Postgame Interviews

Delaware head coach Tina Martin holds a press conference in the BCC Auditorium, room 102, approximately 10 minutes after the game following a cooling off period and her postgame show with the Blue Hen Basketball Radio Network.

Selected players will be available as well, usually while Coach Martin is conducting her radio interview. The University of Delaware locker room is closed to members of the media during regular season competition.

Quote sheets will be done by the UD Athletics Media Relations staff for both teams, if requested, and will be available in the media room. Pregame interview requests for players or assistant coaches should also be made prior to gameday. Approval is on a case-by-case basis.

Non-Gameday Interviews

All requests to interview players or coaches during the week should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and at least one day in advance so that academic or athletic schedules are not disrupted.

Credentials/Press Row

Requests for press credentials and parking passes should be made to Assistant AD/Media Relations Scott Selheimer. Please make arrangements at least two days in advance of each game. Press row at Bob Carpenter Center/Acierno Arena is located at courtside opposite the player and game officials' benches. All press guests are required to show a pass for admittance to the arena. The media entrance is located in the rear of the building (loading dock) on the east side of the Bob Carpenter Center. Parking is located in the rear of the Bob Carpenter Center.

Hens Off to Best Start in Program History

Delaware's 10-0 start set the all-time team record for the most consecutive wins to start the season. Prior to this season, the Hens had started out with five straight wins just twice, breaking out to perfect 5-0 starts in 1992-93 and last season. Delaware's hot streak was cut short when the Hens fell 85-76 to #5 Maryland on Dec. 29 in the Terrapin Classic Championships, falling to 10-1 on the season.

The Hens' 23-1 start also marks the best start in school history with the most wins through the first 24 games of the season. Delaware reached the 20-win mark for the third straight season following the Hens' victory over VCU on Feb. 5. The Hens registered their second 10-game win streak of the season and reached the 20-win mark in just 21 games, the fastest to that mark in UD history. The Hens have won 20 or more games in 10 of the last 13 seasons, all under 16th year head coach Tina Martin.

Delle Donne Surpasses 2,000 Career Points

Elena Delle Donne, UD's all-time scoring leader, erupted for a season-high 42 points and surpassed the 2,000-point mark for her career as the No. 10/9 University of Delaware women's basketball team remained unbeaten in CAA play with an 89-79 victory over Hofstra on Feb. 16. The first in Delaware women's basketball history to join the 2,000 point club, Delle Donne also became the fastest player in CAA history to reach that mark, doing so in just 75 games.

Delle Donne became the school's all-time career scoring leader on Jan. 5 as UD cruised past Towson, 74-51 CAA. The record was previously held by Cindy Johnson, who scored 1,675 points from 1997-01. It took Johnson 113 games to reach her career points total, while it took Delle Donne just 63 games. Delle Donne, now with 1,979 career points, sits just 21 points away from breaking the 2,000 point mark.

Hens Crack Top 10 in National Rankings

UD cracked the Associated Press Top 25 poll this season for the first time in school history. The Hens, who earned 117 points in the media poll announced Nov. 28, ranked No. 24 after a 2-0 week that saw UD pick up wins at Villanova and St. Bonaventure. UD climbed the rankings in each week's poll before peaking at No. 10 in the most recent AP poll and No. 9 in this week's USA Today/ESPN poll.

The Hens became the 149th school to land in the poll, while Tina Martin marks the 245th head women's coach to guide a team into the rankings. This is the third time in Martin's tenure her squad has earned notice in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. The Blue Hens also received notice in the AP Top 25 polls during the 2006-07 and 2009-10 campaigns. UD is only the third school to earn a national ranking as a CAA member following Old Dominion and JMU.

Delle Donne, Hens Among Nation's Leaders

The Division I NCAA statistics released on Feb. 17 featured Elena Delle Donne leading the nation with 28.8 ppg. The junior has ranked first in scoring throughout the entire 2011-12 season. She was also fourth with a 90.4 free throw %, 17th with 2.8 blocks per game, and 18th with 10.42 rebounds per game and a 53.3 field goal %.

