**Postgame Interviews**

Delaware head coach Tina Martin holds a press conference in the BCC Auditorium, room 102, approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and her postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

Selected players will be available as well, usually while Coach Martin is conducting her radio interview. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Quote sheets will be done by the UD Athletics Media Relations staff for both teams, if requested, and will be available in the media room. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

**Non-Gameday Interviews**

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

**Credentials/Press Row**

Requests for press credentials and parking passes should be made to Assistant AD/Media Relations Scott Selheimer. Please make arrangements at least two days in advance of each game. Press row at Bob Carpenter Center/Acierno Arena is located at course side opposite the player and game officials' benches. All press guests are required to show a pass for admittance to the arena. The media entrance is located in the rear of the building (loading dock) on the east side of the Bob Carpenter Center. Parking is located in the rear of the Bob Carpenter Center.

**Series History**

Delaware and Rhode Island have met two prior times, with the teams splitting the pair of meetings. The Rams posted a 58-55 victory on December 7, 1985 at the Fairfield Tournament, while Delaware recorded a 79-66 triumph in Newark on January 11, 1992.

**Delaware in Season Openers**

Delaware is 20-20 all-time in season openers, and the Blue Hens have won their last seven contests to open a season. UD's last defeat in a season opener came to Richmond, 80-78 in overtime, on November 21, 2003.

Since then the Blue Hens have posted season-opening victories over Loyola (Md.), Massachusetts, Villanova, Delaware State, Columbia, St. Francis (Pa.), and UMBC.

**Blue Hens in Home Openers**

Delaware has posted an impressive 29-11 mark in home openers, and the Blue Hens have won 14 of 15 home openers under head coach Tina Martin.

The only home opening loss was the 80-78 overtime loss to Richmonds on November 21, 2003. Delaware has won its last seven home openers since that defeat.

**Delaware vs. the Atlantic 10**

Delaware is 32-45 all-time against teams currently in the Atlantic 10 Conference, with the majority of games coming against Philadelphia schools La Salle, Temple and Saint Joseph's. The Blue Hens have split 20 all-time meetings with the Owls, while going 10-16 against the Explorers and 1-11 versus the Hawks.

Delaware is also 5-0 against Massachusetts, 2-4 against Richmond, 2-1 against Fordham, 1-2 against George Washington, and 1-1 against Rhode Island. The Blue Hens have never faced Duquesne, Dayton, Charlotte, St. Louis, or Xavier, although they will take on Saint Bonaventure for the first time later this month.

**Blue Hen Captains**

Senior Vanessa Kabongo, junior Elena Delle Donne, and sophomore Chelsea Craig have been named captains for the 2011-12 Delaware women's basketball squad.

**Preseason Honors Rolling in For Delle Donne**

Junior Elena Delle Donne was named an Associated Press Preseason All-American last week, and has also been selected to the Preseason Wade National Player of the Year Trophy Watch List and Preseason John Wooden Top 30 List. Additionally, Delle Donne was tabbed the CAA Preseason Player of the Year at the league's Media Day in October.

**Hens Pick Up Vote In AP Preseason Poll**

For the third time in her tenure as head coach, Tina Martin's squad has earned notice in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. The Blue Hens received a vote in the preseason poll announced last week, the only team in the CAA to be recognized. Delaware also received notice in the AP Top 25 polls during the 2006-07 and 2009-10 campaigns. The votes in 2009-10 also occurred in the pre-season poll.

**Hens Return Almost Entire Squad**

Delaware finished 20-14 last season, made a dramatic run to the CAA Tournament Final, and earned yet another bid to the Postseason WNIT.

The Blue Hens return every player from that squad except for Eva Riddick, who graduated in the spring after contributing 26 points and 72 rebounds. Delaware returns 98.8 percent of its scoring and 94.0 percent of its rebounding from the 2010-11 season.

