Delaware head coach Tina Martin holds a press conference in the BCC Auditorium, room 102, approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and her postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

Selected players will be available as well, usually while Coach Martin is conducting her radio interview. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Quote sheets will be done by the UD Athletics Media Relations staff for both teams, if requested, and will be available in the media room. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

Credentials/Press Row

Requests for press credentials and parking passes should be made to Assistant AD/Media Relations Scott Selheimer. Please make arrangements at least two days in advance of each game. Press row at Bob Carpenter Center/Acierno Arena is located at courtside opposite the player and game officials' benches. All press guests are required to show a pass for admittance to the arena. The media entrance is located in the rear of the building (loading dock) on the east side of the Bob Carpenter Center. Parking is located in the rear of the Bob Carpenter Center.

Hens Off to First-Ever 9-0 Start

Delaware's most recent victory over Providence kept the Hens unbeaten at 9-0, marking the best start in the 41-year history of the program. Prior to this season, the Hens had started out with five straight wins just twice, breaking out to perfect 5-0 starts in 1992-93 and last season.

The Hens are one of eight teams that are still undefeated, including Baylor, Colorado, Green Bay, Maryland, Ohio St., Oklahoma St. and Texas Tech.

Delaware vs. the ACC

The Blue Hens made history by defeating their first Atlantic Coast Conference opponent in the 41-year history of the program with a win over Wake Forest on Dec. 11. The Hens had fallen in all 16 previous attempts against ACC opponents, including a 63-62 setback to Wake Forest in their first meeting with the Demon Deacons on Dec. 9, 1989. Delaware will potentially face Maryland in the Maryland Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29.

Delaware is 0-9 all-time against Maryland, 0-2 against Boston College and Virginia Tech, and 0-1 vs. Duke and NC State.

Hens Earn First-Ever Top 25 National Ranking

Delaware has cracked the Associated Press Top 25 poll this season for the first time in school history. The Hens, who earned 117 points in the media poll announced on Nov. 28, moved up to No. 24 after a 2-0 week that saw Delaware pick up two road wins with victories of 64-56 at Villanova and 61-49 at previously unbeaten St. Bonaventure. Delaware moved up to No. 22 in the poll announced Dec. 5 after a 2-0 week against Princeton and William & Mary, and moved up to No. 21 in the most recent poll announced on Dec. 26 following the win at Providence.

The Hens became the 149th school to land in the poll, while Martin marks the 245th head women's coach to guide a team into the rankings. This is the third time in Tina Martin's tenure her squad has earned notice in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. The Hens also received notice in the AP Top 25 polls during the 2006-07 and 2009-10 campaigns. Delaware is only the third school to earn a national ranking as a CAA member following Old Dominion and JMU.

Delle Donne Among Nation's Leaders

The Division I NCAA statistics released on Dec. 19 featured Elena Delle Donne leading the nation with 29.3 points per game. She also was 11th with a 92.9 free throw %, 21st with 10.4 rebounds per game, and 21st with 2.6 blocked shots per game.

Additionally, the Blue Hens ranked fourth in the nation with an 80.7 free throw percentage, ninth with a +11.4 rebounding advantage, and 20th with a 44.8 field-goal percentage.

Hens Stun No. 11 PSU

The Blue Hens made history by defeating their highest ranked opponent in school history 80-71 at the BCC on Nov. 17. Delaware's 80 points against Penn State was the second highest total for the Blue Hens in the 19-year history of the BCC and the most since a 91-68 win over Morgan State on Dec. 20, 1999.

The Hens had knocked off a Top 25 team just two other times in school history in 28 previous tries, including an 86-70 win over No. 20 Kentucky during the 2006-07 season and a 77-67 victory over No. 22 James Madison at the BCC on Feb. 22, 2007.

Delle Donne Continues to Roll

Pregame All-American Elena Delle Donne opened her season with a bang, scoring 33 points and grabbing six rebounds in the

Blue Hens' 89-53 season opening win over Rhode Island.

