Delaware head coach Tina Martin holds a press conference in the BCC Auditorium, room 102, approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and her postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

Selected players will be available as well, usually while Coach Martin is conducting her radio interview. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Quote sheets will be done by the UD Athletics Media Relations staff for both teams, if requested, and will be available in the media room. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

Credentials/Press Row

Requests for press credentials and parking passes should be made to Assistant AD/Media Relations Scott Selheimer. Please make arrangements at least two days in advance of each game. Press row at Bob Carpenter Center/Acierno Arena is located at courtside opposite the player and game officials' benches. All press guests are required to show a pass for admittance to the arena. The media entrance is located in the rear of the building (loading dock) on the east side of the Bob Carpenter Center. Parking is located in the rear of the Bob Carpenter Center.

Hens Off to First-Ever 6-0 Start

Delaware's most recent victory over William & Mary kept Delaware unbeaten at 6-0, marking the best start in the 41-year history of the program. Prior to this season, the Hens had started out with five straight wins just twice, breaking out to perfect 5-0 starts in 1992-93 and last season.

Quick Starts Propel Hens

Delaware has jumped out to at least a 4-0 lead in every game this season, including leads of 14-0 vs. Princeton, 11-0 vs. St. Bonaventure, and 8-0 vs. William & Mary. In the first four minutes of games this season, the Blue Hens have outscored opponents by a combined 69-23 margin before the first media timeout.

The Hens have scored first in seven straight games dating back to last season. UD has also now held a lead or a share of the lead for the last 125 minutes of game action. The Hens have not trailed since going down 54-52 with 5:07 left in the game at Villanova.

Delaware vs. the Ivy League

Delaware holds a 29-18 record over the Ivy League schools, including even or winning series against Brown (2-0), Columbia (1-1), Pennsylvania (9-6), Princeton (15-7), and Yale (1-0). The Blue Hens have yet to play Cornell, while Dartmouth and Harvard hold advantages over Delaware at 3-1 and 1-0, respectively.

Thursday's meeting will be the 2nd time the Hens and the Bulldogs will square off. The Blue Hens defeated the Bulldogs 79-61 last season at the John J. Lee Amphitheater behind 41 points from Elena Delle Donne. Delle Donne's 41 points rank second for a single game in Delaware history, just behind her own mark of 54 points against James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010

Hens Earn First-Ever Top 25 National Ranking

Delaware cracked the Associated Press Top 25 poll for the first time in school history. The Hens, who earned 117 in points the media poll announced on Nov. 28, moved up to No. 24 after a 2-0 week that saw Delaware pick up two road wins with victories of 64-56 at Villanova and 61-49 at previously unbeaten St. Bonaventure. Delaware moved up to No. 22 in the most recent poll announced today after a 2-0 week against Princeton and William & Mary.

The Hens became the 149th school to land in poll, while Martin marks the 245th head women's coach to guide a team into the rankings. This is the third time in Tina Martin's tenure her squad has earned notice in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. The Hens also received notice in the AP Top 25 polls during the 2006-07 and 2009-10 campaigns. Delaware is only the third school to earn a national ranking as a CAA member following Old Dominion and JMU.

Blue Hen Duo Leads Nation in Scoring

The first NCAA statistics released on Nov. 28 included a pair of Blue Hens leading the Division I in scoring. Elena Delle Donne led the women with 30.3 points per game, while Devon Saddler led the men by averaging 24.5 points per game.

Additionally, Kayla Miller ranked fifth in the nation with a 4.67 assist turnover ratio, while Elena Delle Donne was 12th with 11.3 rebounds per game. The women's team ranked second in the nation with 11.3 turnovers per game, and 8th with a 1.24 assist turnover ratio.

Hens Stun No. 11 PSU

The Blue Hens made history by defeating their highest ranked opponent in school history 80-71 at the BCC on Nov. 17. Delaware's 80 points against Penn State was the second highest total for the Blue Hens in the 19-year history of the BCC and the most since a 91-68 win over Morgan State on Dec. 20, 1999.

The Hens had knocked off a Top 25 team just two other times in school history in 28 previous tries, including an 86-70 win over No. 20 Kentucky during the 2006-07 season and a 77-67 victory over No. 22 James Madison at the BCC on Feb. 22, 2007.

Delle Donne Starts Year in Style

Preseason All-American Elena Delle Donne opened her season with a bang, scoring 33 points and grabbing six rebounds in the Blue Hens' 89-53 season opening win over Rhode Island.