Additionally, the Hens ranked first in the nation with an 81.7 free throw %, 11th with a +10.1 rebound margin and a 44.9 field goal %, and 12th with a 16.8 scoring margin.

Glass Crashers

Delaware has outrebounded opponents 1,023-749 in its 24 games this season and ranks 11th in the nation with a margin of +10.1. UD set a school record on Jan. 8 when they posted a +30 margin over George Mason, outrebounding the Patriots 49-19. The 19 rebounds allowed by the Hens were the fewest allowed since holding Drexel to just 19 on Jan. 3, 2003. In their showdown vs. East Carolina, UD held a 55-34 rebounding advantage over the Pirates, including a 17-4 offensive rebounding edge. The 55 rebounds were the most by UD since grabbing 56 against Saint Francis (Pa.) on Nov. 23, 2010.

Quick Starts Propel Hens

Delaware has jumped out to at least a 4-0 lead in 12 games this season, including leads of 14-0 vs. Princeton, 11-0 vs. St. Bonaventure, and 10-0 vs. Drexel. The Hens have outscored opponents by a combined 227-110 margin before the first media timeout.

Blue Hens Face Tough Non-League Schedule

The Hens went 9-1 in what Tina Martin deemed was the toughest non-conference schedule in school history. Delaware pulled off the biggest upset in school history as the Blue Hens brought down then-No. 11 Penn State with an 80-71 victory on Nov. 17, and defeated Big East opponent Villanova on Nov. 22.

Delaware started December off with a 81-70 win at Princeton, and continued with the Blue Hens' first-ever victory over an ACC foe at Wake Forest. The Hens defeated Big East opponent Providence 68-47, and concluded their non-league slate with an appearance in the Terrapin Classic, where the Blue Hens picked up their only loss of the season to then 5th-ranked Maryland in the championship game.

Overall, Delaware's non-conference opponents have a combined record of 147-98 on the season and feature three teams ranked in the most recent AP Top 25 Poll, including #8 Maryland, #12 Penn State, and #22 St. Bonaventure.

Hens Stun No. 11 PSU

The Blue Hens made history by defeating their highest ranked opponent in school history 80-71 at the BCC on Nov. 17. Delaware's 80 points against Penn State was the second highest total for the Blue Hens in the 19-year history of the BCC and the most since a 91-68 win over Morgan State on Dec. 20, 1999.

The Hens had knocked off a Top 25 team just two other times in school history in 28 previous tries, including an 86-70 win over No. 20 Kentucky during the 2006-07 season and a 77-67 victory over No. 22 James Madison at the BCC on Feb. 22, 2007.

Delaware Rolls Over Powerhouse Conferences

Delaware's victories over Penn State, Villanova, Wake Forest, St. Bonaventure, Providence, and Rhode Island made the Blue Hens the only team in Colonial Athletic Association history to have defeated a Big Ten, Big East, ACC, and Atlantic 10 opponent in the same season. CAA foe Old Dominion University has also rolled over multiple powerhouse conference teams in the same season, including victories over Georgia Tech (ACC), Louisville (Big East), George Washington (Atlantic 10), and Charlotte (Atlantic 10) last season.

Blue Hens Attendance Skyrocketing

The University of Delaware women's basketball team has attracted a significant increase in attendance this season as the Blue Hens hold a perfect 10-0 mark in the Bob Carpenter Center. Delaware is averaging 3,701 fans per game, an increase of 66.9 percent from 2010-11 when the Hens brought in an average crowd of 2,191 per contest.

Delaware's home game vs. Drexel on Jan. 22 was played in front of a sellout crowd of 5,021 that included Vice-President Joe Biden and Delaware Gov. Jack Markell. The crowd set a UD single game home attendance record for the Blue Hen women for a game that was not part of a doubleheader. It broke the previous record of 4,772 set vs. Old Dominion on Feb. 11, 2005.