Delle Donne continued her hot streak against Penn State, scoring 40 points, pulling down 12 rebounds, and blocking four shots. Her 40 points set a BCC record and was the third highest total in school history, trailing only her school-record 54-point performance at JMU on Feb. 18, 2010 and her 41-point explosion against Yale on Nov. 20, 2010. She also grabbed a season-high 18 rebounds in the win at St. Bonaventure on Nov. 27, tying her career-high single-game record.

Delle Donne became the sixth Delaware player to reach the 1,500 career point mark during the match-up vs. William & Mary on a second half free throw. In Delaware's win against Wake Forest, Delle Donne recorded her third double-double of the season as she netted a game-high 30 points and pulled 13 rebounds. In the Hens' most recent showdown vs. Providence, Delle Donne surpassed the 20-point mark for the 13th straight game with a game-high 29 points in addition to adding nine rebounds on the day.

Quick Starts Propel Hens

Delaware had jumped out to at least a 4-0 lead in the first six games this season, including leads of 14-0 vs. Princeton, 11-0 vs. St. Bonaventure, and 8-0 vs. William & Mary. In the first four minutes of games this season, the Blue Hens have outscored opponents by a combined 99-36 margin before the first media timeout.

After going down 54-52 with 5:07 left in the game at Villanova, Delaware trailed for only 1:24 of the next 145 minutes through the Yale game. The Blue Hens have trailed for just 32:53 out of 360 minutes this season, including 18:17 of that against 11th-ranked Penn State. Delaware has not trailed in four out of the nine games this season.

Delaware Rolls Over Powerhouse Conferences

Delaware's victories over Penn State, Villanova, Wake Forest, St. Bonaventure, Providence, and Rhode Island made the Hens the only team in CAA history to have defeated a Big Ten, Big East, ACC, and Atlantic 10 opponent in the same season. CAA foe Old Dominion University has also rolled over multiple powerhouse conference teams in the same season, including victories over Georgia Tech (ACC), Louisville (Big East), George Washington (Atlantic 10), and Charlotte (Atlantic 10) last season.

Delaware Wins Rebounding Battles

Delaware has won the rebounding battle in all nine games this season. The Blue Hens posted a +24 margin against St. Bonaventure and +23 against Yale. Delaware currently ranks ninth in the nation with a +11.4 rebounding advantage.

Delle Donne Earns Weekly Honors

After averaging 27.5 points and nine rebounds in Delaware's wins against Princeton and William & Mary, Elena Delle Donne collected CAA Co-Player of the Week honors for the third time this season on Dec. 5. The junior forward went 21-34 (.618) from the field including 4 of 6 from the three-point range, and also made all nine of her free throws.

Delle Donne was also named CAA Player of the Week and the College Sports Madness Player of the Week on Nov. 14 and Nov. 21.

Parker Produces in Paint

Junior forward Danielle Parker has started all nine games this season, ranking second on the team with 7.3 rebounds and third with 7.3 points. She has reached double figures twice, including a season high 12 points at Villanova, and narrowly missed a double-double with nine points and a season-high 12 rebounds at St. Bonaventure.

Parker currently ranks seventh in the CAA with a 52.1 field goal

percentage, 12th with 4.9 defensive rebounds, and 12th with 7.1 rebounds per game.

Lucas Off to Hot Start

Transfer guard Trumae Lucas started her Blue Hen debut in the season opener against Rhode Island, ranking second on the team with 14 points, going 6 of 8 from the field including 2 of 4 from three-point range, and adding two assists and a steal in 19 minutes of action. Lucas continued to impress against Penn State, posting 15 points with some timely three-pointers and going 6 of 6 on the line. She also added four assists and three rebounds.

Lucas reached double figures for the third time this season by scoring 12 points at Princeton. She currently leads the Hens with 27 assists and ranks second with 7.9 points per game. Lucas ranks third in the CAA with an 84.2 free throw percentage (16 of 19).

