## Gameday Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

## Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

## CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 and running through February 28. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. ## Last Time Out

Jawan Carter drilled a three-pointer from the right wing at the buzzer as Delaware continued its last-second winning ways by posting a 64-62 victory over Georgia State Saturday afternoon at the GSU Sports Arena.

Delaware (10-8, 5-3) won its third straight conference game for the first time since a 5-0 league start in the 2007-08 season. The Blue Hens, who had lost 23 straight CAA road games prior to last Saturday's 66-63 win at Towson on a last-second three-pointer by Devon Saddler, posted their fifth road victory of the season.

Georgia State (8-10, 3-5) dropped its fourth consecutive game and lost for the first time in four league home games.

Saddler led a balanced Blue Hen effort with 17 points and five assists while Carter finished with 15 points, all but two in the second half. D.J. Boney added a season-high 11 points for Delaware, while Kelvin McNeil added season-bests of 10 points and nine boards.

Eric Buckner scored a game-high 18 points for Georgia State, while Jihad Ali added 16 points. Brandon McGee was the third Panther in double figures as he finished with 11 points and eight rebounds.

Delaware trailed by a point with 12.5 seconds to play. Saddler drove the right side of the lane before kicking the ball to Carter on the right wing.

The senior guard took a dribble to the left and lofted a contested three-pointer just before the final horn, while his shot bounced off the front rim, glanced softly off the glass and dropped clean through the net before Carter was mobbed by his teammates.

Delaware, which took a 35-25 lead into the break, used an early 5-0 spurt in the second period on a three-point play by Josh Brinkley and a fastbreak layup by Saddler to make it a 42-28 game. However the Panthers countered with six consecutive points to close to within eight on an Ali three-pointer at the 15:53 mark.

Saddler answered for the Blue Hens but Georgia State would continue to rally, and a 9-0 Panthers run gave GSU a 47-46 lead with 10:46 left on a transition layup by Fields.

However Carter would answer for the Blue Hens, hitting a jumper and a long three-pointer to put UD back in front 51-47 with 9:25 to play. Then after Georgia State scored six unanswered points, Carter's off-balance triple from the right corner gave Delaware a

54-53 lead with six minutes left.

McGee then hit a pair of free throws, but McNeil's follow of a Brian Johnson miss put Delaware back up 56-55 at the 4:26 mark. Carter added a pair of free throws to make it a three-point game, but Ali drained a three-pointer with 2:54 remaining to knot the contest again at 58-58.

Saddler then hit two free throws, but Javonte Maynor answered with a contested jumper as the game was tied at 60-60 with 2:06 to play. Following a Delaware turnover, McGee hit an off-balance 20-footer with the shot clock winding down as the Panthers went back up a pair with 55 seconds left.

Saddler then hit one free throw with 24 seconds on the clock, and after Ali lost the ball out of bounds on a drive, the Blue Hens took advantage on Carter's game-winning three-pointer.

The Blue Hens shot 43.1 percent for the game including 52.9 percent from behind the arc, and tied their season-high by draining nine three-point attempts. Delaware limited Georgia State to 40.8 percent shooting while holding Dante Curry, who entered the game leading the Panthers with 10.5 points per game, to zero points.

Ali scored first two baskets of the game but the Blue Hens answered with eight consecutive points, including six straight by Boney, to grab an early 8-4 lead four minutes into the contest. It was a 10-8 game following a basket by Ali, but consecutive three-pointers by Saddler and Boney extended Delaware's margin to 16-8 with 12:11 remaining in the half.

A three-point play by Buckner pulled the Panthers within 18-13, but Alphonso Dawson drilled a three-pointer and Carter connected from 18 feet as the Blue Hens went up 10 at the 8:03 mark.

The Panthers battled back to within 25-21 but the Blue Hens would use a 10-2 spurt, ignited by a Johnson three-pointer and a pair of baskets by McNeil, to take their largest advantage of the half at 35-23 in the final minute. Georgia State's Marques Johnson drained a jumper to close the first half scoring but the Blue Hens still took their second double figure halftime lead of the season.

## Delaware vs. George Mason Last Meeting

Ryan Pearson led four George Mason scorers in double figures by scoring 19 points as the Patriots used a balanced attack to defeat Delaware, 75-66, on January 3 at the Patriot Center.

