Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Monté Ross holds a press conference in the BCC auditorium approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and his postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

The visiting team will hold its press conference first in the auditorium.

Selected UD players will also be available in the auditorium as well as Coach Ross following the visiting team. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Monté Ross will not be available immediately prior to games unless an interview is scheduled beforehand. Media wishing to conduct pregame interviews with him are encouraged to tape them prior to gameday or at a shootaround the day of the game. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

CAA Media Teleconference

The CAA hosts a media teleconference each Monday beginning on January 3 (first call is Tuesday) and running through February 27. The teleconference, which features all 12 of the conference's coaches in 10-minute slots, is held on Monday mornings from 10 a.m. to 12 noon. Delaware vs. Hofstra

Hofstra leads the all-time series with Delaware, 48-23, and the Pride has won the last six meetings between the schools. The Blue Hens are 18-17 against Hofstra in Newark, but the Pride has won three consecutive matchups in the Bob Carpenter Center.

Last Time Out

UNCW junior forward Keith Rendleman led all scorers with 24 points and grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds to lead the Seahawks to an 80-75 victory over Delaware Monday afternoon at Trask Coliseum.

The Seahawks, who won their second straight game and fifth in their last seven outings, improved to 5-7 overall and 1-1 in league play. The Blue Hens, who have dropped three in a row, are also now 5-7 overall and 1-1 in the conference.

Cedrick Williams, Adam Smith and Tanner Milson each contributed 10 points in a balanced attack for UNCW, which defeated Delaware for the eighth consecutive meeting in Wilmington. The Seahawks shot just 41.0 percent from the field but made up for it by connecting on 26 of 30 free throw attempts. UNCW also held a 43-35 rebounding advantage, and grabbed 13 offensive rebounds including several key carsoms to extend possessions late in the contest.

Devon Saddler paced the Blue Hens with 22 points while adding four assists and six rebounds, as he surpassed the 20-point mark for the sixth time this season. Jamelle Hagins tied his career-high with 21 points while leading the squad with nine rebounds, while Josh Brinkley contributed 11 points and seven boards as he reached double figures for the fourth time this year. Jarvis Threatt was the fourth Blue Hen in double digits with 10 points to go with six rebounds, while Kyle Anderson scored seven points.

The game was tightly-contested throughout the first 32 minutes, as two free throws by Hagins knotted the contest at 57-57 with 7:31 to play. Rendleman answered inside to put the Seahawks back in front, but a free throw by Brinkley pulled the Blue Hens within 59-58 with 6:38 on the clock.

However UNCW took control by scoring six consecutive points, taking a 65-58 advantage on a KK Simmons leamer with 5:09 to play. The Blue Hens eventually closed to within six on a pair of Saddler free throws but Rendleman scored on a follow while getting fouled, and then hit the ensuing foul shot to make it a 70-61 game at the 3:08 mark.

Two more free throws by Saddler closed the gap to 71-65, but four straight UNCW foul shots made it a double digit game in the final minute, and the Blue Hens would not threaten from there.

The game was tight early, until consecutive three-pointers by Threatt and Saddler gave the Blue Hens an 18-13 lead with 12 minutes left in the opening half. UNCW battled back to tie the game at 21-21 on two free throws by Williams, and neither team led by more than three points over the next six minutes.

The Seahawks were up 35-32 with three minutes left but a Saddler jumper, a Hagins layup in transition and a three-pointer by Anderson gave Delaware a four-point advantage with 1:48 on the clock. UNCW countered with five consecutive points, before Kelvin McNeil hit one free throw to knot the contest at 40-40 at the half.

Delaware shot 44.8 percent in the opening period while posting its second highest first half output of the season, but the Blue Hens allowed the most points in a first period as the Seahawks connected on 44.1 percent of their attempts from the floor.

Hagins scored the first four points of the second half to put Delaware back in front, but the game remained tight as an inside basket by Brinkley tied the game at 50-50 with 12:24 to play. However Milson converted a driving layup and then hit a three-pointer on the Seahawks' next possession to give UNCW a 55-50 advantage with 10 and a half minutes remaining.

Anderson answered with a three-pointer for Delaware to spark a 7-2 UD run, as the Blue Hens tied the game at 57-57 on two free throws by Hagins with 7:31 to play. However Delaware went over five minutes without a field goal as the Seahawks took the lead for good.