Miller Returns To Lineup For Hens

Junior point guard Kayla Miller, who missed all of last season following back surgery to repair a herniated disk, returned to the Blue Hen lineup in the season-opener against Rhode Island. Miller dished out six assists, one shy of her career-high, against only one turnover in 16 minutes of action. She also grabbed five rebounds and recorded two steals in the season opening victory.

Miller currently ranks second on the Blue Hens with 22 assists and third with nine steals on the season.

Kabongo Turns Up the Heat

Senior guard Vanessa Kabongo stepped up to add a spark and help Delaware stay unbeaten with a hard-fought 64-56 victory over Villanova on Nov. 22 at the The Pavilion.

Kabongo came off the bench to score 10 points, including a jumper just inside the three-point line with 1:07 left. She went 5 of 6 from the field and 2 of 2 on the line in addition to recording a rebound and block.

Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents

Delaware is now 3-27 all-time versus ranked opponents after its 80-71 victory against Penn State at the BCC on Nov. 17. The Blue Hens are 2-8 versus ranked opponents at home.

Preseason Honors Rolling in For Delle Donne

Junior Elena Delle Donne was named an Associated Press Preseason All-American in early November, and has also been selected to the Preseason Wade National Player of the Year Trophy Watch List, Preseason John Wooden Top 30 List, and Naismith Early-Season National Player of the Year Watch List. Additionally, Delle Donne was tabbed the CAA Preseason Player of the Year at the league's Media Day in October.

So How Did You Spend Your Summer?

Elena Delle Donne won a gold medal during hers, as she was a member of the Team USA World University Games squad that went a perfect 6-0 during the international tournament held in Shenzhen, China. She led the U.S. with 15.7 points and 8.5 rpg, and had the second highest three-point percentage with a 44.0 clip. Delle Donne recorded double-doubles against Slovakia and Australia, and narrowly missed a triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 8

assists during the gold medal game victory over Taiwan.

Delle Donne in the UD Record Book

Despite being in the third year of her Blue Hen basketball career, Elena Delle Donne has already made her mark on the Delaware record book. She is the school's career leader with a 26.6 points per game average (Lori Howard is second at 17.7 ppg). She is also UD's career leader with a 91.9 free throw percentage and a 40.3 three-point percentage. She ranks third in UD history with 114 three-pointers made and 1,594 points, fourth with 139 blocks, fifth with 422 free throws made, and seventh with 8.6 rebounds per game.

Delle Donne has already reached the 30-point mark 20 times in her career, including a school-record 54 at James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010 and 41 at Yale on Nov. 20, 2010. She is responsible for nine of the 10 highest individual scoring games in Delaware history.

Blue Hens Face Tough Non-League Schedule

Tina Martin has put together what she deems is the toughest non-conference schedule in school history. Delaware pulled off the biggest upset in school history as the Blue Hens brought down No. 11 Penn State with an 80-71 victory on Nov. 17, and defeated Big East opponent Villanova on Nov. 22.

Delaware started December off with a 81-70 win at Princeton, and continued with the Blue Hens' first-ever victory over an ACC foe at Wake Forest. The Hens recently defeated Big East opponent Providence 68-47, and conclude their non-league slate this week with an appearance in the Terrapin Classic, which could feature a game with 5th-ranked Maryland.

Martin Winningest Coach in UD History

Delaware head coach Tina Martin has amassed a 287-175 record during her 16 seasons as Delaware, and is the winningest men's or women's basketball coach in school history. Martin earned her record-setting 267th career victory with a 61-51 triumph at Northeastern on January 6, 2011. She surpassed Joyce Perry, who concluded her career with a 266-165 record in 15 seasons.

Delle Donne's Sophomore Campaign

Despite missing 12 games due to Lyme Disease symptoms, Elena Delle Donne still had a stellar sophomore campaign in which she was named honorable mention Associated Press All-American. Delle Donne was also a first team All-CAA and first team CAA All-Academic selection, and was a second team All-East pick.