Mason moved to 7-0 at home and defeated Delaware for the ninth straight season in Fairfax. Luck Hancock added 17 points and a team-leading seven rebounds for the Patriots, while Isaiah Tate contributed 12 points and Cam Long poured in 11.

The Blue Hens got 20 points apiece from senior guards Alphonso Dawson and Jawan Carter. Dawson hit four three-pointers for the second consecutive game en route to posting his season-high for points, while Carter reached the 20-point mark for the sixth time on the year.

Jamelle Hagins recorded his second double-double of the season with 15 points and 10 rebounds, while Devon Saddler handed out a career-high 10 assists on the night.

The Blue Hens received a scare with 3:16 left in the first half when sophomore Malcolm Hawkins went down awkwardly after battling for a rebound, and he was taken off the floor on a backboard. Hawkins was taken to a local hospital for x-rays.

Mason shot 56.5 percent from the field, the second straight Blue Hen opponent to shot over 50 percent field the floor, and connected on 13 of 19 field goal attempts in the second half.

The Patriots led 33-28 at the break and increased the margin to seven early in the second half, but Carter and Saddler each found Hagins for emphatic dunks as Delaware closed to within 44-41 at the 12:21 mark.

A Hagins jumphook in the paint made it a 47-45 game two minutes later, but Mason countered with a 10-0 run, culminated by a Hancock three-pointer, to take its largest margin of the night at 57-45 with 7:31 to play.

Delaware would answer, as Dawson drilled a triple from the top of the key and, after getting fouled on a three-point attempt, Carter drained all three foul shots to make it a 57-51 game at the 5:36 mark.



However Hancock responded with a jumper, Mike Morrison recorded a dunk, and Long hit a free throw to increase the Mason advantage back to 11 with 3:26 remaining.

Delaware twice pulled within seven twice late, the second time on a Carter three-pointer with 1:12 left, but the Blue Hens would not get closer.

Mason took an early 8-2 lead in the contest but Delaware answered with a 9-0 spurt, capped with a three-point play by Brian Johnson, to go up 11-8 at the 11:53 mark.

The Blue Hens were still up a point following a three-pointer by Dawson, but Long and Tate each answered from behind the arc to put the Patriots back in front 26-21 with 4:28 left in the half.

Mason took its largest advantage of the period when Long connected from long range, before Dawson drained a shot from just inside the arc to make it a 33-28 game at the break.

### Blue Hen Injury Report

Junior forward Hakim McCullar has missed the last eight games with a broken bone in his right leg. He saw a specialist on Wednesday, January 19 and is expected to return within the next 2-3 weeks.

Sophomore guard Malcolm Hawkins suffered a spinal cord contusion during the George Mason game on Monday, January 3. He was admitted to the Christiana Hospital the following day with weakness and altered sensation in his upper extremities.

Hawkins, who suffered no bony damage to his spine, was discharged from Christiana Hospital on January 7. He will wear a neck brace for the next 1-2 weeks.

### Delaware Back Over .500 Mark

With its three-game winning streak, Delaware now has a 10-8 record this season. This year marks the first time the Blue Hens have a winning record through 18 games since the 2003-04 squad was also 10-8.

UD's 5-3 start in the CAA is its best since the 2007-08 squad was 6-2 through eight games. This year marks just the third time in the Blue Hens' 10 years in the conference that UD has started 5-3 or better in CAA games (UD also began 5-3 in 2002-03).

### Cardiac Kids

Delaware has won three straight games, all decided in the final seconds. On January 15 the Blue Hens were tied at Towson, 63-63, when Devon Saddler drilled a three-pointer at the buzzer to give UD the victory.

Last Wednesday UD was tied with Northeastern when Brian Johnson found Jamelle Hagins for the go-ahead dunk with 21 seconds left. Hagins then blocked a shot attempt by the Huskies' Alex Harris with nine seconds to go, while Chaiison Allen's shot with one second on the clock was off the mark as Delaware hung on, 54-52.

On Saturday the Blue Hens trailed Georgia State by a point in the final seconds, but Jawan Carter hit a three-pointer at the buzzer as Delaware pulled out a 64-62 victory in Atlanta.