**Delaware 10th in Preseason Mid-Major Poll**

**Miller, Two Transfers Also Return For UD**

In addition to the returning players from last season, Delaware also welcomes back junior point guard Kayla Miller who missed all of last season after back surgery to repair a herniated disk. Miller appeared in 24 games while starting 20 in 2009-10, averaging 3.5 points and 1.8 rebounds per game. She dished out a team-high 74 assists while also posting 27 steals on the year.

Junior Trumae Lucas, a transfer from the University of Florida, and sophomore Akeema Richards, who transferred from West Virginia University, are also eligible for the Blue Hens after sitting out last season. Lucas averaged 5.3 points in 30 appearances for the Gators in 2009-10, while Richards contributed 2.1 points for a West Virginia squad that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Both Lucas and Richards are expected to start in their Blue Hen debuts tonight.

**So How Did You Spend Your Summer?**

Elena Delle Donne won a gold medal during hers, as she was a member of the Team USA World University Games squad that went a perfect 6-0 during the international tournament held in Shenzhen, China. She led the U.S. with 15.7 points and 8.5 rebounds per game, and had the second highest three-point percentage with a 44.0 clip. Delle Donne recorded double-doubles against Slovakia and Australia, and narrowly missed a triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and 8 assists during the gold medal game victory over Taiwan.

**Delle Donne in the UD Record Book**

Despite being just two years into her Blue Hen basketball career, Elena Delle Donne has already made her mark on the Delaware record book. She is the school's career leader with a 26.1 points per game average (Lori Howard is second at 17.7 ppg). Delle Donne is also UD's career leader with a 91.9 free throw percentage and a 38.8 three-point percentage. She ranks fourth in UD history with 102 three-pointers made and 118 blocks, seventh with 361 free throws made, and ninth with 1,331 points and 8.4 rebounds per game.

Delle Donne has already reached the 30-point mark 16 times in her career, including a school-record 54 at James Madison on February

18, 2010 and 41 at Yale on November 20, 2010. She is responsible for eight of the nine highest individual scoring games in Delaware history.

### **Blue Hens Face Tough Non-League Schedule**

Tina Martin has put together what she deems is the toughest non-conference schedule in school history. Following tonight's game the Blue Hens host 12th-ranked Penn State on Thursday, before a trip to Big East opponent Villanova.

Delaware also travels to defending Ivy League champion Princeton in early December, while the month also includes road games at ACC foe Wake Forest and Big East opponent Providence. Finally the Blue Hens conclude their non-league slate with an appearance in the Terrapin Classic, which could feature a game with 11th-ranked Maryland.

### **Martin Winningest Coach in UD History**

Delaware head coach Tina Martin has amassed a 278-175 record during her first 15 seasons as Delaware, and is the winningest men's or women's basketball coach in school history. Martin earned her record-setting 267th career victory with a 61-51 triumph at Northeastern on January 6, 2011. She surpassed Joyce Perry, who concluded her career with a 266-165 record in 15 seasons.

### **Delle Donne's Sophomore Campaign**

Despite missing 12 games due to Lyme Disease symptoms, Elena Delle Donne still had a stellar sophomore campaign in which she was named honorable mention Associated Press All-American. Delle Donne was also a first team All-CAA and first team CAA All-Academic selection, and was a second team All-East pick.

Delle Donne led Delaware with 25.3 points per game and ranked second with 7.8 rebounds, and set a UD single season record by converting 94.4 percent of her free throw attempts (167 of 177). Her 25.3 points per game are second in a UD single season, while her 557 points and 167 free throws made are third.

Delle Donne became the second fastest player in NCAA history to reach the 1,000-point mark, doing so in her 38th collegiate game against Northeastern on February 3.

### **Carra Returns To Delaware Backcourt**

Junior guard Lauren Carra is expected to regain her starting position in the Blue Hen backcourt after earning third team All-CAA honors a year ago. Carra was the only UD player to start all 34 games, leading the team with 85 assists and 48 three-pointers made while ranking second with 10.8 points per contest.

