Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 (first call is Tuesday) and running through February 27. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. Delaware vs. James Madison

Delaware leads the all-time series with James Madison, 11-5, but the Dukes have won the last two meetings and five of the last seven matchups.

Delaware is 5-3 against James Madison in Harrisonburg, although the Dukes have taken three of the last four previous meetings in the JMU Convocation Center including a 71-65 triumph on Jan. 4, 2010.

Last Time Out

Kyle Anderson's hot hand in the first half built the foundation and Delaware held off CAA league-leader George Mason down the stretch for a thrilling 65-60 victory at the BCC on Wednesday.

Delaware (10-12, 6-6 CAA) snapped a two-game losing streak as Anderson knocked down five three-pointers in the first half and finished with a career-high 21 points, Devon Saddler added 13 points and seven rebounds and drained four key free throws in the closing minutes, and Jamelle Hagins contributed 13 points, nine rebounds, and three blocked shots. Hagins' rebound tally included the 600th of his career at Delaware.

Anderson, who finished the game hitting on 8 of 11 shots from the field and 5 of 7 beyond the arc, shook off a recent slump in which he was held scoreless on 0 for 6 shooting during his team's recent two-game slide vs. Northeastern and Drexel.

George Mason (18-6, 10-2 CAA), which had defeated Delaware 89-63 in Fairfax and entered Wednesday's game in sole possession of first place in the league, had a six-game win streak snapped and lost for just the second time in its last 13 outings.

Ryan Pearson led the Patriots with 25 points and eight rebounds while Sherrod Wright came off the bench to add 12 points and Mike Morrison chipped in with 11 points. Pearson surpassed the 20-point mark for the ninth time this season and knocked down 15 points after the break.

Delaware overcame 21 turnovers, including several in the closing minutes that allowed Mason to close the gap, as the Hens outrebounded Mason 43-33 and held the league's top-ranked offense in check. The Patriots had entered the game leading the CAA in points per game (71.3) and field goal percentage (.466) but were held way below their average in both categories as they connected on just 22 of 65 shots from the field (33.8 percent) and were just 3 of 16 from beyond the three-point line and 13 of 21 from the foul line.

The Blue Hens finally got the best of George Mason, snapping a personal five-game losing streak to the perennial league power. Mason had downed the Hens in seven of the last eight meetings and in 13 of the last 15 matchups.

Anderson ignited the Blue Hens to a big first half advantage as Delaware scored 10 straight points early to break a tie and take a 20-10 lead with 12:49 left and later used a 7-0 run to take its biggest lead of the night at 32-15 with 3:47 left. Anderson finished the first half with 12 points on 4 of 5 shooting from beyond the arc.

Mason came right back to narrow the gap as the Patriots scored the final nine points of the half, including seven from Pearson, to cut the Delaware lead to 32-24 at the break.

A quick start out of the second half gate propelled the Hens to another big lead as UD scored seven of the first eight points of the period to go up 39-25 with 17:09 left.

The Patriots chipped away at the lead and eventually pulled to within two points at 46-44 with 9:20 remaining and still trailed just 50-46 with 5:55 left to play. Delaware then scored five straight points to push the lead back to nine at 55-46 and still held that margin at 60-51 after a Khalid Lewis free throw with 56 seconds left.

George Mason rallied again, cutting the gap to 62-58 with a 5-0 spurt with 26 seconds left and pulling to within three on a Morrison layup with four seconds left. But Delaware held on from there as Hagins knocked down two free throws one second later to preserve the victory.

Delaware vs. James Madison Last Meeting

Delaware let a 19-point second half lead slip away as James Madison, led by the inside play of Denzel Bowles, put together a furious rally and knocked off the Blue Hens 77-71 at the Bob Carpenter Center on Jan. 29, 2011.

The Blue Hens appeared to be in control when they took a 50-31 lead with 13:35 left to play on a three-pointer by Jawan Carter, but James Madison rallied back behind Bowles and went ahead for good with 2:23 left to play. Bowles connected on 8 of 10 shots from the field and scored 18 of his game-high 26 points in the second stanza, most of them on turnaround jumpers from the left block under heavy pressure.

Delaware placed four scorers in double figures as Carter scored 20 points and dished out five assists while Josh Brinkley had 16 points and six rebounds. Devon Saddler added 13 points, while Jamelle Hagins contributed 12 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

Bowles knocked down 11 of 18 shots from the field before fouling out with 1:21 left to lead the Dukes. He got solid support from Julius Wells with 19 points and from Devon Moore with 16 points. Wells connected on all nine of his free throws and also led the Dukes with six rebounds.

Delaware shot 50 percent from the field (25-50) but was hurt by 15 turnovers, including nine in the second half when James Madison's fullcourt press forced several UD miscues in the backcourt. The Dukes took advantage of almost every one, scoring 26 points off turnovers for the game, including 19 in the second half.