### A CAA Winning Streak...

Delaware has won three straight CAA games for the first time since the Blue Hens began the 2007-08 season with five consecutive league wins. By winning at Towson and Georgia State, UD has won two straight CAA road games for the first time since a 58-51 win at William & Mary on January 2, 2008 and a 67-63 triumph at Drexel three days later.

### Boney, McNeil Post Season-Highs at Georgia State

D.J. Boney scored a season-high 11 points while playing a season-best 35 minutes Saturday at Georgia State.

Kelvin McNeil, who had reached his season-high by scoring nine points during Wednesday's win over Northeastern, scored 10 points Saturday against Georgia State. McNeil, who went 5 of 6 from the

field, also grabbed a season-best nine rebounds against the Panthers, narrowly missing his third career double-double.

### Hagins Posts Career-High Blocks vs. Huskies

Jamelle Hagins blocked a career-high eight shots, one shy of the UD school record, during Wednesday's 54-52 win over Northeastern. Hagins' final block came on an Alex Harris attempt with nine seconds left that would have tied the game. Hagins, who blocked seven shots in three previous games this season, entered this weekend's action ranked third in Division I with 3.8 blocks per game.

Ndongo Nidaye holds the UD record with nine blocks against Colgate on December 2, 1999, while Hagins is now one of six players to post eight blocks in a game.

### Taking Care of the Ball vs. Northeastern

Delaware committed just three turnovers Wednesday against Northeastern, the lowest by the Blue Hens since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.

### Comeback Kids

Delaware trailed Towson 57-48 with 6:34 remaining on January 15, but the Blue Hens closed the game with an 18-6 run, culminated with Devon Saddler's three-pointer at the buzzer.

UD was down 48-38 to Northeastern with 7:50 to play on Wednesday before coming back to post the 54-52 win. The Huskies still led 52-45 with 4:21 remaining following a Kauri Black layup, but Delaware would score the final nine points from there, including Jamelle Hagins' game-winning dunk with 21 seconds left.

### Saddler Named CAA Co-Rookie of the Week

Devon Saddler earned CAA Rookie of the Week Honors last Monday, two days after his buzzer-beating three-pointer gave Delaware a dramatic victory at Towson.

Saddler averaged 13 points, three rebounds and three assists while shooting 54.5 percent from the field during the Blue Hens' two games on the week, a 76-53 setback at UNC Wilmington and the 66-63 triumph over the Tigers.

Saddler tied his season-high by leading the Blue Hens with 19 points against the Seahawks, going 8 of 15 from the field to go with four rebounds and two assists. Delaware then trailed Towson by nine points with six and a half minutes left but Saddler took over from there, scoring 11 of his 13 points the rest of the way.

Saddler began the comeback with a three-point play, and he hit a step-back jumper on UD's next possession to make it a 57-53 game with 5:50 remaining. Delaware still trailed 59-54 but Saddler went 3 of 4 from the free throw line after fouling on consecutive possessions to pull the Blue Hens within two at the 3:22 mark.

The game was tied at 63-63 in the final seconds when UD senior guard Jawan Carter was double teamed at the top of the key. Carter then found Saddler on the right wing, and his three-point attempt just before the final buzzer swished clean through the net, setting off the Blue Hens' celebration.

### Blue Hens Snap CAA Road Losing Streak

Delaware's last second win at Towson snapped the Blue Hens' 23-game CAA road losing streak.

UD posted a 51-48 win at Georgia State on February 13, 2008, but dropped its final two CAA road games that season. The Blue Hens then went 0-9 on the road in the league during each of the last two

Delaware's home game against George Mason on January 24 at 9 p.m. will be produced by ESPN Regional and shown by MASN, while the home game versus James Madison on January 29 at 4 p.m. will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia, Mid-Atlantic and New England, as well as Charter Sports Southeast.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on February 5 at 8 p.m. on The Comcast Network, Comcast SportsNet New England and Charter Sports Southeast, while the regular season finale at Hofstra on February 26 at 2 p.m. will be shown by The Comcast Network, MSG, and Charter Sports Southeast.

The Comcast Network and Charter Sports Southeast will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games on Saturday, March 5, as well as both semifinal games the following day. The CAA Championship on Monday, March 7 at 7 p.m. will be shown live by either ESPN or ESPN2.

seasons, before falling at George Mason, Drexel and UNCW this year. UD has now won two straight CAA road games after Saturday's win at Georgia State.