Delaware vs. Hofstra Last Meeting

Charles Jenkins scored 21 points while classmates Greg Washington and Brad Kelleher each added 12 as the trio celebrated their Senior Day by leading Hofstra to a 79-60 victory over Delaware on Feb. 26, 2011 at the Mack Sports Complex.

Jawan Carter led the Blue Hens with 21 points, surpassing the 1,500-point mark for his UD career.

Devon Saddler contributed 17 points and a team-high eight rebounds as he reached double figures for the 12th straight contest.

However no other Blue Hen player scored more than six points as Delaware shot just 35.4 percent from the field. UD was playing its second straight game without Jamelle Hagins, who did not make the trip due to an infected toe.

In addition to his 12 points Washington grabbed a team-high eight rebounds and blocked four shots, while Mike Moore and Shemiye McLendon each contributed 11 points as the Pride put five players in double figures. Hofstra connected on 16 of 28 field goals during the second half, finishing the game at 50.8 percent, and went a perfect 15 of 15 from the foul line.

After Hofstra jumped out to an early 9-5 lead Delaware answered with six consecutive points, while a three-pointer by Carter gave the Blue Hens their first lead at 14-11 with 12:27 remaining in the half.

Carter scored in transition to put Delaware up 21-19 but McLendon scored consecutive baskets to ignite a 9-0 Pride run that gave Hofstra a 28-21 advantage at the 5:51 mark. Delaware hit five of six free throws in the final four minutes to pull within five, before Moore converted on a drive to the basket just before the horn as the Pride took a 33-26 lead into the break.

It was still a seven-point game early in the second period, but Jenkins and Kelleher each connected from behind the arc to put the Pride ahead 44-31 with 14:14 on the clock.

After Carter completed a three-point play to bring Delaware within 48-36, Jenkins and Washington each scored twice during an 8-0 run as the Pride went up 56-36 with 9:24 remaining.

The Blue Hens were down 21 a minute later but reeled off six consecutive points to cut the margin to 58-43 and force a Hofstra time out with 6:25 left. However McLendon answered with a three-point play and the Pride led by at least 15 the rest of the way.

Hens Looking To Snap Losing Skid

Delaware has lost three consecutive games for the first time this season. The Blue Hens have not lost four straight since a five-game skid from Jan. 29 through Feb. 12, 2011.

Hagins Ties Career-High at UNCW

Jamelle Hagins tied his career-high by scoring 21 points at UNCW on Monday. Hagins went 8 of 14 from the field and 5 of 8 from the free throw line, matching his career-best set at Delaware State on Dec. 10. Hagins also grabbed a team-high nine rebounds and blocked three shots against the Seahawks.

Threatt Coming On For Hens

Through the La Salle game, Jarvis Threatt was averaging just 4.0 points through the first eight games of his career. However the freshman has picked up his game of late, averaging 11.7 points over the last three contests.

Threatt scored a season-high 17 points at Howard, added eight versus Temple, and reached double figures for the third time this year with 10 points at UNCW.

Big Men Show Improvement at Foul Line

Jamelle Hagins entered this season shooting 60.3 percent from the foul line for his career, while Josh Brinkley shot just 56.2 percent from the line during his first two seasons.

However, both players have shown marked improvement from the charity stripe this year. Hagins is shooting 72.7 percent, 12th in the CAA, while Brinkley is shooting 70.6 percent, 14th in the league.

McNeil Ties Career-High vs. Temple

Junior forward Kelvin McNeil tied his career-high by scoring 13 points during the loss to Temple on Dec. 30. McNeil went 5 of 7 from the field and 3 of 4 from the free throw line to score 13 points for the third time in his career. He also grabbed four rebounds versus the Owls.

Threath Hits Career-High at Howard

Freshman guard Jarvis Threath erupted for a career-high 17 points during the overtime loss at Howard on Dec. 22. Threath, whose previous season best was 11 at Villanova, went 5 of 10 from the field including 3 of 7 from behind the arc, and hit all four of his free throw attempts. He also grabbed six rebounds, dished out two assists, and blocked two shots.

