Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 2 and running through February 27. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. This season Monté Ross is scheduled to take calls from 11:30 a.m. to 11:40 a.m. The phone number to take part in the call is (877) 805-0692. Delaware vs. Cornell

The Blue Hens and Big Red have met twice previously, with Cornell taking both matchups. Cornell posted a 93-77 victory on December 28, 1968 at the East Carolina Classic, and recorded a 75-61 triumph on November 17, 2010 in Ithaca.

Delaware vs. Cornell Last Season

Max Groebe and Chris Wroblewski each scored 13 points to lead a balanced Cornell attack as the Big Red defeated Delaware, 75-61, at Newman Arena.

Anthony Gatlin did not miss a shot while contributing 12 points off the bench, while Aaron Osgood and Drew Ferry added nine apiece.

Delaware was led by Devon Saddler, who posted 15 points while adding six rebounds. Jamelle Hagins scored 14 points on 6 of 9 shooting while adding team-highs of seven rebounds and six blocked shots.

Josh Brinkley scored six points while Hakim McCullar and Kelvin McNeil each chipped in five for Delaware.

However the Blue Hens were undone by a tough shooting night from outside as Delaware connected on only 1 of 13 three-point attempts, a triple by Alphonso Dawson with just 2:44 to go. Jawan Carter missed all seven of his field goal attempts while scoring just one point on the night.

Delaware led 18-17 following a bucket inside by Brinkley, but Cornell answered with three straight baskets to take a 23-18 advantage with 5:09 left and would not trail from there. Saddler converted a three-point play as Delaware closed the gap to three with 16:51 remaining and the Blue Hens were still within three when Brinkley scored to make it 45-42, but Gatlin converted a four-point play followed by jumpers by Osgood and Wroblewski as Cornell went up double figures at 53-42 with 11:37 remaining.

The lead grew to as much as 13 before Saddler scored in between two baskets by Hagins as Delaware pulled within 58-49 at the 8:34 mark. However the Blue Hens would not get closer as Cornell responded with a 10-3 run, going up 68-52 on a free throw by Adam Wire with 3:20 to go.

Delaware vs. the Ivy League

Delaware is 8-28 against Ivy League teams, but just 0-2 against Cornell. The Blue Hens are also 4-17 vs. Penn, 3-6 vs. Princeton, 0-2 vs. Yale, and 1-1 vs. Dartmouth.

Hens Start 0-2 Again

Delaware has started a season 0-2 for the sixth consecutive year. However the Blue Hens have won their third game of the year during each of the last three seasons.

Delaware in Home Openers

Tonight's game begins the 20th home season since the opening of the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware is 13-6 in home openers at the BCC, and the Blue Hens snapped a four-game home opening losing streak last season with a 66-34 victory over Howard.

Saddler Ties Career-High at Villanova

UD sophomore guard Devon Saddler tied his career-high by scoring 27 points during Friday's loss at Villanova. Saddler went 11 of 26 from the field, while also dishing out four assists and grabbing four rebounds.

Saddler also scored 27 points at Rider on February 19, 2011 when he tied the UD single game scoring record by a freshman.

Anderson Scores 12 in Blue Hen Debut

Blue Hen freshman guard Kyle Anderson missed the season opener against Radford with a stress reaction in his left foot, but scored 12 points in his UD debut Friday at Villanova. Anderson came off the bench to play 20 minutes against the Wildcats, ranking second on the team in scoring after going 4 of 9 from three-point range. Anderson also posted two steals and an assist during the contest.

Freshmen Contribute at Villanova

Of the seven Blue Hens who played the most minutes at Villanova, four were freshmen. In addition to Kyle Anderson's 12 points, Jarvis Threatt was the third UD player in double figures with 11 points, while Threatt and Khalid Lewis tied for the team lead with five assists each. Lewis played 31 minutes for the Blue Hens while Threatt played 25, Anderson played 20 and Larry Savage played 14.

Hens Firing Away From Deep

Delaware attempted 32 three-pointers at Villanova (making 10), tied for the sixth most attempts in a game in Delaware history. Kyle Anderson was 4 of 9 from behind the arc, while Devon Saddler finished 3 of 10 and Jarvis Threatt was 3 of 9.

McNeil Leads All Rebounders at Nova

Junior forward Kelvin McNeil grabbed a game-high nine rebounds at Villanova, including five offensive boards. The game marked the 11th time in McNeil's career that he has collected at least nine boards.