Delle Donne continued her hot streak against Penn State, scoring 40 points, pulling down 12 rebounds, and blocking four shots. Her 40 points set a BCC record and was the third highest total in school history, trailing only her school-record 54-point performance at James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010 and her 41-point explosion against Yale on Nov. 20, 2010. She also grabbed a season-high 18 rebounds in the win at St. Bonaventure on Nov. 27, tying her career-high single-game record.

Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents

Delaware is now 3-27 all-time versus ranked opponents after its 80-71 victory against Penn State at the BCC on Nov. 17. The Blue Hens are 2-8 versus ranked opponents at home.

Delle Donne Earns Weekly Honors

After averaging 27.5 points and nine rebounds in Delaware's wins against Princeton and William & Mary, Elena Delle Donne collected CAA Co-Player of the Week honors for the third time this season. The junior forward went 21-34 (.618) shooting from the field including 4 of 6 from the three-point range, and also made all nine of her free throws.

Delle Donne was also named CAA Player of the Week and the College Sports Madness Player of the Week on Nov. 14 and Nov. 21.

Lucas Off to Hot Start

Transfer guard Trumae Lucas started her Blue Hen debut in the season opener against Rhode Island, ranking second on the team with 14 points, going 6 of 8 from the field including 2 of 4 from three-point range, and adding two assists and a steal in 19 minutes of action. Lucas continued to impress against Penn State, posting 15 points with some timely three-pointers and going 6 of 6 on the line. She also added four assists and three rebounds.

Miller Returns To Lineup For Hens

Junior point guard Kayla Miller, who missed all of last season following back surgery to repair a herniated disk, returned to the Blue Hen lineup against Rhode Island. Miller dished out six assists, one shy of her career-high, against only one turnover in 16 minutes of action. She also grabbed five rebounds and recorded two steals in the season opening victory.

Buchanan Perfect From Floor vs. Rams

Sophomore forward Kelsey Buchanan did not miss a shot against Rhode Island, going 2 of 2 from the field and 3 of 3 from the free throw line. Buchanan's seven points are tied for second most in her career, as she also scored seven against Vanderbilt last season before contributing nine versus Alcorn State the following night.

Kabongo Turns Up the Heat

Senior guard Vanessa Kabongo stepped up to add a spark and help Delaware stay unbeaten with a hard-fought 64-56 victory over Villanova on Nov. 22 at the The Pavilion.

Kabongo came off the bench to score 10 points, including a jumper just inside the three-point line with 1:07 left. She went 5 of 6 from the field and 2 of 2 on the line in addition to recording a rebound and block.

Blue Hen Captains

Senior Vanessa Kabongo, junior Elena Delle Donne, and sophomore Chelsea Craig have been named captains for the 2011-12 Delaware women's basketball squad.

Preseason Honors Rolling in For Delle Donne

Junior Elena Delle Donne was named an Associated Press Preseason All-American in early November, and has also been selected to the Preseason Wade National Player of the Year Trophy Watch List and Preseason John Wooden Top 30 List. Additionally, Delle Donne was tabbed the CAA Preseason Player of the Year at the league's Media Day in October.

Hens Return Almost Entire Squad

Delaware finished 20-14 last season, made a dramatic run to the CAA Tournament Final, and earned yet another bid to the Postseason WNIT.

The Blue Hens return every player from that squad except for Eva Riddick, who graduated in the spring after contributing 26 points and 72 rebounds. Delaware returns 98.8 percent of its scoring and 94.0 percent of its rebounding from the 2010-11 season.

Hens Ranked 4th in Mid-Major Poll

After a 2-0 week that saw Delaware pick up two road wins with victories of 64-56 at Villanova and 61-49 at previously unbeaten St. Bonaventure, Delaware came in at No. 4 for the second straight week in the latest CollegiateInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 Poll released on November 29.

So How Did You Spend Your Summer?

Elena Delle Donne won a gold medal during hers, as she was a member of the Team USA World University Games squad that went a perfect 6-0 during the international tournament held in Shenzhen, China. She led the U.S. with 15.7 points and 8.5 rebounds per game, and had the second highest three-point percentage with a 44.0 clip. Delle Donne recorded double-doubles against Slovakia and Australia, and narrowly missed a triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 8 assists during the gold medal game victory over Taiwan.