**Delaware Shoots Well at Towson**

Delaware posted its highest shooting percentage of the season by connecting on 52.4 percent of its field goal attempts at Towson. The Blue Hens went 10 of 18 from the field in the second half and hit a season-high nine three-pointers, while their 60.0 three-point field goal percentage was also a season-best.

**Brinkley Posts Big Game at Towson**

Josh Brinkley scored nine points at Towson and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds, three higher than his previous mark for boards. Brinkley, who entered the season with just one blocked shot, swatted four at Towson while narrowly missing his first career double-double.

**Saddler Among CAA Freshman Leaders**

Entering this weekend's action, Devon Saddler led all CAA freshmen with 9.7 points per game, ranked second with 3.1 assists, and was fourth with 3.8 rebounds per contest.

**Hagins Takes Commanding CAA Blocks Lead**

Jamelle Hagins has blocked a CAA-best 65 shots this season, an average of 3.6 blocked shots per game. Greg Washington of Hofstra ranks second in the CAA with 37 blocks, 28 less than Hagins.

Hagins' 65 blocks are more than five conference teams, ahead of William & Mary (54), UNC Wilmington (53), Towson (51), Drexel (50) and Northeastern (48).

**Carter Moves Into 9th Place on UD Scoring List**

By scoring 19 points at Towson, senior guard Jawan Carter moved into ninth place on the Delaware career scoring list. Carter, who now has scored 1,339 points, passed Mike Ames to jump into ninth place on the chart. Carter is six points behind Harding Nana, who ranks eighth with 1,345 career points.

**Hagins Records Monster Game vs. Tribe**

Jamelle Hagins was a force inside against William & Mary, grabbing a career-high 17 rebounds and tying his career-best with seven blocked shots. He also scored nine points for the Blue Hens, narrowly missing his second consecutive double-double.

Hagins' 17 boards were the most by a Blue Hen since Marc Egerson also grabbed 17 against Towson exactly two years prior on January 5, 2009.

**Hagins Posts Second Double-Double at Mason**

Sophomore Jamelle Hagins posted his second double-double of the season by notching 15 points and 10 rebounds at George Mason on January 3. Hagins recorded 13 points and 10 boards during the season opener at Ohio University.

Hagins also notched double-doubles last season against Delaware State (18 points/13 rebounds) and Boston University (11 points/11 rebounds).

**Saddler Hands Out 10 Assists at Mason**

Freshman Devon Saddler dished out a season-high 10 assists during UD's game at George Mason on January 3. The last time a Blue Hen reached double figures in assists was on January 5, 2008 when Brian Johnson handed out 11 assists at Drexel.

**Carter Reaches 20-Point Mark Again**

Jawan Carter scored a game-high 24 points at Drexel, the seventh time this season he has reached the 20-point mark. After scoring just seven total points in the first two games of the season, Carter has reached double figures in 15 of the last 16 contests. Alphonso Dawson, who scored 20 points at George Mason, is the only other Blue Hen to reach the 20-point mark in a game this year. (Devon Saddler has scored 19 points twice.)

**Blue Hens Playing Well Defensively**

Delaware currently leads the CAA with a 40.7 field goal percentage defense, ranks second with 4.7 blocked shots per game, and is third with a 31.1 three-point percentage defense.

Conversely, Delaware is last in the CAA with a 41.8 field goal percentage and a 34.0 three-point percentage, and ranks 11th with 62.5 points per game.

**Hagins, Hawkins Earn Cable Car Classic Honors**

Jamelle Hagins was named to the Cable Car Classic All-Tournament Team, while Malcolm Hawkins earned the tournament's Sixth Man Award.

Hagins posted seven points and eight rebounds during the win over Santa Clara, and tied his season-high with 17 points to go with a team-leading eight boards against American.

Hawkins scored four points while grabbing a career-high 10 rebounds versus Santa Clara, while his blocked shot of the Broncos' Raymond Cowels III just before the final buzzer sealed the win for the Blue Hens.

**Tale of Two Games in California**

Delaware shot just 38.3 percent against Santa Clara, but the Blue Hens pulled out the victory by holding the Broncos to only 28.8 percent for the game.