Clyburn Suspended Indefinitely

Sophomore guard Kaleb Clyburn has been suspended indefinitely due to a violation of team rules. Clyburn appeared in 17 games a year ago, contributing 13 points and seven assists.

King-Davis Likely To Redshirt Season

With four experienced players in the Delaware frontcourt, Blue Hen freshman forward Marvin King-Davis is expected to sit out this season as a redshirt. King-Davis was a first team All-District, first team All-Region, second team All-Metro, and second team All-State selection as a senior at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Hens Struggle From Field At Radford

Delaware had a tough shooting night at Radford, connecting on just 15 of 52 field goal attempts for a 28.8 percentage. That shooting percentage is the Blue Hens' lowest since a 28.0 percentage during a 54-41 loss to Georgia State on March 6, 2009 in the CAA Tournament First Round.

Saddler Leads Hens At Radford

Devon Saddler led the Blue Hens in scoring 12 times last season, and scored a team-high 18 points during the season opener at Radford. However Saddler had a rough shooting night, going just 5 of 22 from the field including 2 of 8 from behind the arc. Saddler also had four turnovers while not recording an assist versus the Highlanders.

Hagins Narrowly Misses Double-Double

Junior Jamelle Hagins, who posted three double-doubles last season, narrowly missed his first of 2011-12 when he recorded 17 points and nine rebounds at Radford.

Hagins' 17 points were one shy of his career-high, while his nine rebounds were a game-best. Additionally Hagins, who ranked 12th in Division I with 3.0 blocks per game a year ago, blocked a game-high three shots during UD's season opener.

Threatt, Lewis Start in Debuts

Freshmen Jarvis Threatt and Khalid Lewis each started their Blue Hen debuts, becoming the seventh and eighth true freshmen to start their first collegiate game under head coach Monté Ross.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started the 2009 opener, while Devon Saddler started last year's opener.

This year featured the fifth time in Monté Ross' six seasons that his season-opening starting lineup included a true freshman.

Blue Hen Captains

Junior forwards Jamelle Hagins and Kelvin McNeil, along with sophomore guard Devon Saddler, have been named Blue Hen captains for the 2011-12 season. Saddler is the first sophomore to be named team captain since Mike Slattery in the 2002-03 season.

Delaware Replaces Five in Backcourt

The Blue Hens have plenty of playing time up for grabs in the backcourt due to losing six guards off last year's team.

Jawan Carter, Brian Johnson, D.J. Boney, Edwin Santiago and Alphonso Dawson all completed their eligibility last year. Carter concluded his career ranked fifth in Delaware history with 1,542 career points, while Dawson is tied for 10th at 1,307 points and Brian Johnson is 26th with 1,017 points.

Additionally Malcolm Hawkins, who appeared in nine games and scored eight points on the year, transferred out of the program following the 2010-11 campaign.

Returning/Lost

Delaware returns 55.2 percent of its scoring from last year's team (1076 of 1951 points), and 70.0 percent of its rebounds (666 of 952).

Hagins Leads UD Frontcourt

Jamelle Hagins started 29 games last season, leading the CAA and ranking 12th in Division I with 3.0 blocked shots per game. Hagins' 87 blocks are the fourth most in a UD single season, while he already ranks third in Delaware history with 120 career blocks.

Hagins became the first Blue Hen to be named to the CAA All-Defensive Team, and he also was selected to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Defensive All-America Team.

Hagins also led Delaware and ranked ninth in the CAA with 7.3 rebounds per game, while he was third on the Blue Hens with 8.4 points per contest. He posted three double-doubles on the season, and led Delaware in rebounding 14 times.

Hagins had blocked a shot in 19 consecutive games, the third longest streak in school history, before not recording a block at Villanova. John Bennett blocked a shot in 32 straight games in 1998-99, while Spencer Dunkley had a block in 27 straight from 1991-93.

Blue Hens Feature Experienced Frontcourt

In addition to Jamelle Hagins, Delaware returns three other veterans as the Blue Hens feature one of the most experienced frontcourts in the CAA.

Josh Brinkley appeared in 20 games last year before missing the final month of the season with a stress fracture in his right foot. Brinkley, who started the final 11 games, ranked second on the Blue Hens with 5.2 rebounds per game and was fifth with 7.5 points per contest. He also connected on a team-high 48.3 percent of his field

goal attempts.

Fellow junior Kelvin McNeil was one of four players to appear in all 31 games in 2010-11, starting 10 contests while contributing 5.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

Senior Hakim McCullar made 20 appearances a year ago while starting 12 games, averaging 4.6 points and 2.6 rebounds per contest.