Delaware ranks first in the Colonial Athletic Association averaging 3,701 fans per game, and ranks 26th overall in NCAA Division I women's basketball home games. Overall, the Hens have accumulated 37,011 fans through their 10 home games this season, and are on pace to surpass the record-setting 39,002 total home fans set during the 2009-10 season when Delaware averaged 2,786 fans per home game.

Martin Takes Home 300th Career Win

Delaware head coach Tina Martin has amassed a 301-176 record during her 16 seasons at Delaware, and is the winningest men's or women's basketball coach in school history. Martin earned her record-setting 300th career victory as the Blue Hens cruised past Georgia State, 94-56, on Feb. 12. Delaware's 94 points were the most ever under Martin and marked the Hens' highest total since a 94-90 overtime win over Bucknell on Feb. 21, 1989 and the most points in a regulation game since a 95-47 Delaware victory over Loyola (Md.) on Dec. 28, 1986.

Martin notched her 267th career victory to become the winningest coach in Delaware basketball history with a 61-51 triumph at Northeastern on January 6, 2011. She surpassed Joyce Perry, who concluded her career with a 266-165 record in 15 seasons.

Martin Second in CAA Victories

With the Blue Hens' 89-79 victory at Hofstra on Feb. 16, Tina Martin notched her 146th Colonial Athletic Association win to remain second on the all-time wins list for CAA women's basketball coaches. She is joined by three additional current CAA coaches in the top 10 list, including Kenny Brooks of James Madison, Beth Cunningham of VCU, and Denise Dillon of Drexel University.

Hens Hit Longest CAA Win Streak

Delaware's unbeaten 14-0 Colonial Athletic Association record marks the longest CAA winning streak in program history. Prior to joining the CAA, Delaware had won 24 straight America East games over two seasons from 2/3/00 to 2/24/01, setting the longest overall conference winning streak.

The Hens are also just two wins away from tying the most regular season CAA wins in program history. Delaware set the record at 16 during the 2004-05 and 2006-07 seasons, when the Hens went 16-2 each year in regular season CAA action.

Delle Donne in the UD Record Book

Despite being in the third year of her Blue Hen basketball career, Elena Delle Donne has already made her mark on the Delaware record book. She is the school's all-time career scoring leader with 2,021 points and a 26.9 points per game average (Lori Howard is second at 17.7 ppg), a 91.4 free throw percentage, and a 39.9 three-point percentage. Delle Donne also ranks second with 531 free throws made and 184 blocks, third with 136 three-pointers made, and seventh with 9.0 rebounds per game.

Delle Donne has already reached the 30-point mark 24 times in her career, including a school-record 54 at James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010, 42 at Hofstra on Feb. 16, 2012, 41 at Yale on Nov. 20, 2010, and 41 vs. Hofstra on Jan. 26, 2012 when she set a BCC scoring record. She is responsible for 13 of the 14 highest individual scoring games in Delaware history.

Delle Donne in the CAA Record Book

Elena Delle Donne's stellar run as a Blue Hen has landed her in the all-time Colonial Athletic Association record book. She currently ranks fifth in CAA scoring history with 2,021 career points and 531 free throws made, and seventh with 184 career blocks.

Delle Donne Earns Weekly Honors

Elena Delle Donne was selected the U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Player of the Week and NetScouts National Player of the Week after averaging 38.5 points and 12.0 rebounds per outing in a 2-0 week that saw CAA victories over Towson and George Mason. She also collected CAA Player of the Week accolades for the seventh time this season and the 15th time in her three-year career on Feb. 6. The junior averaged 25.5 points and 13.0 rebounds per game in back-to-back double-doubles and added team highs of five blocks and three steals to go along with six assists on the week.

She was also named CAA Player of the Week on Nov. 14, Nov. 21, Dec. 5, Jan. 2, Jan. 9, and Jan. 30, and the College Sports Madness Player of the Week on Nov. 14, Nov. 21, Jan. 23, Jan. 30, & Feb. 5.