Hagins Double-Double Streak Snapped vs. Owls

Jamelle Hagins had recorded double-doubles in seven consecutive games, averaging 14.9 points and 13.4 rebounds in that stretch, before posting six points and eight rebounds against Temple. He had not reached double digits in scoring in more than two straight games prior to the Cornell game, but scored in double figures in eight consecutive contests prior to the Temple game.

Hagins was the first Blue Hen to record double-doubles in seven consecutive games since Harding Nana had eight in a row from Dec. 21, 2004 through Jan. 15, 2005. The school record for consecutive double-doubles is 15, set by Spencer Dunkley during the 1992-93 season.

Hens Shut Down La Salle 3-Point Attack

La Salle entered the Dec. 19 game at UD ranked ninth in Division I with a 42.1 three-point field goal percentage and tied for 15th with 9.0 three-pointers made per game. However the Blue Hens limited the Explorers to just 2 of 16 (12.5%) shooting from behind the arc during UD's 70-66 victory.

Lewis Lights Up Explorers

Khalid Lewis did not score during the first half of the win over La Salle, not attempting a shot from the field while missing his two free throw attempts.

However the freshman exploded for a career-high 18 points in the second half, going 5 of 6 from the field, 2 of 2 from behind the arc, and 6 of 8 from the foul line. He also dished out four assists and recorded three steals in the victory.

Delaware led by just a point with 30 seconds left, but Lewis stripped Explorers guard Tyreek Duren on a drive to the basket. He was then immediately fouled, and hit two free throws to put the Blue Hens up three.

Saddler Records First Career Double-Double

Devon Saddler scored 18 points and grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds against La Salle to record his first career double-double.

Hens Win First Four at Home

Delaware's win over La Salle gave the Blue Hens their first 4-0 start at home since the 1999-2000 team opened with nine straight home wins. Conversely, UD is just 1-6 away from the Carpenter Center this season.

Delaware Shuts Down Hornets

Delaware limited Delaware State to just 42 points during the 58-42 win on December 10, its lowest point total allowed away from Newark since a 59-39 victory over Colgate on Dec. 27, 1985 at the Albright Invitational.

The Hornets' 42 points and 25.9 field goal percentage are the lowest allowed by UD since a 66-34 win over Howard on Nov. 19, 2010 when the Bison shot just 20.0 percent.

Hagins Enjoys Playing At Memorial Hall

Jamelle Hagins had the most productive game of his freshman season at Delaware State on Dec. 1, 2009, posting career-highs of 18 points and 13 rebounds. While he surpassed the rebounds total last season, his 18 points stood as a career-high...until this year's visit to DSU's Memorial Hall. Hagins again set career-bests of 21 points and 19 boards against the Hornets, while also blocking five shots.

UD Defeats CAA Favorite in Opener Again

Last season Delaware's only CAA game in December came at home against preseason favorite Old Dominion, and the Blue Hens took advantage of the opportunity with a 75-67 win over the Monarchs.

Delaware equaled that feat this season, defeating CAA preseason favorite Drexel, 71-60, on Dec. 3 at the Carpenter Center.

Saddler Leads UD in First Six Games

Devon Saddler led Delaware in scoring during each of the first six games of the season. Jawan Carter was the last Blue Hen to accomplish that feat, as he led UD in eight consecutive games from January 23 through February 16, 2010.

The last Blue Hen to lead UD in scoring in each of the first six games of a season was current assistant coach Mike Pegues, who paced Delaware in the first six games of the 1999-2000 campaign.

Saddler had also reached the 20-point mark in five consecutive games, the first Blue Hen to reach 20 points in five straight since Carter from Jan. 23 through Feb. 8, 2010.

However both streaks were snapped on Dec. 7 at Penn, as Saddler was limited to just six points.

Freshmen Contributing For Delaware

Of the nine players who have seen action for the Blue Hens this season, four are freshmen.

Hagins Dominant on Glass

Jamelle Hagins has grabbed at least seven rebounds during all 12 games this season, and had reached double figures in seven straight before collecting eight versus Temple. He currently leads the CAA with 11.3 rebounds per game and 8.3 defensive rebounds per game, and is fifth with 2.9 offensive boards per game.

Through Monday's games, Hagins was tied for eighth in the nation with 11.3 rebounds per game.

