranked third on the school's career list with 1,615 points.

King-Davis, a 6-7 forward, was an All-District and All-Region selection as a junior in 2009-10. He averaged 13.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game a year ago at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Lewis-El, a 6-3 guard, led Trenton Catholic to a 28-3 record and the New Jersey Tournament of Champions title last season. He posted 15 points and five rebounds during a 57-56 triple overtime win over nationally-ranked St. Anthony's in the New Jersey Non-Public B championship.

Savage, a 6-5 small forward, was an All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference honoree a year ago for Bishop O'Connell (Va.) High School. He averaged 12 points and six rebounds per game for the Knights in 2009-10.

Threatt, a 6-1 guard, was also an All-District and All-Region honoree last season at Highland Springs High School in Richmond. He averaged 19.6 points, 2.6 assists and 3.0 steals during his junior year.

Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching

Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England and Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.