Hens Feature Young Starting Lineup

Of the NCAA Division I teams ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll, Delaware is the only school to have one or less senior start throughout the season. Senior Jocelyn Bailey started in just one game for the now No. 10 Blue Hens, at Northeastern on Jan. 15. By comparison, No. 1 Baylor has accumulated five senior starts by Terran Condrety for the second lowest amount of starts by seniors in the nation's Top 25. No. 25 South Carolina has had the most senior starts with 96, while Gonzaga (rv) has had 78 on the season.

Among CAA opponents, only UNCW has had less senior start than the Blue Hens, as the Seahawks have yet to start a senior all season. Towson has the most senior starts in the conference, totaling 76 among five seniors throughout the year.

Parker Produces in Paint

Junior forward Danielle Parker has started all 24 games this season and currently leads the Blue Hens with 31 steals. She also ranks second on the team with 7.7 rebounds per game and third with 8.7 points per game. She has reached double figures 12 times, including a double-double at Hofstra when she scored 14 points and pulled down 11 rebounds, a double-double at George Mason on Jan. 8 when she scored 10 points and a season-high 14 rebounds, and a double-double at Northeastern on Jan. 15 when she scored a season-high 13 points to go with 10 rebounds. Parker also narrowly missed a double-double with nine points and 12 rebounds at St. Bonaventure, and fell just short of a double-double with 10 rebounds and eight points vs. ECU.

Parker currently ranks third in the CAA with a 53.0 field goal percentage, seventh with 7.7 rebounds per game, eighth with 3.0 offensive rebounds per game, and 10th with 4.8 defensive rebounds per game.

Carra Hot from Deep

Junior guard Lauren Carra scored a season-high 22 points as she drained her 100th career three-pointer during the Hens' 72-65 victory at James Madison on Jan. 29. She currently ranks fifth in Blue Hen history with 108 career three-pointers made and 10th with a 31.2 three-point percentage. After scoring 19 points and reaching double-digits for the 13th time of the season on Feb. 12, Carra ranks second for the Blue Hens with 9.8 points per game. She also ranks fourth in the CAA with an 79.7 free throw % and 13th with 1.3 three-pointers made per game this season.

Carra also scored 16 points during the Blue Hens' 84-66 victory over Hofstra on Jan. 26, and matched one of her best games of the season during the win at Towson on Jan. 19 as she scored a team-leading 15 points for Delaware, tied season highs with six rebounds and four assists, and knocked down a career high-tying four three-pointers in a single game for the sixth time in her three-year Blue Hen career.

Lucas Handles Point Guard Duties

Transfer guard Trumae Lucas started her Blue Hen debut in the season opener against Rhode Island, ranking second on the team with 14 points, going 6 of 8 from the field including 2 of 4 from three-point range, and adding two assists and a steal in 19 minutes of action. Lucas continued to impress against Penn State, posting 15 points with some timely three-pointers and going 6 of 6 on the line. She also added four assists and three rebounds.

Lucas reached double figures for the fifth time this season by scoring 15 points at Hofstra. She currently leads the Hens with 83 assists and ranks third with 7.0 points per game. Lucas also ranks third in the CAA with a 1.4 assist/turnover ratio and 10th with 3.5 assists per game.

Richards Hitting Her Stride with Hens

Sophomore guard Akeema Richards recorded her first career double-double with career-highs of 14 points and 10 rebounds against Drexel at the Bob Carpenter Center on January 22. She also tied a season-high four assists during the win.

Richards, who has reached double figures five times this season, currently ranks second for the Blue Hens with 28 steals and fourth with 46 assists.

Miller Returns To Lineup For Hens

Junior point guard Kayla Miller, who missed all of last season following back surgery to repair a herniated disk, returned to the Blue Hen lineup in the season-opener against Rhode Island. Miller dished out six assists, one shy of her career-high, against only one turnover in 16 minutes of action. She also grabbed five rebounds and recorded two steals in the season opening victory. Miller currently ranks third on the Blue Hens with 53 assists.

Miss Assisters

The Blue Hens have shared the ball well with 337 assists in their first 23 games this season, compared to just 216 assists by their opponents. Delaware held an 18-1 assist advantage over East Carolina, a 19-2 advantage over UNCW, and a 17-4 advantage vs. Towson.