Saddler Tied For 14th in Division I in Scoring

Through Monday's games, Blue Hen sophomore guard Devon Saddler was tied for 14th in the nation with 20.2 points per game.

Hagins Holds Block Party

Jamelle Hagins blocked a season-high five shots against Boston University, Delaware State and La Salle, and currently ranks second in the CAA and 26th in Division I with 2.6 blocks per game.

Hagins had blocked a shot in 19 consecutive games, the third longest streak in school history, through the Radford game but did not block a shot against either Villanova or Cornell. John Bennett blocked a shot in 32 straight games in 1998-99, while Spencer Dunkley had a block in 27 straight from 1991-93.

Lewis Coming On Strong

Blue Hen freshman point guard Khalid Lewis reached double figures for the first time in his career by scoring 10 points at Penn, and also handed out a season-best seven assists versus the Quakers. He then reached his season high with 18 points, all in the second half, during the win over La Salle. This season Lewis leads the Blue Hens with 36 assists and 10 steals, ranks second with 32.7 minutes played, and is fifth with 6.3 points per game.

Lewis currently ranks seventh in the CAA with a 1.4 assist/turnover ratio and 10th with 3.0 assists per game.

Saddler Sets Career-High vs. Lafayette

Devon Saddler scored a career-high 32 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette on Nov. 26. The sophomore guard went 11 of 22 from the field, hit three 3-pointers, and finished 7 of 8 from the free throw line.

Saddler's 32 points are the most by a Blue Hen since Jawan Carter scored 35 during a 97-94 double overtime win at Penn on November 21, 2009.

Anderson Immediately Produces For Hens

After sitting out the season opener at Radford, Kyle Anderson scored 12 points at Villanova and added 11 versus Cornell. He then scored a season-high 16 points during the 81-78 victory over Lafayette, and went 4 of 5 from three-point range. Anderson is believed to be the first true freshman in school history to reach double figures in each of his first three collegiate games.

Anderson Clutch From Long Distance

Delaware led Cornell by one point late in the contest, but Kyle Anderson buried a three-pointer to make it a 62-58 game with 1:23 remaining. In their next game the Blue Hens were tied with Lafayette, 75-75, but Anderson drilled a go-ahead three-pointer with 30 seconds on the clock. Both treys were assisted by Devon Saddler.

On Dec. 19 Delaware and La Salle were tied 60-60, but Anderson

drained a jumper and a three-pointer on consecutive possessions to put the Blue Hens in front for good, 65-60, with 3:16 remaining.

Anderson hit another big three-pointer at Howard, as his triple with 45 seconds left snapped a 67-67 tie. However the Bison answered with a three-pointer of their own and went on to win in overtime.

He hit another clutch triple to put Delaware up 63-61 over Temple with 2:01 remaining, but the Owls scored the final five points of the game to claim the victory.

Anderson currently ranks fifth in the CAA with 2.4 three-pointers made per game and is ninth with a 36.6 three-point field goal percentage.

Clyburn Suspended Indefinitely

Prior to the season opener sophomore Kaleb Clyburn was suspended indefinitely due to a violation of team rules. Clyburn appeared in 17 games a year ago, contributing 13 points and seven assists.

King-Davis Likely To Redshirt Season

With four experienced players in the Delaware frontcourt, Blue Hen freshman forward Marvin King-Davis is expected to sit out this season as a redshirt. King-Davis was a first team All-District, first team All-Region, second team All-Metro, and second team All-State selection as a senior at Meadowbrook High School in Richmond, Va.

Threatt, Lewis Start in Debuts

Freshmen Jarvis Threatt and Khalid Lewis each started their Blue Hen debuts, becoming the seventh and eighth true freshmen to start their first collegiate game under head coach Monté Ross.

Brian Johnson and Darrell Johnson each started the 2006 season opener, while D.J. Boney and Alphonso Dawson both started the 2007 opener. Jamelle Hagins started the 2009 opener, while Devon Saddler started last year's opener.

This year featured the fifth time in Monté Ross' six seasons that his season-opening starting lineup included a true freshman.

Maurice Jeffers Signs NLI With Blue Hens

Monté Ross announced on Dec. 22 that high school standout Maurice Jeffers has signed a National Letter of Intent with the Blue Hens and will enroll at UD in the fall of 2012.