Carra, who enters her junior year ranked seventh in Delaware history with 77 career three-pointers made, reached double figures 21 times last season including 14 straight from December 29 through February 10. She scored a career-high 29 points during a comeback win over Hofstra on January 2.

### **Seniors Kabongo, Bailey Look For Starting Spots**

Seniors Vanessa Kabongo and Jocelyn Bailey, who each started all but one game a year ago, return to a loaded Blue Hen backcourt. Kabongo, who enters her final season ranked 33rd in Delaware history with 757 career points, was second on the team last year with 49 assists while ranking fifth with 6.2 points per game. She reached double figures 10 times on the year, including a season-high 15 points against Vanderbilt on December 29.

Bailey, who missed the Princeton game with an injury but started every other contest during the 2010-11 season, ranked fourth on the Blue Hens with both 7.4 points and 4.9 rebounds per game. She was third in the CAA with an 80.6 free throw percentage, and earned the team's Most Improved Player Award following the season. Bailey reached double figures seven times during the campaign, including a career-high 19 points during the win over Hofstra on January 2.

### **May, McLean Also Return To Backcourt**

Junior Jaquetta May and senior Meghan McLean will also look to earn playing time in the backcourt.

May appeared in all but two games a year ago while making a start against Princeton, averaging 4.5 points and 3.1 rebounds per game. She was fourth on the squad with 28 assists and fifth with 33 steals, and posted a career-high 16 points against Alcorn State on December 30.

McLean played in all but four games for the Blue Hens a year ago, averaging 1.3 points and 1.0 rebounds. She poured in a career-high nine points on three three-pointers during the CAA Tournament First Round victory over Northeastern.

### **Parker To Again Lead Blue Hen Frontcourt**

Junior Danielle Parker is expected to start in the Delaware frontcourt after appearing in all 34 games while starting 32 last season. Parker, who enters her junior year tied for 20th in Delaware history with 501 career rebounds, led UD and ranked sixth in the CAA with 7.9 boards per game in 2010-11.

Parker, who also ranked among the league's top 10 in offensive rebounds and defensive rebounds, posted nine double-doubles on the season. Her 270 rebounds are sixth most in a UD single season, and she was third on the team with 8.1 points per contest.

### **Acker, Buchanan, Craig Look To Contribute Inside**

Senior Sarah Acker will battle for a starting position after playing in all but four games a year ago and making four starts. She ranked third on the Blue Hens with 5.0 rebounds and sixth with 5.1 points and shot 56.6 percent from the field, the second highest percentage in a UD single season. Acker was also second on the Blue Hens with 34 blocked shots, while her 1.1 blocks per game ranked sixth in the league.

Buchanan saw action in 23 games while making two starts as a freshman, averaging 2.1 points and 2.1 rebounds per game. She scored a career-high nine points against Alcorn State.

Craig, a team co-captain as just a sophomore, appeared in 10 games a year ago, contributing four points and four rebounds.

### **A Run of Excellence**

During the last 12 seasons, Delaware has had a run of success most teams in the nation would be hard-pressed to match. Since the start of the 1999-2000 season the Blue Hens have posted nine 20-win campaigns (UD won 19 games in 2003-04), and have competed in postseason play eight times.

Delaware competed in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2007, while earning WNIT berths in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2010, and 2011.

The Blue Hens won the America East Tournament Championship in 2001, advanced to the CAA Tournament Finals three times, and advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals in five other times. Delaware has gone 247-124 during the last 11 years, a 66.6 percent win percentage.

### **Delaware Basketball on the Net**

Box scores and game stories are typically posted within an hour of the conclusion of each UD basketball game, while cumulative statistics are also updated and posted after each contest. Media notes are available in a PDF format within 24 hours of the start of each game. In addition, livestats and video are available for all UD home games.