Delaware currently ranks 17th in the nation with a 1.05 assist-turnover ratio. Trumae Lucas leads the Blue Hens with 83 assists on the season, while Elena Delle Donne ranks second with 60 assists. Lucas also ranks 10th in the CAA with 3.5 assists per game.

Last year, the Hens ranked last in the CAA with 8.7 assists per game. This year, Delaware ranks second in the league and 46th in the nation with 14.6 assists per game.

Double-Digit Dip

Of the Blue Hens' 23 wins this season, 19 have come by double digits, including a 38-point victory at Georgia State, a 36-point win against Rhode Island in the season-opener, and 32-point victories over Yale and UNCW. The Hens, a perfect 10-0 at home this season, have recorded double-digit wins in nine out of their 10 home games at the Bob Carpenter Center. Additionally, the Hens have posted double-digit wins in 12 of this season's conference games, including a 38-point win over Georgia State, 23-point and 19-point wins over Towson, and a 19-point win over VCU.

Delle Donne Continues to Roll

Preseason All-American Elena Delle Donne opened her season with a bang, scoring 33 points and grabbing six rebounds in the Blue Hens' 89-53 season opening win over Rhode Island.

Delle Donne continued her hot streak against Penn State, scoring 40 points, pulling down 12 rebounds, and blocking four shots. Her 40 points set a BCC record and was the third highest total in school history, trailing only her school-record 54-point performance at James Madison on Feb. 18, 2010 and her 41-point explosion against Yale on Nov. 20, 2010. She also grabbed a season-high 18 rebounds in the win at St. Bonaventure on Nov. 27, tying her career-high single-game record.

Delle Donne became the sixth Delaware player to reach the 1,500 career point mark during the match-up vs. William & Mary on a second half free throw. In the Hens' showdown at Maryland, Delle Donne netted 32 points to go with seven rebounds and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

In UD's victory over Towson on Jan. 5, Delle Donne poured in a game-high 37 points as she set the all-time school scoring record, surpassing the previous record of 1,675 career points previously set by Cindy Johnson from 1997-01. Delle Donne matched once of her best games as she scored 40 points to go with 15 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season at George Mason. Breaking her own record of 40 points set vs. PSU at the BCC, Delle Donne scored a season-high 41 points during the win vs. Hofstra as she set the BCC scoring record for the most points in a single game.

The junior recorded a double-double with game-highs of 29 points and 14 rebounds during the win at UNCW on Feb. 2 as she went 11 of 22 from the field and added a team-high four assists, three blocks, and two steals on the day. She recorded her eighth double-double of the season on Feb. 5 during the win over VCU when she scored 22 points to go with 12 boards.

Delle Donne surpassed 2,000 career points erupted for a season-high 42 points at Hofstra on Feb. 16 en route to a double-double that also included 14 rebounds and a season-high six blocks.

Delaware vs. Ranked Opponents

Delaware is now 3-28 all-time versus ranked opponents after its 80-71 victory against then No. 11 Penn State at the Bob Carpenter Center on Nov. 17 and its 85-76 loss to then No. 5 Maryland in the Terrapin Classic on Dec. 29. The Blue Hens are 2-8 versus ranked opponents at home.

So How Did You Spend Your Summer?

Elena Delle Donne won a gold medal during hers, as she was a member of the Team USA World University Games squad that went a perfect 6-0 during the international tournament held in Shenzhen, China. Delle Donne was honored with a plaque during the pre-game events vs. UNCW at the BCC on January 12 for her contributions to the U.S. team, which she led with 15.7 points and 8.5 rpg, and had the second highest three-point percentage with a 44.0 clip. She recorded double-doubles against Slovakia and Australia, and narrowly missed a triple-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds and eight assists during the gold medal game victory over Taiwan.