Delle Donne led Delaware with 25.3 points per game and ranked second with 7.8 rebounds, and set a UD single season record by converting 94.4 percent of her free throw attempts (167 of 177). Her 25.3 points per game are second in a UD single season, while her 557 points and 167 free throws made are third.

Delle Donne became the second fastest player in NCAA history to reach the 1,000-point mark, doing so in her 38th collegiate game against Northeastern on February 3.

A Run of Excellence

During the last 12 seasons, Delaware has had a run of success most teams in the nation would be hard-pressed to match. Since the start of the 1999-2000 season the Blue Hens have posted nine 20-win campaigns (UD won 19 games in 2003-04), and have competed in postseason play eight times.

Delaware competed in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2007, while earning WNIT berths in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2010, and 2011.

The Blue Hens won the America East Tournament Championship in 2001, advanced to the CAA Tournament Finals three times, and advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals in five other times. Delaware has gone 247-124 during the last 11 years, a 66.6 percent win percentage.

Delaware Basketball on Television

The University of Delaware women's basketball team will appear on television twice during the 2011-12 regular season as announced by the Colonial Athletic Association at the league's Media Day.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on Sunday, January 22 at 3:30 p.m. in a contest that will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic.

Delaware will again appear on TV the following Sunday, Jan. 29, when the Blue Hens take on James Madison in Harrisonburg, Va. at 7 p.m. in a rematch of the 2011 CAA Championship Game.

Head Coach Tina Martin

16th Season at Delaware • Lock Haven '86 • 287-175 Record

One of the most successful coaches in University of Delaware athletics history, Tina Martin begins her 16th season at the helm of the Blue Hen women's basketball team in 2011-12.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was hired May 14, 1996, replacing Joyce Perry who served for 18 years. Martin recently signed a contract extension through the 2013-2014 season.

In 15 seasons, Martin has transformed the Blue Hens into perennial championship contenders, first in the America East conference, and currently in the Colonial Athletic Association, which Delaware joined beginning with the 2001-02 season.

In those 15 seasons, she has led the teams to a combined record of 287-175 (.621) overall and 177-102 (.634) in regular season league play with the Hens posting nine straight winning seasons through the 2006-07 season. The Hens have posted 20-win seasons in nine of the last 12 seasons and made post-season appearances in eight of the last 11 years, including two in the NCAA and six in the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

On Jan. 6, 2011, Martin became the winningest basketball coach, men's or women's, at the University, earning her 267th career victory with a 61-51 win at Northeastern University. She surpassed Perry, who concluded her coaching career with 266-165 (.617) in just 15 seasons.

The Hens won at least 19 games 10 times in the last 12 seasons and have placed fourth or better in league play all but four times. Delaware advanced to the league championship semifinals or better 10 times in the last 12 years, including an appearance in the CAA Championship game for the third time in 2010-11.

But it all came together during the 2000-01 season for the Blue Hens. Martin led an experienced Delaware squad to the finest season in school history. UD put together a record of 26-5, setting school records for wins in a season and consecutive victories (17) and cruising to the America East regular season title with a 17-1 record. The Hens moved through the America East Tournament, defeating Boston University and Hartford in the first two rounds and rallying to down host Vermont in the championship game.

That victory gave Delaware its first ever America East title, first conference championship since 1991, and its first program NCAA Tournament appearance. The Blue Hens advanced to the NCAA East Regionals at North Carolina State and hung tough with the 19th ranked Wolfpack before falling 76-57. The Hens also received their first ever votes in the USA Today Top 25 poll during the season.

During the 2006-07 season, Delaware tied the school record with 26 wins and tied the school record for conference wins with 16. The Blue Hens also received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 media poll for the first time in school history. The Hens fell in the CAA semifinals to James Madison but garnered the school's first ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.