### **Delaware Basketball on the Radio**

All University of Delaware women's basketball games will be carried on The Ticket, 1290 AM. John Sadak (play-by-play) and Matt Janus (color) will call all the action. Additionally, most UD women's basketball games are broadcast by the UD student radio station, WVUD 91.3 FM. Real Audio links for both broadcasts are available through the UD Web site.

### **Delaware Basketball on Television**

The University of Delaware women's basketball team will appear on television twice during the 2011-12 regular season as announced by the Colonial Athletic Association at the league's Media Day.

The Blue Hens will host Drexel on Sunday, January 22 at 3:30 p.m. in a contest that will be televised by Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia and Mid-Atlantic.

Delaware will again appear on TV the following Sunday, January 29, when the Blue Hens take on James Madison in Harrisonburg, Va. at 7 p.m. in a rematch of the 2011 CAA Championship Game.

### **Tom Lochner Named Assistant Coach**

Former La Salle head coach Tom Lochner was named a Blue Hen assistant coach in July. Lochner replaced Mark McCaleb, who spent one season on the UD bench before leaving after the 2010-11 season.

He served on the basketball staff for 23 seasons at La Salle, including the final six as head coach as he put together a record of 72-101. He was first hired as a volunteer assistant for the 1987-88 season under John Miller before being promoted to assistant head coach in 1989 and then associate head coach in 1998. He became the head coach in August, 2004, replacing Miller who resigned.

Lochner enjoyed his finest season as head coach at La Salle in 2006-07 when he led the Explorers to 19 wins, the most by the school in over a decade, and earned Big Five Coach of the Year honors. The team started out 7-0 to tie a school record, won nine games on the road for the first time since 1991-92, and matched the school's best ever home mark at Tom Gola Arena with a record of 10-3.

# Head Coach Tina Martin

16th Season at Delaware • Lock Haven '86 • 278-175 Record

One of the most successful coaches in University of Delaware athletics history, Tina Martin begins her 16th season at the helm of the Blue Hen women's basketball team in 2011-12.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was hired May 14, 1996, replacing Joyce Perry who served for 18 years. Martin recently signed a contract extension through the 2013-2014 season.

In 15 seasons, Martin has transformed the Blue Hens into perennial championship contenders, first in the America East conference, and currently in the Colonial Athletic Association, which Delaware joined beginning with the 2001-02 season.

In those 15 seasons, she has led the teams to a combined record of 278-175 (.614) overall and 168-102 (.622) in regular season league play with the Hens posting nine straight winning seasons through the 2006-07 season. The Hens have posted 20-win seasons in nine of the last 12 seasons and made post-season appearances in eight of the last 11 years, including two in the NCAA and six in the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

On Jan. 6, 2011, Martin became the winningest basketball coach, men's or women's, at the University, earning her 267th career victory with a 61-51 win at Northeastern University. She surpassed Perry, who concluded her coaching career with 266-165 (.617) in just 15 seasons.

The Hens won at least 19 games 10 times in the last 12 seasons and have placed fourth or better in league play all but four times. Delaware advanced to the league championship semifinals or better 10 times in the last 12 years, including an appearance in the CAA Championship game for the third time in 2010-11.

After a 6-21 campaign in 1997-98, Martin led the Blue Hens to a 16-11 record in 1998-99 and a 21-8 mark and a trip to the America East semifinals in 1999-2000. The team's 21-8 mark in 1999-00 was the best season for a Blue Hen team since 1989-90.

But it all came together during the 2000-01 season for the Blue Hens. Martin led an experienced Delaware squad to the finest season in school history. Delaware put together a record of 26-5, setting school records for wins in a season and consecutive victories (17) and cruising to the America East regular season title with a 17-1 record. The Hens moved through the America East Tournament, defeating Boston University and Hartford in the first two rounds and rallying to down host Vermont in the championship game.