Delle Donne in the UD Record Book

Despite being in the third year of her Blue Hen basketball career, Elena Delle Donne has already made her mark on the Delaware record book. She is the school's career leader with a 29.3 points per game average (Lori Howard is second at 17.7 ppg). She is also UD's career leader with a 91.7 free throw percentage and a 40.0 three-point percentage. She ranks fourth in UD history with 112 three-pointers made and 136 blocks, fifth with 411 free throws made, sixth with 1,507 points, and seventh with 8.7 rebounds per game.

Delle Donne has already reached the 30-point mark 19 times in her career, including a school-record 54 at James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010 and 41 at Yale on Nov. 20, 2010. She is responsible for nine of the ten highest individual scoring games in Delaware history.

Blue Hens Face Tough Non-League Schedule

Tina Martin has put together what she deems is the toughest non-conference schedule in school history. Delaware pulled off the biggest upset in school history as the Blue Hens brought down No. 11 Penn State with an 80-71 victory on Nov. 17, and defeated Big East opponent Villanova on Nov. 22.

Delaware started December off with a 81-70 win at Princeton, while this month also includes road games at ACC foe Wake Forest and Big East opponent Providence. Finally the Blue Hens conclude their non-league slate with an appearance in the Terrapin Classic, which could feature a game with 6th-ranked Maryland.

Martin Winningest Coach in UD History

Delaware head coach Tina Martin has amassed a 284-175 record during her 16 seasons as Delaware, and is the winningest men's or women's basketball coach in school history. Martin earned her record-setting 267th career victory with a 61-51 triumph at Northeastern on January 6, 2011. She surpassed Joyce Perry, who concluded her career with a 266-165 record in 15 seasons.

Delle Donne's Sophomore Campaign

Despite missing 12 games due to Lyme Disease symptoms, Elena Delle Donne still had a stellar sophomore campaign in which she was named honorable mention Associated Press All-American. Delle Donne was also a first team All-CAA and first team CAA All-Academic selection, and was a second team All-East pick.

Delle Donne led Delaware with 25.3 points per game and ranked second with 7.8 rebounds, and set a UD single season record by converting 94.4 percent of her free throw attempts (167 of 177). Her 25.3 points per game are second in a UD single season, while her 557 points and 167 free throws made are third.

Delle Donne became the second fastest player in NCAA history to reach the 1,000-point mark, doing so in her 38th collegiate game against Northeastern on February 3.

Helping Hands

Delaware ranked 329th out of 333 Division I teams last year with just 8.7 assists per game. However the Blue Hens posted 15 assists on 32 baskets against Rhode Island, including a game-high six by Kayla Miller. The 15 assists are more than all but one game during last season (17 at Hofstra on January 30, 2011).

Delaware Basketball on Television

The University of Delaware women's basketball team will appear on television twice during the 2011-12 regular season as announced by the Colonial Athletic Association at the league's Media Day.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on Sunday, January 22 at 3:30 p.m. in a contest that will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic.

Delaware will again appear on TV the following Sunday, Jan. 29, when the Blue Hens take on James Madison in Harrisonburg, Va. at 7 p.m. in a rematch of the 2011 CAA Championship Game.

In that same vein, the Blue Hens ranked 326th in Division I with just 2.8 three-pointers made per game in 2010-11. However Delaware went 7 of 20 from long distance versus the Rams, more three-pointers made than any game last year and the most since UD went 10 of 15 from behind the arc during the 88-83 double overtime loss at James Madison on February 18, 2010.

A Run of Excellence

During the last 12 seasons, Delaware has had a run of success most teams in the nation would be hard-pressed to match. Since the start of the 1999-2000 season the Blue Hens have posted nine 20-win campaigns (UD won 19 games in 2003-04), and have competed in postseason play eight times.

Delaware competed in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2007, while earning WNIT berths in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2010, and 2011.

The Blue Hens won the America East Tournament Championship in 2001, advanced to the CAA Tournament Finals three times, and advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals in five other times. Delaware has gone 247-124 during the last 11 years, a 66.6 percent win percentage.

Head Coach Tina Martin

16th Season at Delaware • Lock Haven '86 • 284-175 Record

One of the most successful coaches in University of Delaware athletics history, Tina Martin begins her 16th season at the helm of the Blue Hen women's basketball team in 2011-12.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was hired May 14, 1996, replacing Joyce Perry who served for 18 years. Martin recently signed a contract extension through the 2013-2014 season.

In 15 seasons, Martin has transformed the Blue Hens into perennial championship contenders, first

in the America East conference, and currently in the Colonial Athletic Association, which Delaware joined beginning with the 2001-02 season.