The Dukes scored 56 second half points as they shot a sizzling 72 percent from the field, hitting 18 of 25 shots, while draining 18 of 21 second half free throws and 24 of 27 for the game. James Madison turned the ball over just three times in the second half to get back into the game.

While the Blue Hens were hot from the field in the first half, hitting 14 of 27 field goals on the way to a 33-21 advantage at the break, James Madison was not as the Dukes connected on 7 of 25 shots. That all changed over the final 10 minutes of the game as the Dukes rallied back.

Delaware built on that 12-point halftime lead as the Hens outscored James Madison 17-10 over the first seven minutes of the second half to up the lead to 50-31 with 13:35 remaining. The Hens connected on three consecutive three-pointers over a span of just over two minutes, including two by Carter and one by D.J. Boney.

But the rest of the day belonged to the Dukes as they embarked on a 15-2 run, starting with a dunk by Bowles, that pulled them to within 52-46 with 9:14 left to play. Hagins ended the run with two free throws for Delaware, but JMU followed with another 15-7 streak and tied the score at 61-61 with 5:16 remaining.

Delaware owned a share of the lead for the next two minutes and led 67-65 with 3:18 left on a Brinkley jumper in the lane, but that would be the Hens' last lead for the rest of the night. Wells drained two free throws to tie the score at 67-67 and Bowles followed with two layups down low over the next two minutes to give James Madison the lead for good at 71-67 with 1:48 left.

Delaware's Hagins again ended the run with a pair of free throws with 1:21 left, but Wells followed with a layup to push the lead back to four. Delaware's Saddler answered with a layup at the 43-second mark to cut the margin to 73-71, but the Hens could never get closer as a layup by Moore with 13 seconds left and two free throws from Andrey Semenov completed the comeback.

Hens To Host Hampton in BracketBusters

Delaware will host Hampton on Saturday, Feb. 18 at 2 p.m. in a Sears BracketBusters game. This year will mark the fifth straight season the Blue Hens and Pirates will face off. Hampton won the first meeting in 2007-08, while Delaware has taken the last three.

UD will travel to Hampton in either the 2012-13 or 2013-14 season, as part of the BracketBusters contract.

Threatt Questionable For Today's Game

Freshman guard Jarvis Threatt suffered a right ankle sprain near the end of the first half of Wednesday's victory over George Mason, and did not return. He is questionable for today's game.

Hens Looking To Move Over .500 in CAA

A win today would move Delaware over the .500 mark through 13 CAA games, a feat matched just three over times during the Blue Hens' first 10 seasons in the league. UD was 7-6 through 13 games in 2002-03 and 2007-08, and was 8-5 in 2003-04.

Anderson Sets Career-High vs. Mason

Blue Hen freshman Kyle Anderson had gone scoreless in consecutive games last week at Northeastern and Drexel, but the freshman bounced back in a big way during Wednesday's win over George Mason.

Anderson finished with a career-high 21 points, going 8 of 11 from the field including 5 of 7 from three-point range.

Saddler Surpasses 800-Point Mark

Devon Saddler scored 13 points Wednesday against George Mason, and now has 821 points during his first two seasons at Delaware. He already ranks 43rd on the UD career scoring list.

Jamelle Hagins has grabbed at least five rebounds during all 21 games this season, and had reached double figures in seven straight before collecting eight versus Temple. He currently leads the league with 8.0 defensive rebounds per game, ranks second with 10.6 rebounds per game, and is eighth with 2.6 offensive boards per game.

Hagins Holds Block Party

Jamelle Hagins blocked a season-high seven shots during the win over Georgia State on Jan. 21, and currently ranks second in the CAA and 15th in Division I with 2.9 blocks per game.

Hagins had blocked a shot in 19 consecutive games, the third longest streak in school history, through the Radford game but did not block a shot against either Villanova or Cornell. John Bennett blocked a shot in 32 straight games in 1998-99, while Spencer Dunkley had a block in 27 straight from 1991-93.

Through Thursday's games, Blue Hen sophomore guard Devon Saddler ranked tied for 27th in the nation with 18.6 points per game.

Big Men Show Improvement at Foul Line

Jamelle Hagins entered this season shooting 60.3 percent from the foul line for his career, while Josh Brinkley shot just 56.2 percent from the line during his first two seasons.

However, both players have shown marked improvement from the charity stripe this year. Hagins is shooting 72.1 percent from the line, while Brinkley is shooting 70.8 percent.

Freshmen Contributing For Delaware

Of the nine players in the regular rotation for the Blue Hens this season, four are freshmen. Additionally, Delaware is the only team in the CAA to have not had a senior start a game this season.