That victory gave Delaware its first ever America East title and the team's first conference championship since 1991 and its first program NCAA Tournament appearance. The Blue Hens advanced to the NCAA East Regionals at North Carolina State and hung tough with the 19th ranked Wolfpack before falling 76-57. The Hens also received their first ever votes in the USA Today Top 25 poll during the season.

Among the other milestones during the season included Martin winning the America East Coach of the Year award for the first time and senior guard Cindy Johnson earning All-America East honors for the third straight year. Martin was instrumental in the development of Johnson, a 5-8 guard who became Delaware's all-time leading scorer and was the first UD player to be invited to the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Draft Camp in 2002.

Delaware made it two straight post-season appearances in 2001-02. As first year members of the Colonial Athletic Association, Martin helped guide the Blue Hens to a 23-7 record, the second highest season win total in school history. She was runner-up for league Coach of the Year honors. Delaware placed second in the CAA regular season standings behind nationally-ranked Old Dominion with a 15-3 mark and advanced to the CAA Tournament semifinals. Delaware earned its first ever Women's National Invitational Tournament berth before falling to Atlantic 10 regular season champion George Washington in the opening round, 78-71.

The remarkable string continued in 2002-03 as Martin led an unheralded team to a 22-9 record and a 15-3 league mark, tying Old Dominion for the regular season title. It marked the first time since 1992-93 that the Lady Monarchs did not win the league regular season title outright. The Hens moved through the CAA Tournament before falling to host Old Dominion 66-58 in the championship game. Still, the Hens qualified for the WNIT Tournament for the second straight year, falling to host Saint Joseph's 65-47 in the opening round. Once again, Martin finished as runner-up for CAA Coach of the Year honors. The squad was led by CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year Allison Trapp, who also earned a WNBA tryout following the season.

The 2003-04 team did not reach the 20-win mark, but did enjoy a successful season, going 19-10, placing fourth in the CAA in regular season with a record of 10-8, and advanced to the CAA semifinals before falling to eventual champion Old Dominion in the semifinals.

The 2004-05 team produced one of the finest seasons in school history as Martin led the squad to a 25-6 mark and a 16-2 league mark. The Blue Hens claimed the CAA regular season title and tied the school record for consecutive wins in a season with 17. The Blue Hens ended Old Dominion's 122-game home CAA win streak with their victory in Norfolk in January and then became the first CAA team since the 1992-93 Richmond Spiders to sweep Old Dominion in the regular season before a school record crowd at home. The squad received votes in the USA Today Top 25 Poll over the second half of the season.

The Hens moved through the CAA Tournament before falling to Old Dominion in the CAA Championship game in overtime, 78-74. The Hens did make it back to the post-season though, as Delaware hosted St. John's in the first round of the WNIT Tournament. Delaware making its third WNIT appearance in the last four years fell to the Red Storm by a score of 48-42. Martin was selected as the CAA Co-Coach of the Year

honors, sharing the title with Drexel's Denise Dillion. The squad was led by CAA Player of the Year, Tiara Malcom, third-team All-CAA selection, Tiffany Young, and All-CAA defensive team selection Tyresa Smith.

The winning ways continued in 2005-06 as the Blue Hens posted a record of 22-8, placed third in the CAA regular season standings, and advanced to the CAA Tournament semifinals before falling to James Madison in the final seconds. Delaware still earned its fifth post-season berth in six seasons, advancing to the WNIT for the fourth time before falling to Pittsburgh by a score of 64-57 in the opening round. Smith earned first team All-CAA honors and was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year.

During the 2006-07 season, Delaware tied the school record with 26 wins and tied the school record for conference wins with 16. The Blue Hens also received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 media poll for the first time in school history. The Hens fell in the CAA semifinals to James Madison but garnered the school's first ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

The Hens fell to Michigan State on the Spartans' home floor 69-58. Smith, who led the team in scoring and was 17th in the nation with 19.8 points per game, was named first team All-CAA and the league's Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight year. Smith became the first Delaware player to be drafted into the WNBA when the Phoenix Mercury selected her with the 18th overall pick. With the Delaware win over Hofstra on January 4, Martin became the quickest basketball coach at Delaware, men's or women's, to reach the 200 victory plateau.