In those 15 seasons, she has led the teams to a combined record of 284-175 (.619) overall and 174-102 (.630) in regular season league play with the Hens posting nine straight winning seasons through the 2006-07 season. The Hens have posted 20-win seasons in nine of the last 12 seasons and made post-season appearances in eight of the last 11 years, including two in the NCAA and six in the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

On Jan. 6, 2011, Martin became the winningest basketball coach, men's or women's, at the University, earning her 267th career victory with a 61-51 win at Northeastern University. She surpassed Perry, who concluded her coaching career with 266-165 (.617) in just 15 seasons.

The Hens won at least 19 games 10 times in the last 12 seasons and have placed fourth or better in league play all but four times. Delaware advanced to the league championship semifinals or better 10 times in the last 12 years, including an appearance in the CAA Championship game for the third time in 2010-11.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and a 21-8 mark and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. The team's 21-8 mark in 1999-00 was the best season for a Blue Hen team since 1989-90.

But it all came together during the 2000-01 season for the Blue Hens. Martin led an experienced Delaware squad to the finest season in school history. Delaware put together a record of 26-5, setting school records for wins in a season and consecutive victories (17) and cruising to the America East regular season title with a 17-1 record. The Hens moved through the America East Tournament, defeating Boston University and Hartford in the first two rounds and rallying to down host Vermont in the championship game.

That victory gave Delaware its first ever America East title and the team's first conference championship since 1991 and its first program NCAA Tournament appearance. The Blue Hens advanced to the NCAA East Regionals at North Carolina State and hung tough with the 19th ranked Wolfpack before falling 76-57. The Hens also received their first ever votes in the USA Today Top 25 poll during the season.

Among the other milestones during the season included Martin winning the America East Coach of the Year award for the first time and senior guard Cindy Johnson earning All-America East honors for the third straight year. Martin was instrumental in the development of Johnson, a 5-8 guard who became Delaware's all-time leading scorer and was the first UD player to be invited to the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Draft Camp in 2002.

Delaware made it two straight post-season appearances in 2001-02. As first year members of the Colonial Athletic Association, Martin helped guide the Blue Hens to a 23-7 record, the second highest season win total in school history. She was runner-up for league Coach of the Year honors. Delaware placed second in the CAA regular season standings behind nationally-ranked Old Dominion with a 15-3 mark and advanced to the CAA Tournament semifinals. Delaware earned its first ever Women's National Invitational Tournament berth before falling to Atlantic 10 regular season champion George Washington in the opening round, 78-71.

The remarkable string continued in 2002-03 as Martin led an unheralded team to a 22-9 record and a 15-3 league mark, tying Old Dominion for the regular season title. It marked the first time since 1992-93 that the Lady Monarchs did not win the league regular season title outright. The Hens moved through the CAA Tournament before falling to host Old Dominion 66-58 in the championship game. Still, the Hens qualified for the WNIT Tournament for the second straight year, falling to host Saint Joseph's 65-47 in the opening round. Once again, Martin finished as runner-up for CAA Coach of the Year honors. The squad was led by CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year Allison Trapp, who also earned a WNBA tryout following the season.

The 2003-04 team did not reach the 20-win mark, but did enjoy a successful season, going 19-10, placing fourth in the CAA in regular season with a record of 10-8, and advanced to the CAA semifinals before falling to eventual champion Old Dominion in the semifinals.

The 2004-05 team produced one of the finest seasons in school history as Martin led the squad to a 25-6 mark and a 16-2 league mark. The Blue Hens claimed the CAA regular season title and tied the school record for consecutive wins in a season with 17. The Blue Hens ended Old Dominion's 122-game home CAA win streak with their victory in Norfolk in January and then became the first CAA team since the 1992-93 Richmond Spiders to sweep Old Dominion in the regular season before a school record crowd at home. The squad received votes in the USA Today Top 25 Poll over the second half of the season.

The Hens moved through the CAA Tournament before falling to Old Dominion in the CAA Championship game in overtime, 78-74. The Hens did make it back to the post-season though, as

Delaware hosted St. John's in the first round of the WNIT Tournament. Delaware making its third WNIT appearance in the last four years fell to the Red Storm by a score of 48-42. Martin was selected as the CAA Co-Coach of the Year honors, sharing the title with Drexel's Denise Dillon. The squad was led by CAA Player of the Year, Tiara Malcom, third-team All-CAA selection, Tiffany Young, and All-CAA defensive team selection Tyresa Smith.