Jeffers, a 6-8, 215-pound senior forward, is currently enrolled at Calvin Coolidge High School in Washington, D.C. He averaged eight points, 10 rebounds and five blocks per game as a junior at Coolidge, helping the squad to a 21-8 record and a spot in the D.C. Interscholastic Athletic Association semifinals.

Blue Hen Captains

Junior forwards Jamelle Hagins and Kelvin McNeil, along with sophomore guard Devon Saddler, have been named Blue Hen captains for the 2011-12 season. Saddler is the first sophomore to be named team captain since Mike Slattery in the 2002-03 season.

Jawan Carter Signs With Turkish Club

Former Delaware standout guard Jawan Carter signed with Darussafaka Cooper Tires of the Turkish basketball league's second division in early November. Carter was a third team All-CAA selection for the Blue Hens last season when he led the squad by averaging 16.0 points per game.

Long Distance Plan

Delaware has made at least one three-point field goal in each of the last 639 games dating back to November 28, 1990. In all, the Blue Hens have made at least one three-pointer in all but five games since the implementation of the three-point line throughout the NCAA in the 1986-87 season.

Hens Picked Seventh in CAA Preseason Poll

Delaware was picked seventh in the CAA Preseason Poll announced October 18 at the league's Media Day at Champps-Pentagon Row Restaurant in Arlington, Va.

Head Coach Monté Ross

Sixth Season at Delaware • Winston-Salem State '92 • 58-110 Record

Monté Ross was formally introduced as the University of Delaware men's basketball program's new head coach on April 4, 2006 in a press conference held at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Ross, who pronounces his first name "mon-tay", is the 23rd head coach in University of

Delaware men's basketball history and begins his sixth season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2011-12. This is his first head coach position after an outstanding career as a Division I assistant coach for 13 seasons.

Taking over a program that had lost 20 games each of the previous two seasons, Ross had his struggles in his first season at the helm of the Blue Hens in 2006-07 as a young and depleted squad posted a record of 5-26 and went 3-13 in Colonial Athletic Association play to finish in 12th place.

But Ross guided an impressive turnaround in Year Two and made a strong case for CAA Coach of the Year honors. Still guiding a young squad, the Blue Hens were the second most improved squad in the league, posting a mark of 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA standings with a record of 9-9.

The Hens improved nine games from the previous season, tripling their league win total and posting just as many overall wins as the previous two years combined. Ross also led his team to a first round CAA Tournament victory as the Blue Hens knocked off long-time rival Drexel 60-51. Leading the squad was third team All-CAA forwards Herb Courtney and Marc Egerson, CAA All-Rookie pick Alphonso Dawson, and one of the league's top point guards in Brian Johnson.

Delaware won its first five league games during the season and among its CAA wins were a home win over league champion and NCAA Tournament participant George Mason, a home win over regular season runner-up UNC Wilmington, and an early season road win over tournament runner-up William & Mary.

Delaware went 13-19 overall and 6-12 during the 2008-09 season, but the year included impressive home victories over VCU and George Mason. The Blue Hens also posted an overtime win over Drexel, while Egerson was named first team all-conference and all-district. The following season, the Blue Hens posted a record of 7-24, including wins over America East champion Vermont and Patriot League runner-up Lafayette.

Delaware posted a seven-win improvement during last year, going 14-17 overall and placing seventh in the CAA with an 8-10 league mark. The Blue Hens won five straight games early in the campaign, including an impressive home victory over eventual league champion Old Dominion. Delaware advanced to the CAA Tournament Quarterfinals following a victory over Northeastern in the first round, while freshman Devon Saddler was named the league's Rookie of the Year.

Ross, 41, served as an assistant coach under Phil Martelli at Saint Joseph's University for 10 seasons before taking over at Delaware, helping to lead the Hawks to a record of 262-141, six NCAA Tournament appearances, and three National Invitation Tournament appearances. The 2003-04 team went 30-2 and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

"This means a lot to me and my family," said Ross, who spoke to a full room that included family members, friends, Saint Joseph's University staff and supporters, and media members when he was hired. "This is such a great opportunity and I'm going to cherish it. I can promise that I will work hard and make all of you proud. I've been preparing for this opportunity for a very long time. Working with someone like Phil Martelli has prepared me well for this. I want to make sure that our players' experience here is memorable and that they get what they signed on for. We want to create a love affair with the community and the campus and have a positive impact in everything we do. We will play hard every night and bring a winning attitude and create a winning culture."