Preseason Honors Rolling in For Delle Donne

Junior Elena Delle Donne was named an Associated Press Preseason All-American in early November, and has also been selected to the Preseason Wade National Player of the Year Trophy Watch List, Preseason John Wooden Top 30 List, and Naismith Early-Season National Player of the Year Watch List. Additionally, Delle Donne was tabbed the CAA Preseason Player of the Year at the league's Media Day in October.

A Run of Excellence

During the last 12 seasons, Delaware has had a run of success most teams in the nation would be hard-pressed to match. Since the start of the 1999-2000 season the Blue Hens have posted 10 20-win campaigns (UD won 19 games in 2003-04), and have competed in postseason play eight times.

Delaware competed in the NCAA Tournament in 2001 and 2007, and earned WNIT berths in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2010, and 2011.

The Blue Hens won the America East Tournament Championship in 2001, advanced to the CAA Tournament Finals three times, and advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals in five other times. Delaware has gone 247-124 during the last 11 years, a 66.6 percent win percentage.

Head Coach Tina Martin

16th Season at Delaware • Lock Haven '86 • 301-176 Record

One of the most successful coaches in University of Delaware athletics history, Tina Martin begins her 16th season at the helm of the Blue Hen women's basketball team in 2011-12.

A native of Williamsport, Pa., Martin was hired May 14, 1996, replacing Joyce Perry who served for 18 years. Martin recently signed a contract extension through the 2013-2014 season.

In 15 seasons, Martin has transformed the Blue Hens into perennial championship contenders, first in the America East conference, and currently in the Colonial Athletic Association, which Delaware joined beginning with the 2001-02 season.

In those 15 seasons, she has led the teams to a combined record of 301-176 (.631) overall and 191-103 (.650) in regular season league play with the Hens posting nine straight winning seasons through the 2006-07 season. The Hens have posted 20-win seasons in 10 of the last 13 seasons and made post-season appearances in eight of the last 11 years, including two in the NCAA and six in the Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Martin earned her 300th career win and 145th CAA victory on Feb. 12, 2012 during the win over Georgia State in Atlanta. On Jan. 6, 2011, Martin became the winningest basketball coach, men's or women's, at the University, earning her 267th career victory with a 61-51 win at Northeastern University. She surpassed Perry, who concluded her coaching career with 266-165 (.617) in just 15 seasons.

The Hens won at least 19 games 11 times in the last 13 seasons and have placed fourth or better in league play all but four times. Delaware advanced to the league championship semifinals or better 10 times in the last 12 years, including an appearance in the CAA Championship game for the third time in 2010-11.

But it all came together during the 2000-01 season for the Blue Hens. Martin led an experienced Delaware squad to the finest season in school history. UD put together a record of 26-5, setting school records for wins in a season and consecutive victories (17) and cruising to the America East regular season title with a 17-1 record. The Hens moved through the America East Tournament, defeating Boston University and Hartford in the first two rounds and rallying to down host Vermont in the championship game.

That victory gave Delaware its first ever America East title, first conference championship since 1991, and its first program NCAA Tournament appearance. The Blue Hens advanced to the NCAA East Regionals at North Carolina State and hung tough with the 19th ranked Wolfpack before falling 76-57. The Hens also received their first ever votes in the USA Today Top 25 poll during the season.

During the 2006-07 season, Delaware tied the school record with 26 wins and tied the school record for conference wins with 16. The Blue Hens also received votes in the Associated Press Top 25 media poll for the first time in school history. The Hens fell in the CAA semifinals to James Madison but garnered the school's first ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament.

Mincy and Barrett were also named to the All-Tournament team...Delle Donne, who entered the game as the nation's leading scorer at 28.5 ppg, netted 24 points in the second half while Trumae Lucas added 14 points, Jocelyn Bailey added 10 points off the bench, and Lauren Carra scored nine...Delle Donne was named to the All-Tournament team as she surpassed the 30-point mark for the fifth time this season and eclipsed the 20-point plateau for the 16th straight game...The Hens hit a respectable 24 of 56 shots from the field (42.9 percent) and connected on 5 of 15 three-pointers but were also nearly perfect from the foul line, hitting 23 of 25, including a 10 for 10 performance from Delle Donne.