Having graduated three key members of the NCAA Tournament team, the Blue Hens suffered a 7-24 season in 2007-08 before bouncing back and securing a .500 record in 2008-09 of 15-15.

In 2009-10 the Blue Hens returned to dominance with a solid 21-12 season highlighted by CAA semifinal and a first round WNIT appearances. Delaware, who smashed its previous attendance record having seated over 16,000 more than ever before, defeated George Mason in the CAA first round before edging past Drexel, 67-61 in overtime of the quarterfinals. Delaware went on to challenge Old Dominion in the semifinal contest, but fell short of a berth to the championship game as the Hens fell, 50-49, its seventh loss by five points or less that season. UD ended its season having dropped a 67-49 decision to visiting Richmond in the WNIT opening round. Yet another highlight of the 2009-10 campaign was Martin's coaching of Delaware's first ever All-American. Freshman Elena Delle Donne was named to the Associated Press All-America Third Team in conjunction with a slew of other awards after breaking several Delaware and CAA records throughout the season.

After an outstanding season in 2009-10, the Hens went through an up-and-down season after Delle Donne missed 12 games with Lyme disease. Delaware rebounded however, entering the CAA tournament as the No. 7 seed after concluding the league play with a 10-8 record. In the first round, Delaware knocked out Northeastern 74-66, extending its streak over the Huskies to 19 consecutive wins, remaining undefeated against Northeastern in CAA action. The magic continued for Delaware in the quarterfinals, where the Hens halted a 10-game losing skid to Old Dominion, overpowering the second-seeded Monarchs 72-55, earning Delaware spot in the semifinals for the second straight season. In the semis, the Hens avenged a regular season loss to UNC Wilmington, sending the No. 3 Seahawks home with a 62-47 victory. Facing the No. 1 seed, James Madison, in the finals, the Hens gave it their all, but could not complete the spirited run and fell to the defending CAA champions 67-61.

Despite the loss in the finals, Delaware secured 20 wins for the ninth time under Martin, and for the second straight season. The Hens were selected to the WNIT for a second-straight season. With a quick turnaround following the CAA tournament, Delaware made the long trip to Toledo, Ohio to face the University of Toledo for the first time in program history. In a tight defensive battle, Delaware was dented its first-ever post season win, but fought hard against the eventual WNIT Champion, falling 58-55.

Martin, who inherited a team that had suffered three straight losing seasons, led her first Blue Hen hoop team to a 9-19 record in 1996-97. In 1997-98, injuries and youth played a key part in Delaware's 6-21 overall record. The Blue Hens went 3-15 in America East play to place 10th overall and lost to the No. 7 seeded Drexel 68-66 in the first round of the America East Tournament.

As an assistant coach, Martin played a big part in rebuilding a Seton Hall University program that went from three straight losing seasons to one that made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 1994 and 1995 under head coach Phyllis Mangina. The 1993-94 team went 27-5 and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16, the best season in Seton Hall history.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American at Lock Haven (Pa.) University and was a four time Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference All-Star and two time league Player of the Year. She finished as the PSAC's all-time leading scorer with 2,157 points and had her number (33) retired at Lock Haven.

Martin began her coaching career at Lock Haven in 1986-87 when she served as graduate assistant, and the next season moved on to Seton Hall. At Seton Hall, Martin assisted Mangina in building the Pirate program into a Big East powerhouse. After three straight losing seasons, including a 5-23 mark in 1985-86, the Hall made a steady improvement, and in 1993-94, posted a school-record 27-5 mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

The team finished the season with its first ever national ranking, placing 14th overall. The following season in 1995-96, Martin helped lead the team to a record of 24-9 and yet another NCAA Tournament appearance, advancing to the second round.