Blue Hens Shut Down Tigers

Delaware allowed just 43 points during the win over Towson on Jan. 23, its lowest point total allowed in a CAA game since a 75-40 win over James Madison on Jan. 15, 2005. The Blue Hens' 19-point margin of victory was their highest in a CAA game since a 95-68 triumph over James Madison on Jan. 19, 2006.

Delaware Limiting Opponents' Field Goal %

Through Thursday's games, Delaware ranked 25th in Division I by holding its opponents to 39.3 percent shooting. George Mason, which shot 54.4 percent on Jan. 18, is the only Blue Hen opponent to shoot over 50 percent this season. However Delaware limited the Patriots to just 33.3 percent during the teams' second meeting, a 65-60 UD win on February 1.

Threatt Sets UD Freshman Record vs. GSU

Jarvis Threatt came off the bench to score a UD freshman record 30 points during the double overtime win over Georgia State on Jan. 21. Threatt went 10 of 15 from the field including 6 of 9 from three-point range, and hit all four of his free throw attempts. He went a perfect 5 of 5 from behind the arc in the first half and made six in a row extending into the second, both marks one shy of the school record.

Threatt's 30 points broke the previous Blue Hen freshman mark of 27 set by Ken Luck vs. Rider on Mar. 2, 1979 and by Devon Saddler on Feb. 19, 2011.

Threatt Earns Weekly Honors

Following his record-breaking 30-point performance against Georgia State, Jarvis Threatt was named the Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Week and the College Sports Madness CAA Player of the Week on Jan. 23.

Brinkley Continues To Impress Inside

Junior forward Josh Brinkley reached then season-highs with 14 points and nine rebounds on Jan. 7 at William & Mary. Brinkley then set new season-highs against Old Dominion on Jan. 11, scoring 16 points while grabbing a team-best 11 rebounds. Brinkley, who had no double-doubles through the first 56 games of his career, then notched his second straight by scoring 13 points and grabbing 11 boards on Jan. 14 against VCU. He scored 14 points at George Mason and added 10 against Towson, reaching double figures five times in the six-game stretch.

Old Dominion Dominates Boards vs. Hens

Old Dominion posted a 51-37 rebounding advantage over Delaware on Jan. 11, as the Monarchs' 51 boards were the most allowed by Delaware since Drexel collected 53 rebounds on Feb. 4, 2009. ODU's 23 offensive boards were the most allowed by UD since the Monarchs grabbed 27 cars during the teams' previous meeting in Newark on Dec. 4, 2010.

The rebounds led to Old Dominion taking 77 field goal attempts, the most by a Delaware opponent since Canisius attempted 78 on Nov. 21, 1999.

Hagins Ties Career-High vs. UNCW, Hofstra

Jamelle Hagins tied his career-high by scoring 21 points at UNCW on Jan. 2. Hagins went 8 of 14 from the field and 5 of 8 from the free throw line, matching his career-best set at Delaware State on Dec. 10.

Hagins again scored a career-high 21 points two days later against Hofstra, going 9 of 14 from the field while grabbing a game-high 18 rebounds. He collected a defensive rebound while getting fouled with 20 seconds remaining, and calmly sank two free throws to put Delaware up two points. Hagins then blocked two shots on the Pride's final possession, and after a foul, collected a rebound with one second left on Shemiye McLendon's missed second free throw.

Hagins Double-Double Streak Snapped vs. Owls

Jamelle Hagins had recorded double-doubles in seven consecutive games, averaging 14.9 points and 13.4 rebounds in that stretch, before posting six points and eight rebounds against Temple. He had not reached double digits in scoring in more than two straight games prior to the Cornell game, but scored in double figures in eight consecutive contests prior to the Temple game.

Hagins was the first Blue Hen to record double-doubles in seven consecutive games since Harding Nana had eight in a row from Dec. 21, 2004 through Jan. 15, 2005. The school record for consecutive double-doubles is 15, set by Spencer Dunkley during the 1992-93 season.

Delaware Shuts Down Hornets

Delaware limited Delaware State to just 42 points during the 58-42 win on December 10, its lowest point total allowed away from Newark since a 59-39 victory over Colgate on Dec. 27, 1985 at the Albright Invitational.

The Hornets' 42 points and 25.9 field goal percentage are the lowest allowed by UD since a 66-34 win over Howard on Nov. 19, 2010 when the Bison shot just 20.0 percent.

Saddler Leads UD in First Six Games

Devon Saddler led Delaware in scoring during each of the first six games of the season. Jawan Carter was the last Blue Hen to accomplish that feat, as he led UD in eight consecutive games from January 23 through February 16, 2010.

The last Blue Hen to lead UD in scoring in each of the first six games of a season was current assistant coach Mike Pegues, who paced Delaware in the first six games of the 1999-2000 campaign.

Saddler had also reached the 20-point mark in five consecutive games, the first Blue Hen to reach 20 points in five straight since Carter from Jan. 23 through Feb. 8, 2010.