New Faces in the Backcourt

While the Delaware frontcourt is filled with upperclassmen, the Blue Hen backcourt is comprised completely by freshmen and sophomores.

Sophomore Devon Saddler scored a game-high 18 points in 31 minutes of action, while three freshmen were the only other backcourt players to see game action. Jarvis Threatt played 37 minutes, while Khalid Lewis played 30 minutes and Larry Savage played 14. Fellow rookie Kyle Anderson is expected to start as well once he recovers from his foot injury.

Phil Martelli, Jr. Joins UD Coaching Staff

Phil Martelli, Jr. begins his first season on the Delaware men's basketball coaching staff this season.

Martelli, who spent the last five seasons at Niagara, replaced former UD assistant coach R.C. Kehoe, who accepted the head position at Holy Family University during the offseason.

Martelli helped the Purple Eagles to a 95-69 record during his five-year tenure at Niagara, guiding the squad to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2006-07 and a National Invitation Tournament berth in 2008-09 when Niagara finished with a 26-9 mark.

Martelli's duties at Niagara included working with the team's perimeter players, recruiting, scouting, team travel and film exchange. He also helped mentor Purple Eagles point guard Anthony Nelson, a second team All-MAAC selection who led the nation with 3.4 steals per game.

Prior to arriving at Niagara Martelli spent one season at Manhattan College where he was responsible for film breakdown, recruiting, on-court coaching, scouting and player development.

Martelli broke into the coaching ranks in 2003-04 as a graduate assistant coach at Central Connecticut State, and was promoted to assistant coach at CCSU during the following season.

Martelli was a four-year member of the basketball team at Saint Joseph's University from 2000-03 under his father, head coach Phil Martelli, as well as Ross, who was a Hawks assistant at the time. Martelli, who graduated from SJU in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in marketing, appeared in 35 career games for Saint Joseph's, helping the Hawks to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and three regular season Atlantic 10 titles.

Jawan Carter Signs With Turkish Club

Former Delaware standout guard Jawan Carter signed with Darussafaka Cooper Tires of the Turkish basketball league's second division last week. Carter was a third team All-CAA selection for the Blue Hens last season when he led the squad by averaging 16.0 points per game.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 629 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made at least one three-pointer in all but five games since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in the 1986-87 season.

Hens Picked Seventh in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware was picked seventh in the CAA Preseason Poll announced October 18 at the league's Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row Restaurant in Arlington, Va.

Delaware Basketball on Television

The Blue Hens will have seven games televised this season (five locally). The Comcast Network will televise the Delaware's home game against Drexel on December 3, while Comcast SportsNet-Mid Atlantic will broadcast the January 7 game at William & Mary.

The Comcast Network will show the Blue Hens' home contest versus VCU on January 14, as well as the road game at Drexel on January 28. TCN will also show the February 4 tilt at James Madison and the regular season finale against James Madison on February 25.

The Blue Hens' home game versus Old Dominion on January 11 will be shown by WSKY in Hampton Roads, Va., while the road games at Villanova on November 18 and at George Mason on January 18 will be available online at ESPN3.com.

Additionally, The Comcast Network will televise all four CAA Tournament quarterfinal games and both semifinal games, while ESPN will broadcast the conference championship game.

Head Coach Monté Ross

Sixth Season at Delaware • Winston-Salem State '92 • 53-105 Record

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of

Delaware men's basketball history and begins his sixth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2011-12. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district. The following season, the Blue Hens posted a record of 7-24, including wins over America East champion Vermont and Patriot League runner-up Lafayette.

Delaware posted a seven-win improvement during last year, going 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA with an 8-10 league mark. The Blue Hens won five straight games early in the campaign, including an impressive home victory over eventual league champion Old Dominion. Delaware advanced to the CAA Tournament Quarterfinals following a victory over Northeastern in the first round, while freshman Devon Saddler was named the league's Rookie of the Year.

Ross, 41, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University for 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He

knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 12, and daughter, Lauren, 10.

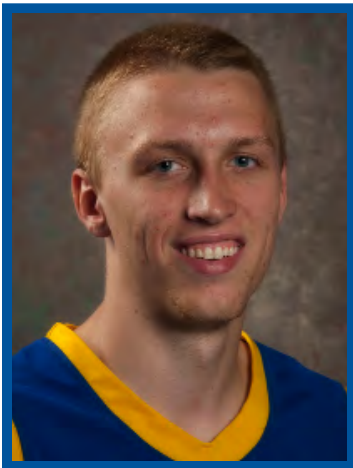