The winning ways continued in 2005-06 as the Blue Hens posted a record of 22-8, placed third in the CAA regular season standings, and advanced to the CAA Tournament semifinals before falling to James Madison in the final seconds. Delaware still earned its fifth post-season berth in six seasons, advancing to the WNIT for the fourth time before falling to Pittsburgh by a score of 64-57 in the opening round. Smith earned first team All-CAA honors and was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

During the 2006-07 season, Delaware tied the school record with 26 wins and tied the school record for conference wins with 16. The Blue Hens also received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 media poll for the first time in school history. The Hens fell in the CAA semifinals to James Madison but garnered the school's first ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

The Hens fell to Michigan State on the Spartans' home floor 69-58. Smith, who led the team in scoring and was 17th in the nation with 19.8 points per game, was named first team All-CAA and the league's Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight year. Smith became the first Delaware player to be drafted into the WNBA when the Phoenix Mercury selected her with the 18th overall pick. With the Delaware win over Hofstra on January 4, Martin became the quickest basketball coach at Delaware, men's or women's, to reach the 200 victory plateau.

Having graduated three key members of the NCAA Tournament team, the Blue Hens suffered a 7-24 season in 2007-08 before bouncing back and securing a .500 record in 2008-09 of 15-15.

In 2009-10 the Blue Hens returned to dominance with a solid 21-12 season highlighted by CAA semifinal and a first round WNIT appearances. Delaware, who smashed its previous attendance record having seated over 16,000 more than ever before, defeated George Mason in the CAA first round before edging past Drexel, 67-61 in overtime of the quarterfinals. Delaware went on to challenge Old Dominion in the semifinal contest, but fell short of a berth to the championship game as the Hens fell, 50-49, its seventh loss by five points or less that season. UD ended its season having dropped a 67-49 decision to visiting Richmond in the WNIT opening round. Yet another highlight of the 2009-10 campaign was Martin's coaching of Delaware's first ever All-American. Freshman Elena Delle Donne was named to the Associated Press All-America Third Team in conjunction with a slew of other awards after breaking several Delaware and CAA records throughout the season.

After an outstanding season in 2009-10, the Hens went through an up-and-down season after Delle Donne missed 12 games with Lyme disease. Delaware rebounded however, entering the CAA tournament as the No. 7 seed after concluding the league play with a 10-8 record. In the first round, Delaware knocked out Northeastern 74-66, extending its streak over the Huskies to 19 consecutive wins, remaining undefeated against Northeastern in CAA action. The magic continued for Delaware in the quarterfinals, where the Hens halted a 10-game losing skid to Old Dominion, overpowering the second-seeded Monarchs 72-55, earning Delaware spot in the semifinals for the second straight season. In the semis, the Hens avenged a regular season loss to UNC Wilmington, sending the No. 3 Seahawks home with a 62-47 victory. Facing the No. 1 seed, James Madison, in the finals, the Hens gave it their all, but could not complete the spirited run and fell to the defending CAA champions 67-61.

Despite the loss in the finals, Delaware secured 20 wins for the ninth time under Martin, and for the second straight season. The Hens were selected to the WNIT for a second-straight season. With a quick turnaround following the CAA tournament, Delaware made the long trip to Toledo, Ohio to face the University of Toledo for the first time in program history. In a tight defensive battle, Delaware was denied its first-ever post season win, but fought hard against the eventual WNIT Champion, falling 58-55.

Martin, who inherited a team that had suffered three straight losing seasons, led her first Blue Hen hoop team to a 9-19 record in 1996-97. In 1997-98, injuries and youth played a key part in Delaware's 6-21 overall record. The Blue Hens went 3-15 in America East play to place 10th overall and lost to the No. 7 seeded Drexel 68-66 in the first round of the America East Tournament.

As an assistant coach, Martin played a big part in rebuilding a Seton Hall University program that went from three straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven (Pa.) University and was a four time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and two time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87 when she served as graduate assistant, and the next season moved on to Seton Hall. At Seton Hall, Martin assisted Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse. After three straight losing seasons, including a 5-23 mark in 1985-86, the Hall made a steady improvement, and in 1993-94, posted a school-record 27-5 mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

The team finished the season with its first ever national ranking, placing 14th overall. The following season in 1995-96, Martin helped lead the team to a record of 24-9 and yet another NCAA Tournament appearance, advancing to the second round.