However both streaks were snapped on Dec. 7 at Penn, as Saddler was limited to just six points.

Saddler Sets Career-High vs. Lafayette

Devon Saddler scored a career-high 32 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette on Nov. 26. The sophomore guard went 11 of 22 from the field, hit three 3-pointers, and finished 7 of 8 from the free throw line.

Saddler's 32 points are the most by a Blue Hen since Jawan Carter scored 35 during a 97-94 double overtime win at Penn on November 21, 2009.

Anderson Immediately Produces For Hens

After sitting out the season opener at Radford, Kyle Anderson scored 12 points at Villanova and added 11 versus Cornell. He then scored a season-high 16 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette, and went 4 of 5 from three-point range. Anderson is believed to be the first true freshman in school history to reach double figures in each of his first three collegiate games.

Anderson Clutch From Long Distance

Delaware led Cornell by one point late in the contest, but Kyle Anderson buried a three-pointer to make it a 62-58 game with 1:23 remaining. In their next game the Blue Hens were tied with Lafayette, 75-75, but Anderson drilled a go-ahead three-pointer with 30 seconds on the clock. Both treys were assisted by Devon Saddler.

On Dec. 19 Delaware and La Salle were tied 60-60, but Anderson drained a jumper and a three-pointer on consecutive possessions to put the Blue Hens in front for good, 65-60, with 3:16 remaining.

Anderson hit another big three-pointer at Howard, as his triple with 45 seconds left snapped a 67-67 tie. However the Bison answered with a three-pointer of their own and went on to win in overtime.

He hit another clutch triple to put Delaware up 63-61 over Temple with 2:01 remaining, but the Owls scored the final five points of the game to claim the victory.

Anderson hit a go-ahead three-pointer against Old Dominion to put UD up 64-61 with three minutes left in overtime, and added a tough jumper to knot the contest at 66-66 with 1:13 to play.

Anderson currently ranks fourth in the CAA with 2.3 three-pointers made per game and is ninth with a 34.8 three-point field goal percentage.

King-Davis To Redshirt Season

With four experienced players in the Delaware frontcourt, Blue Hen freshman forward Marvin King-Davis is expected to sit out this season as a redshirt. King-Davis was a first team All-District, first team All-Region, second team All-Metro, and second team All-State selection as a senior at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Jawan Carter Signs With Turkish Club

Former Delaware standout guard Jawan Carter signed with Darussafaka Cooper Tires of the Turkish basketball league's second division in early November. Carter was a third team All-CAA selection for the Blue Hens last season when he led the squad by averaging 16.0 points per game.

Maurice Jeffers Signs NLI With Blue Hens

Monté Ross announced on Dec. 22 that high school standout Maurice Jeffers has signed a National Letter of Intent with the Blue Hens and will enroll at UD in the fall of 2012.

Jeffers, a 6-8, 215-pound senior forward, is currently enrolled at Calvin Coolidge High School in Washington, D.C. He averaged eight points, 10 rebounds and five blocks per game as a junior at Coolidge, helping the squad to a 21-8 record and a spot in the D.C. Interscholastic Athletic Association semifinals.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 649 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made at least one three-pointer in all but five games since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in the 1986-87 season.

The streak almost came to an end last Saturday at Drexel, as Delaware missed its first eight three-point attempts before Jarvis Threatt connected from long range with 27 seconds remaining.

Hens Picked Seventh in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware was picked seventh in the CAA Preseason Poll announced October 18 at the league's Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row Restaurant in Arlington, Va.

Head Coach Monté Ross

Sixth Season at Delaware • Winston-Salem State '92 • 63-115 Record

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of

Delaware men's basketball history and begins his sixth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2011-12. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district. The following season, the Blue Hens posted a record of 7-24, including wins over America East champion Vermont and Patriot League runner-up Lafayette.

Delaware posted a seven-win improvement during last year, going 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA with an 8-10 league mark. The Blue Hens won five straight games early in the campaign, including an impressive home victory over eventual league champion Old Dominion. Delaware advanced to the CAA Tournament Quarterfinals following a victory over Northeastern in the first round, while freshman Devon Saddler was named the league's Rookie of the Year.

Ross, 41, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University for 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He

knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 12, and daughter, Lauren, 10.

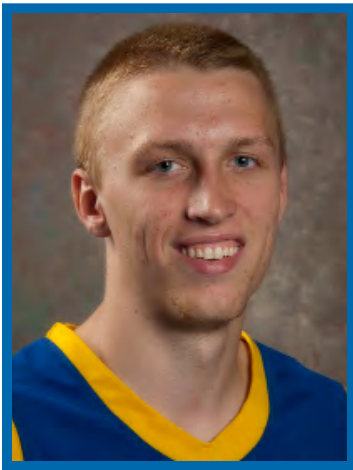