"We are excited to have Monté join the University of Delaware men's basketball program," said then UD Director of Athletics Edgar N. Johnson on his hiring. "During the interview process, we learned that Monté's contacts and success in recruiting young men from the Mid-Atlantic Region are truly superior. He

knows the region and its players and coaches, our University, and the Colonial Athletic Association. Most important of all, Monté is a talented, personable, hard-working young man who has great rapport with his players."

A 1992 sport management graduate of NCAA Division II Winston-Salem State where he played for legendary head coach and Basketball Hall of Fame member Clarence "Big House" Gaines (828-447 record in 47 seasons from 1946-1993), Ross has been surrounded by championship basketball throughout his coaching career.

During his 13 seasons as an NCAA Division I assistant, Ross helped lead teams to nine winning seasons, seven campaigns with 20 or more victories, and a winning percentage of .650. His teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament six times and to the NIT Tournament three times while capturing five conference championships.

After beginning his career as an assistant at Lehigh in 1993-94, he spent two seasons as an assistant at Delaware's top rival Drexel, leading the Dragons to consecutive North Atlantic Conference titles and NCAA Tournament berths in 1995 and 1996 under head coach Bill Herrion. The 1995-96 squad, led by current NBA veteran Malik Rose, posted a record of 27-4 and upset Memphis in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

Ross joined the Saint Joseph's staff in 1996-97 during Martelli's second season as head coach. The Hawks rose to national prominence under Martelli, participating in post-season action seven times, including each of the Ross' final six seasons on Hawk Hill. During Ross' tenure, the Hawks won four Atlantic 10 regular season titles, one conference tournament title, posted five seasons with 20 or more wins, and averaged 23 wins over his final six seasons.

The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times during his tenure, including a memorable 2003-04 season when Saint Joseph's posted a 30-2 record and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. The Hawks were a national story, going through the regular season undefeated and earning a No. 1 national ranking late in the season.

Ross also helped Saint Joseph's advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1997, to the NCAA second round in 2001, and to the NCAA first round in 2003. In 2005-06 Saint Joseph's went 19-14, advanced to the Atlantic 10 Tournament championship game, and advanced to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. Saint Joseph's also made a run to the NIT title in 2004-05, going 24-12 and falling in the championship game. The Hawks won the Atlantic 10 title and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 during Ross' first season on Hawk Hill in 1996-97.

Ross, who served as the Hawks' recruiting coordinator and worked with the team's point guards, was instrumental in bringing three current NBA players to Saint Joseph's, including two first round draft picks in 2004 consensus National Player of the Year Jameer Nelson and Delonte West.

Ross' tenure at Saint Joseph's was the third longest in school history for an assistant coach and he was honored in 2005 with the William J. Bennett Award, recognizing dedication and loyalty to the Saint Joseph's men's basketball program. He shared the award with fellow Saint Joseph's assistant Mark Bass.

In addition to his duties as an assistant at Saint Joseph's, Ross was active with the prestigious Sonny Hill League, serving as a head coach in the summer college league and as an assistant in the high school league.

In September, 2006, Ross visited Dakar, Senegal to conduct youth basketball clinics and a coaching seminar as part of a United States Department of State-funded International Basketball Initiative. They worked in conjunction with Basketball Without Borders Africa, a community relations outreach program of the NBA and also with the Senegalese Basketball Federation and the nonprofit organization Sports for Education and Economic Development in Senegal.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their son Justin, 12, and daughter, Lauren, 10.

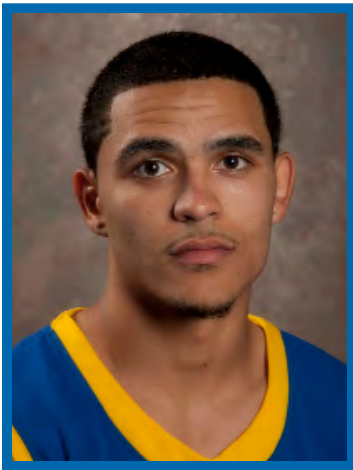