However the following night's game against American was a different story. The Blue Hens shot 52.2 percent from the field but allowed the Eagles to shoot 57.1 percent, the highest by a UD opponent this season.

Delaware's field goal percentage against American was its highest since shooting 57.4 percent on December 1, 2009 at Delaware State - ironically, the Blue Hens lost both of those games.

**Defense is the Key**

When Delaware allows 67 points or fewer, the Blue Hens are 10-0 this season. Conversely when UD gives up 68 points or more, the Hens are 0-8. Delaware is allowing an average of 54.6 points in its 10 wins and 77.6 points during its eight losses.

**Hagins Holds His Own vs. Nova Frontline**

Jamelle Hagins posted an impressive effort at Villanova by scoring 12 points, grabbing eight rebounds and blocking a career-high seven shots.

The last player to record at least 10 points, eight rebounds and seven blocks against Villanova was Georgetown's Jeff Green, a current starter for the Oklahoma City Thunder, on February 17, 2007.

**Carter Named CAA Co-Player of the Week**

Jawan Carter was named the Colonial Athletic Association Men's Basketball Co-Player of the Week on December 6 following his



outstanding performance during the Blue Hens' win over Old Dominion on December 4.

Carter scored a game-high 29 points to lead Delaware to the 75-67 triumph over the Monarchs, the CAA defending champion and this year's preseason favorite. He went 6 of 12 from the field, all from behind the arc, and dished out a game-best four assists as the Blue Hens won their conference opener. Carter also went 11 of 15 from the free throw line, including 7 of 8 in the final 52 seconds to hold off Old Dominion, which was receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 polls.

The Blue Hens, who led the entire second half, built an 11-point cushion with 8:35 to play, but the Monarchs rallied for nine consecutive points to pull within 56-54 with 5:24 remaining. But after Hakim McCullar hit one free throw, Carter found Devon Saddler for a jumper and on the Blue Hens' next possession drilled a deep three-pointer to extend UD's advantage to 62-54 with 3:31 to play. The Monarchs cut the deficit to five three times in the final minute, but Delaware went 9 of 10 from the line, all but two from Carter, to ice the victory.

### Carter Clutch From Foul Line Late in Games

Jawan Carter went a perfect 12 of 12 from the free throw line at Lafayette, including hitting all six of his attempts in the final 32 seconds to seal the victory.

The last time a Blue Hen took that many free throw attempts without missing was when Kestutis Marculions went 13 of 13 during a 99-91 overtime victory over Drexel at the BCC on January 27, 1999.

Carter then went 11 of 15 from the charity stripe versus Old Dominion, including seven of eight in the final 52 seconds to hold off the Monarchs.

### Brian Johnson Returns To UD Lineup

Brian Johnson, who missed all of last season with an ACL injury and the first three games of this year after suffering a torn meniscus in the preseason, finally returned to the court during Delaware's game at Lafayette.

Johnson came off the bench to snap his school-record streak of 94 consecutive starts - every game he had appeared in during his first three years.

Johnson has appeared in all 15 games since his return, averaging 3.0 points in 17.6 minutes per game.

### Carter, Hagins Among Nation's Leaders

Through Thursday's games Jamelle Hagins ranked third in Division I with 3.8 blocked shots per game, while Jawan Carter was 26th with 2.9 three-pointers made per game and 46th with a 40.7 three-point percentage.

### Notes From the Howard Victory

- UD head coach Monté Ross won for the first time in his five home openers.
- Delaware's 34 points allowed was its fewest since a 69-32 victory over Ursinus on December 21, 1961.
- The 32-point victory was the Blue Hens' largest since a 75-40 win over James Madison on January 15, 2005.
- Delaware led 33-16 at the break, its largest halftime lead since taking a 33-15 cushion at Vermont on December 19, 2007.
- Jawan Carter made eight three-pointers, tying the school record set by Billy Wells against Hartford on February 24, 2000. Carter's 14 three-pointers attempted set a UD single game record.
- Howard's 12 field goals made and 20.0 percent shooting are both the lowest by a Blue Hen opponent since prior to the 1983-84 season, when UD began keeping detailed boxscores.
- Delaware blocked 12 shots, its most since also swatting 12 against Siena on December 23, 2003.

### Saddler Shines in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Devon Saddler had an impressive debut against Ohio University for Delaware, posting team-highs of 19 points and seven assists while also grabbing six rebounds in 35 minutes of action.

Saddler, who went 8 of 13 from the field, scored the most points by a UD freshman in his debut since Zaire Taylor scored 22 against The Citadel on November 18, 2005.

Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring for the second consecutive game at Cornell by scoring 15 points on 6 of 10 shooting from the field, and he added a season-high eight assists versus Howard.

Saddler scored 13 points and grabbed five rebounds while playing a game-high 37 minutes during his first CAA game against Old Dominion, while he added a season-high 10 assists during his second conference game at George Mason.

### Dawson Joins 1,200-Point, 500-Rebound Club

Senior Alphonso Dawson, who has scored 1,294 career points, grabbed five rebounds against Howard to reach the 500-rebound career mark. He is just the ninth player in Delaware history to amass at least 1,200 career points and 500 career rebounds.

The others are Mike Pegues, Greg Smith, Mark Murray, Alex Coles, Harding Nana, Herb Courtney, Dave Sysko, and Anthony Wright.

### A Grand Trio?

Delaware already has two members of its backcourt that have surpassed the 1,000-point mark in Jawan Carter (1,339 points) and Alphonso Dawson (1,294 points). Last year marked the ninth time in Blue Hen history that a UD team featured two 1,000-point scorers.

Fellow senior Brian Johnson has scored 956 career points, just 44 shy of the 1,000-point milestone. Delaware has never featured a team containing three 1,000-point scorers.

### Saddler Starts in Blue Hen Debut

Devon Saddler started at Ohio University in his Blue Hen debut, becoming the sixth UD freshman to start his first career game during Monté Ross's five years in Newark.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started last year's season opener against Temple.

### UD Signs Five To NLI's in Early Signing Period

Kyle Anderson, Marvin King-Davis, Khalid Lewis-El, Larry Savage and Jarvis Threatt each signed during the early signing period in November and comprise the Blue Hens' class of 2015.

Anderson, a 6-2 shooting guard, averaged 20.8 points per game last season at Newark Community (Ill.) High School and entered his senior season ranked third on the school's career list with 1,615 points.

King-Davis, a 6-7 forward, was an All-District and All-Region selection as a junior in 2009-10. He averaged 13.6 points and 8.5 rebounds per game a year ago at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Lewis-El, a 6-3 guard, led Trenton Catholic to a 28-3 record and the New Jersey Tournament of Champions title last season. He posted 15 points and five rebounds during a 57-56 triple overtime win over nationally-ranked St. Anthony's in the New Jersey Non-Public B championship.

Savage, a 6-5 small forward, was an All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference honoree a year ago for Bishop O'Connell (Va.) High School. He averaged 12 points and six rebounds per game for the Knights in 2009-10.

Threatt, a 6-1 guard, was also an All-District and All-Region honoree last season at Highland Springs High School in Richmond. He averaged 19.6 points, 2.6 assists and 3.0 steals during his junior year.

### Pegues Returns To Newark on UD Coaching Staff

Mike Pegues, the all-time leading scorer in Delaware history, returned to his alma mater in April and is currently serving in his first season as an assistant coach with the Blue Hens.

Pegues tallied 2,030 career points and became the first player to be named conference Player of the Year when he earned the honors in the 1999-2000 season for the America East Conference. He was inducted into the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

The only three-time first team all-conference selection in school history, Pegues led the Blue Hens to America East titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1998 and 1999, and to the NIT in 2000.

Pegues went on to play professionally in Italy, New Zealand, England and Argentina, and spent one season in the Continental Basketball Association.

He served as an assistant coach for three seasons at Bishop O'Connell High School before spending last season at VCU as the Rams' video coordinator.

# UD HEAD COACH MONTÉ ROSS



Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of Delaware men's basketball history and begins his fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2009-10. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

In May, 2009 the University announced that Ross received a contract extension through the 2014-15 season.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at

the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district.

Ross, 39, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University the previous 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Things are going pretty fast now, but I am prepared to handle it. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture.

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then-UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are

truly superior. He knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players. We are confident that he will bring the University of Delaware men's basketball program to prominence in the CAA."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross and assistant coach Stephen Stewart visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 10, and daughter Lauren, 8.
